

Information Technology: Monday February 3, 2020

Do you have an innovative technology research project in mind? Do you need funding? A portion of the Student Technology Fee has been reserved to fund your innovative research projects.

To support the initiatives of the University, the Provost, CIO and Student Technology Fee Advisory Committee (STFAC) updated the grant guidelines to support research and capitalize on the impact of the grant. STF grants should support technology-based research opportunities that show student impact. Each grant must also include a plan to disseminate the research results so others can benefit from this innovative work.

The grant is not designed to provide ongoing funding and must be used within the fiscal year budget guidelines. The grant is not designed to fund cameras, iPads or computers. STF provides a bulk quantity of cameras, iPads and computer for checkout through Russell Library.

All grant proposals must have the approval and quote(s) from Information Technology (IT). IT will assist you with pricing and help to ensure your project can be implemented. Please send your request to cindy.bowen@gcsu.edu with STF Grant noted. Once you have a well-researched plan with a budget, please access the grant form (Word). This document will be submitted via email to stf@gcsu.edu. After you complete your submission, a confirmation email will be sent. Please don't hesitate to contact us with your concerns and suggestions.

The deadline for application submission is **March 6**, so start planning! The STFAC will provide written notification of fund disbursement by **April 13**. If you have any questions, please contact the committee at stf@gcsu.edu.

Tuesday, Feb. 4 guest artist and violinist Dr. Benjamin Sung will perform the 24 Caprices for Solo Violin by Italian composer Niccolò Paganini at 7:30 p.m. in the Max Noah Recital Hall. Sung is an associate professor of violin at Florida State University and concertmaster of the Fargo-Moorhead Symphony Orchestra. He's also violin coordinator of the Brevard Music Center and principal second violin of the Brevard Music Center Orchestra. He has worked with many great composers of this generation including John Adams, Pierre Boulez, George Crumb and Helmut Lachenmann. For this concert, Sung will perform Paganini's 24 Caprices, which are considered to be the most demanding virtuosic works in violin literature. Paganini is a composer from the early romantic period, who pushed the boundaries and capabilities of the violin into modern

President Dorman challenged the entire Georgia College campus to create preeminent programs, centers and students to show the Nation that GCSU is a leader in the Small Liberal Arts community of Universities and Colleges. On May 23, 2019, our MIS program in Milledgeville showed preeminence not only in the Nation, but in the world! 13 Teams from all over the globe, Australia, Indonesia, Hong



Kong, China, Russia, Greece, Spain, Peru, and four teams in the USA competed in the Final round that crowned the world champion of EPRsim. Placing 7th in the World our first year of competition is preeminent.

ERPsim is a business simulation game for SAP ERP and SAP S/4HANA in which participants use a real ERP system to manage their virtual company in a competitive market. Win or lose, participants will improve their knowledge of business processes and their understanding of how ERP systems are effective at managing those processes. Learners get to use a real SAP S/4HANA system to evaluate, input and see the result of their decisions. This approach allows learners to focus on analytics and decision-making and gives them an incentive to get better at translating their strategy into action using an ERP system. Developed and in use since 2004 at HEC Montréal, ERPsim is a proven solution to teach enterprise management, business processes, ERP and analytics concepts. The simulations are designed to allow you to get the most out of your classroom time, whether it being held in-person or in a remote setting.

On May 23 students who enjoy playing ERPsim and wanting to test their skills against the rest of the world competed in the 11th World Championships. Hosted by the ERPsim Lab at HEC Montreal, the folks who created the ERPsim software, Georgia College competed for their first time. The competition was open to all students of universities that are members of the SAP University Alliance, but only one team per university could register. The Seniors in the MIS Bachelors Degree program played versions of ERPsim all semester long and the best players we're chosen to compete in this International World Championship, provided they would be available 2 weeks after graduation!

The Team from Melbourne University in Australia came in first! Team Members: Xueru Zhao, Zheng Sun, Peng Wang, Haojun Xiao, and Wenjing Wang competed as an all Female team and easily took home first prize, coached by Faculty members Matt Dyki and Maggie

Singorahardjo.

Central Michigan, a long time member of the SAP University Alliance and participant in many ERPsim competitions came in 2nd, and first in North America. Sichuan Technology and Business University in China completed the podium finishing 3rd. 4th place Universitas Islam Indonesia, 5th place Zhengzhou University China, 6th place Plekhanov Russian University of Economics and 7th place Georgia College United States rounded out the top 1/2 of the competition. In only their first time reaching the finals, a 7th place in the World finish (2nd in North America) was very good for the team of Benjamin Larson, Nathon Patton, Andrew Brown, Matthew Baker and Jack Kouloukas. They made Georgia College, Faculty Advisor/Coach Doc Kevin Lee Elder and President Dorman proud!

Each team demonstrated their ability to manage their virtual company with the ERPsim Manufacturing Extended scenario, running on a live SAP S/4HANA system. Business Intelligence and Analytics are an important part of the competition, as participants have live access to the data available from SAP HANA and visualized with SAP Lumira or Tableau. The Georgia College team generated a net income of \$1,860,530 on \$3,938,196 worth of sales and raised their company valuation to over \$95 million, falling 5 million short of sixth place team from Russia. That is how good these students can get at the International level of ERPsim competitions. Read on to learn more about ERPsim as we play practice rounds this Spring to determine our team (who knows we might also compete with an all Female team) for the 12th International ERPsim competition later this Spring.

ERPsim is a business simulation game for SAP ERP and SAP S/4HANA in which participants use a real ERP system to manage their virtual company in a competitive market. Win or lose, participants will improve their knowledge of business processes and their understanding of how ERP systems are effective at managing those processes. Learners get to use a real SAP S/4HANA system to evaluate, input and see the result of their decisions. The approach makes use of actual transactions provided by SAP as well as custom transactions, which provides a mix that is very close to what an ERP user would experience in the workplace.

Feminist Biofiction: A conversation with Joanna Scott

Feminist Biofiction:

A Conversation with Joanna Scott

Recipient of a MacArthur Fellowship, often referred to as the "genius grant," and a Guggenheim Fellowship, Joanna Scott has authored many stellar works, including "The Manikin", a novel shortlisted for the Pulitzer Prize in Fiction, and "Various Antidotes", a collection of short stories nominated for the PEN/Faulkner Award. Scott is also considered one of the leading authors and critics of biofiction, literature that names the protagonist after an actual historical figure. Biofiction became a dominant literary form in the United States in the 1990s, and Scott led the way with the publication of her 1990 novel *Arrogance*, which brilliantly pictures the complicated and tortured life of the Austrian artist Egon Schiele.

Most recently, Scott published in 2017 "Careers for Women", a biographical novel about Lee K. Jaffe, the woman who served from 1944 through 1965 as director of public relations at New York City's Port Authority and had the idea for building the World Trade Towers. Georgia College students Kimberly Norwood and Ariel Ebaugh will interview Scott on February 20th at the Pat Peterson Museum Education Room at 7:00 PM. The conversation will focus on Scott's biographical novel "Careers for Women," biofiction, and feminism. The conversation will last for about 45 minutes, and will be followed by a 30-minute question and answer session.



Mother behind 'Gracie's Law' to speak at Georgia College

University Communications: Monday February 3, 2020

Georgia College alumna Erin Nobles—the mother working to pass "Gracie's Law" into state legislation, granting children with disabilities access to organ transplants—will speak to university nursing students at 9 a.m. Monday, Feb. 3, in the Health Sciences Building.

If she can get someone to help babysit, Noble will bring 11-month-old Gracie along. Gracie was born in March 2019 with Down syndrome and spent 17 days in neonatal intensive care. A month later, she showed signs of congestive heart failure and developed serious kidney problems.



At 3-months-old, Gracie underwent surgery to repair a hole in her heart. It was successful. But, if she had required a heart transplant, Gracie could've been denied due to her disabilities. Georgia doesn't have discrimination prevention laws to protect the disabled and ensure equal access to organ transplants. Even states with discrimination laws often leave people and children with disabilities off organ transplant lists.

"We are excited that Erin Nobles will be speaking to our senior nursing students," said Carol Sapp, associate professor of nursing. "As both a nurse and mother, Erin will be able to share with expertise how important it is to be an advocate for individuals with disabilities."

Nobles received her undergraduate nursing degree in 2006 and her <u>Master of Science in Nursing</u> (MSN) with a focus in Family Nurse Practitioner in 2013 from Georgia College. She works part-time at Jefferson Hospital in Louisville, Georgia.

Nobles was in Atlanta this week with her husband David, who's also a Georgia College alumnus with a bachelor's degree in <u>criminal justice</u>. The Warthen, Georgia, couple attended the state general assembly Wednesday, Feb. 29, as State Reps. Rick Williams (R-Milledgeville) and Mack Jackson (D-Sandersville) formally introduced "Gracie's Law" to the Georgia House of Representatives. They hope the bill will pass during the 2020 legislative season.

The Nobles also told their story to a crowd of about 100 people Wednesday, as part of Georgia Council on Developmental Disabilities Advocacy Day in Atlanta.

"Yesterday was life changing. It was amazing," Nobles said.

Two Georgia College doctoral nursing students, Angie Childre and Kimberly Griffin, were also in Atlanta Wednesday to support Nobles' cause. The three women have worked together as nurses in the past. Griffin and Childre helped educate legislative officials on the

basic rights of all individuals to have access to care.

"I have a passion for access to healthcare for all populations, especially vulnerable populations," Griffin said. "Individuals with special needs can give organs in the state of Georgia but not receive them in some cases. This is fundamentally wrong."

On Monday, Nobles addressed 54 nursing students in the senior Leadership and Management class. She'll also present a WebEx to 12 DNP (<u>Doctorate of Nurse Practitioner</u>) students in the Healthcare Policy, Ethics and Politics class.

"Students will hear Ms. Nobles' first-hand account of how she used her professional nursing expertise, power and her love for her daughter to advocate, collaborate and influence legislators to enact policy change," Sapp said.

"Hearing this first-person account of how a professional nurse has strategized and exercised leadership to maximize patient-centered care—not only for her daughter but for others with disabilities—can make a powerful impact on students as they transition to their new role of professional nurse, where they can make a difference in the lives of others locally, nationally and globally," she said.

Georgia College alumna named state Superintendent of the Year

Samantha Fuhrey of the Newton County School System in Covington
—an alumna of Georgia College—has been named state

<u>Superintendent of the Year</u>. She is also one of four finalists for the

<u>2020 National Superintendent of the Year</u>.

Fuhrey received her Ed.S. in <u>Educational Leadership</u> at Georgia College in 2006.

"We are proud to be her colleagues. She is a model of exemplary leadership for aspiring administrators," Drs. J.W. Good and Cheryl Reynolds, professors of Educational Leadership, said in a costatement.



Fuhrey was Newton County's first female superintendent, a job she has held nearly seven years. Fuhrey was nominated three years in a row for Georgia Superintendent of the Year, prior to receiving the title in December from the Georgia School Superintendents Association (GSSA). Fuhrey was also named a finalist in the national competition, run by the American Association of School Administrators (AASA). The winner will be announced Feb. 13 at the AASA conference in San Diego, California.

The national selection is based on leadership, excellence in public education, raising academic standards, communication and community development. The national finalists are "champions of children" shaping the education and future of about 5 million students who go to school every day in the U.S., according to AASA. In its 33rd year, the National Superintendent of the Year program is open to all school superintendents.

"It is a tremendous honor and privilege to have been named Georgia's Superintendent of the Year," Fuhrey said, "and amongst the highest honors to be identified as one of four finalists for National Superintendent of the Year."

"This recognition represents the hard work and dedication of the Newton County School System team and community and," she said, "most importantly, the phenomenal, resilient, creative students who face incredible challenges, yet never cease to amaze me."

Fuhrey served many years as an English teacher, primarily in middle schools in DeKalb County. She served as a middle school assistant principal in DeKalb and Newton counties, before becoming principal of Indian Creek Middle School in Newton County. She's also been director of Professional Learning, director of Secondary Education, executive director of Secondary Education and deputy superintendent of Teaching and Learning in that district.

At Georgia College, Fuhrey said she was fortunate to have Good and Reynolds as instructors.

"They challenged me to think differently about leadership and exposed me to a myriad of educational and business-thought leaders, whose works have influenced my leadership style and practices," Fuhrey said.

"Dr. Good and Dr. Reynolds provided a thought-provoking, safe environment that encouraged experimentation, allowed for dialogue and expected excellence," she said, "Of all of the professors I've been exposed to throughout my education path—there are few as memorable and influential as Dr. Good and Dr. Reynolds."



Severe Weather Preparedness Week: Tornado Safety

Public Safety: Wednesday February 5, 2020

In the spirit of Severe Weather Preparedness Week, Georgia College will conduct a test of the Outdoor Emergency Notification System on Wednesday, Feb. 5, 2020 at 12 p.m. During the test, the GC community is encouraged to be familiar with building severe weather shelter locations or, at a minimum, you should pause to reflect upon where you would shelter in the event of an actual tornado warning. Please remember that the outdoor sirens are only intended to be heard by individuals who are located outside when the sirens are activated.

No action is required during the testing, and all campus operations should continue as normal. A message stating that this is a test will prelude and follow the "alert" tone. In the case of an actual tornado warning, the message would advise of a tornado warning, and the tone would cycle through. This would be repeated every five minutes until the warning expires or is canceled, at which time an all clear message would sound. The audible system test will only be tested when clear sky conditions are present. Tests will not occur when skies are dark or severe weather is predicted for the area on the day the test is scheduled to occur. In this case, the test will be canceled for the month.

There are three sirens operated by GC in Baldwin County: one on West Campus and two on Main Campus.

This testing program is designed to maintain a reliable warning system and to meet recommended testing guidelines. Additionally, we want to maximize the effectiveness of the Outdoor Emergency Notification System. By performing these tests, we hope to enhance awareness and education regarding emergency preparedness at Georgia College and within the local community.





Heathers: The Musical

Theatre & Dance, Department of: Wednesday February 12, 2020

In collaboration with the Department of Music, Georgia College Theatre presents the awkward, callous, survivalist nature of high school in its rousing rock musical, "Heathers," opening Wednesday, Feb. 19, in Russell Auditorium. Come for the songs, the dance and the comedy. But also expect to be challenged by the unflinching perils of high school life.

"The play is fun and entertaining," said Dr. Karen Berman, artistic director and chair of theater and dance. "You end up loving people you hate and hating people you love. It's all completely mixed-up. It's a weird thing to experience. It makes you question your values and morality every second, because how can a really nice girl do that?"



"Heathers" was the prelude to the TV series "Mean Girls." It asks audiences to explore issues they normally shrink from like guns in schools, bullying and date rape. Even the stage is set as if actors are on a precipice. Created by Scenic Designer Issac Ramsey, the set's an enormous void of stairs. It keeps everyone off-guard, unbalanced.

Expect to hear great songs, like "Seventeen," "Lifeboat" and "The Me Inside of Me"—while watching three mean girls, all named Heather, drip malice. They invite outcast Veronica to join their exclusive, popular group, and she adopts their meanness to fit in. There are the bystanders, who watch silently; bullies, who humiliate and dehumanize; and lone wolves, who plot chaos. Due to these themes—as well as language, power-based violence, eating disorders, teen suicide and revenge—the play is for adults only.

But there's also a gentler side and redemption, said Amy Pinney, director and professor of theatre. People will see themselves on stage and identify with characters, depending on who they were in high school,

"There's a sweetness that has happened with this cast that I don't think exists naturally in the script," Pinney said. "This cast has lent an authenticity to these characters."

It'd be easier to deal with straight stereotypes, Berman said. But the realistic portrayal makes it believable: Any one of us could resort to bad behavior, under the right circumstances.

"High school's always been a tumultuous time," said senior theatre major and stage manager, Julia Whitten. "Heathers,' the movie, came out in the 1980s and made itself appeasing to a generation dealing with Reagan and asking 'Who can I trust?' 'Heathers' blew the lid off what it means to tell a realistic story about high school."

Seventeen student actors are in the play. About 30 other students work behind the scenes with set construction, lighting, makeup and costumes. Ray Jackson, a professional musician from Perry, is the music director. Students from the Georgia College Department of Music perform on stage. Choreography is by Natalie King, lecturer of dance.

This performance depicts situations and themes that are intended for mature audiences only. Shows are 7:30 p.m. Wednesday through Saturday, Feb. 19-22, and 2 p.m. Sunday, Feb. 23. Tickets can be purchased online at gcsutickets.com. Cost is \$16 for general; \$12 for non-GC students, faculty/staff and senior citizens; and \$7 for GC students.



The Center for Teaching and Learning offers a confidential, formative, midterm student feedback service available to all Georgia College instructors.

The following are descriptions of both processes:

SGID/GIFT: At the invitation of an instructor, a faculty facilitator trained in the classroom assessment technique guides students through a 30-minute, group consensus-building process in which they address the following four questions:

What do you like about any aspect of this course that helps you learn the material?

What suggestions do you have for improving any aspect of this course that would help you learn more?

How could those suggestions be implemented?

What can students do to improve this course?

The facilitator collates and types up the data; then meets with the instructor a week or so later to go over the student feedback. The facilitator will not report data on the student feedback to anybody other than the instructor.

Classroom Observation: When the instructor is looking for someone to observe their class, they will meet with the faculty facilitator beforehand and identify items for the facilitator to look for and record. On the day of observation, the facilitator will arrive at the class and observe the classroom during that day's lesson. Afterward, the facilitator will type up his or her notes and go over them with the instructor.

About the Bridge Scholars Program:

The Bridge Scholars Program (BSP) is a yearlong Residential Learning Community which gives first-year students a head start on college through a special program designed to help them make a successful transition from high school to campus. During the summer program, BSP students are placed into a cohort and take a one-credit hour success course and six hours of core courses. Students who pass all courses with a grade of C or better are eligible to return to GC. Returning students then continue to participate in special extracurricular activities and peer mentoring during their first-year. Past BSP students have gone on to be academically successful campus leaders, this is due in part to the strong start they have had for their college experience. One of the highlights and benefits of the program is the close interaction that BSP students enjoy with their faculty and BSP staff. Summer Teaching Opportunity:

Instructors are needed to teach several sections of GC 1010: Student Success Seminar. This summer the course will meet from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on June 15th, 16th, June 22nd, and 29th. The course does not replace the fall FYAS; rather it is a "study skills boot camp" of sorts, designed to help Bridge Scholars strengthen their academic success skills. Rather than functioning as an orientation to campus or a career exploration course, the GC 1010 seminar covers topics such as test anxiety, time management, note-taking, reading comprehension and learning styles. The course utilizes the On Course Study Skills Plus Edition, 3rd Edition textbook by Skip Downing (ISBN-10: 1305397487 | ISBN-13: 9781305397484). Our goal is to front-load students with intensive academic skill-building before they proceed to take their summer core courses.

Compensation:

Instructors hired to teach the course will have one of two options. 1) You may elect to take three days of annual leave and receive a \$625 stipend for teaching (on the June 30 payroll). 2) Obtain supervisory approval to teach the course as part of your regular work duties on those four days and forgo the stipend.

Instructors should understand that due to the nature of this program, there is an expectation of involvement outside the classroom to support and facilitate student development via relationship building and mentoring during the transition to university life. Today—Friday, February 14, 2020—is the deadline for offer letter submission to Human Resources for any staff or student bi-weekly new hire or rehire starting March 8, 2020. Offer letter submission is the first step on the updated start date matrices for all new and rehires. All student and staff offer letters must be sent to HR for review and approval before extending them to the new hire or rehire. This helps ensure that we remain compliant with our many institutional, USG, state, and federal regulations.

The next bi-weekly start date for eligible new hires and rehires will be March 22, 2019.

There is a deadline within the matrix for document submission to HR. Please encourage your new hires and rehires to deliver their offer letter acceptance and ALL enclosures along with original I-9 identification documents to HR by this deadline (February 19, 2020) to ensure that there will be no immediate delay in start date of March 22, 2020. All documents should be submitted together; a complete new hire/rehire packet makes for a smoother onboarding experience.

Offer Letter Templates:

The offer letter templates for students and staff were updated July 3, 2019 and are available on the intranet for review; this includes the Faculty & Staff Forms section of the Intranet and the HR Intranet, specifically the Employment Services section. Please discard any old saved templates and use the current documents online. The HR Intranet can be accessed by following the steps below:

- 1) Login to Unify
- 2) Click on Service Apps, then scroll down and click on Human Resources.
- 3) Toward the middle of the screen on the right side, there's a gray menu box--click on Employment Services.
- 4) Click the blue box that says Employment Services Intranet Site.
- 5) From the menu on the left side, click on Onboarding Employees.
- 6) Select your Employment Type (Regular Staff, Temp Staff, Students, Graduate Assistants, etc.)

Start Date Matrices & Clearances for Start Dates:

I'd like to extend a reminder of the Start Date Matrices we have in place for our monthly and bi-weekly paid staff and students. These matrices are in place in order to allow for adequate processing of new hire/rehire paperwork, and to ensure that your new/returning employees have all access they need on the day they are scheduled to report to work. We need all pertinent paperwork (offer letters, PAFs, etc.) prior to the effective date. Please keep these dates in mind as you consider adding/changing information such as, but not limited to:

- New hires
- Rehires
- Changing position titles
- Adding concurrent position
- Changing managers/timecard reports to
- Funding source changes

This window of time allows for processing of pre-employment background checks, credit checks, and drug screens (when required), review and processing of PAFs in all pertinent departments, compliance checks regarding eligibility for employment based on federal regulations, and data entry into multiple systems to ensure all necessary access is granted.

Please be mindful of your records and adhere to the start and end dates for all employees. This ensures that we remain compliant with institutional, USG, state, & federal regulations and that we minimize any risk to the institution. If you wish to extend an employee's original term date, please contact us *prior to*that date and in accordance with the respective start date matrix per the employee type.

All employees MUST meet all required clearances before they are eligible to begin work. There are no exceptions. HR will issue a formal clearance email to the manager once the employee is clear to begin work. If HR issues a clearance date, employees cannot "volunteer" before said clearance date unless they have met the appropriate clearances required of a volunteer.

I have attached the March-August 2020 matrices for monthly paid staff, bi-weekly paid staff, and students (all paid bi-weekly) for quick review of the upcoming months. We communicated changes to this process in October 2018; be mindful of the revised timelines and deadlines in place. Please see the respective tabs/sheets at the bottom of the spreadsheet for each category of employee/pay schedule. Something to Die For: Mencius on What People Really Want - A Special Talk with Franklin Perkins

Philosophy Religion & Liberal Studies, Department of : Monday February 17, 2020

The ancient Confucian philosopher Mencius (Mengzi \mathbb{A}) claimed that everyone has things they would refuse to do, even if refusing would lead to death. That is, everyone has something they would die for. If true, this is a profound observation because it means that ultimately, our deepest concerns are not for our own self-interest. In addition to discussing this claim, the talk will also examine the seemingly paradoxical fact that while many of us would risk our lives to help a person in danger, we often resist minor sacrifices that might greatly benefit others.

Franklin Perkins is a Professor of Philosophy at the University of Hawai'i, Manoa. He received his Ph.D. from Pennsylvania State University and has been a professor at Nanyang Technological University (Singapore) and at DePaul University (Chicago), where he was also director of the Chinese Studies Program. His main teaching and research interests are classical Chinese philosophy, early modern European philosophy, and the challenges of doing philosophy in a comparative or intercultural context. In the past few years, he has been focused particularly on the philosophical significance of recently excavated Chinese texts that were buried around 300 BCE. He is the author of Heaven and Earth are not Humane: The Problem of Evil in Classical Chinese Philosophy (Indiana, 2014), Leibniz: A Guide for the Perplexed (Bloomsbury, 2007), and Leibniz and China: A Commerce of Light (Cambridge, 2004), and he was co-editor (with Chenyang Li) of Chinese Metaphysics and Its Problems (Cambridge, 2015). His books have been translated into Portuguese, Chinese, and Japanese. He is editor of the journal Philosophy East and West.

Georgia College graduate students are encouraged to apply for Graduate Research Travel Grants to support the costs (conference fee, travel, and accommodations) associated with the presentation of their own original scholarship at professional academic conferences.

Graduate Research Travel Grants will be made in the following category:

Category 1: Grants will be awarded that support student presentations of original scholarship or research conducted with a faculty mentor at professional academic conferences (international, national, regional and state-level) in the student's discipline. Grants will also cover costs of research in the student's discipline. There is a maximum of \$400 per grant for conference fees, travel and accommodations. Incomplete applications will not be considered. Only students who have not received funding in the past are eligible to apply. The deadline to apply is February 21, 2020.

Students seeking funds to support attendance at academic conferences in the field of study should apply through the SGA student travel fund.



Georgia College's Office of Sustainability and Rural Studies Institute are part of a team that received a \$1,250 grant from the Community Foundation of Central Georgia. The grant came about from the On the Table Milledgeville discussions held last fall.

The two offices partnered with the Milledgeville Chamber of Commerce and members of Georgia Military College for the "Sustainable Strategic Planning for Economic Development" project. The goal is to create a sustainable economic development plan for the City of Milledgeville and Baldwin County. The plan addresses the challenges associated with 21st century economic and community development, including "brain drain," which is the low retention rates of young adults in our area. The team will focus their efforts on strategic planning in conjunction with the Baldwin County School District, economic development personnel, employers and students from both the local K-12 schools and higher education institutions.

Three Georgia College students recognized by Kennedy Center for undergrad research

Georgia College's Theatre Department was nominated in four categories during the recent Region IV (nine-state region) of the Kennedy Center American College Theatre Festival in South Carolina. Of the four categories, Georgia College made it to the finals in three categories with two students taking first place.

Senior Laura Swarner of Buford, Georgia, and junior Sachen Pillay of Milledgeville both took first place in their categories. A third student, junior theatre major Tiffany Hawkins of Wadley, Georgia, made it to the finals for her role as "Black Marie" in the fall 2019 production of "Barbecue." Hawkins was one of 16 actors in the region nominated for the Kennedy Center's Irene Ryan Acting Award.

"We are so proud of our students," said Dr. Karen Berman, artistic director and chair of theatre and dance.

Swarner, who's double majoring in theatre and English, is also a semi-finalist for this year's Fulbright Scholarship. She took first place in scenic design for the set of "Ballet Russes," performed on campus last fall. Mentored by Scenic Designer Issac Ramsey, Swarner's dramaturgical research was on the early-20th-century Russian ballet company. The set was a conglomerate of muslin flats and mirror imagery. Her research delved into the context of the era, architectural styles and biographies of the play's major characters.

This was Swarner's first mainstage set design and her senior capstone. She put a lot of pressure on herself to get things right. Her oral presentation to judges included a portfolio on Russian history, scenic design renderings, scale drawings, a set model and production photos.

"I feel very honored and excited and, honestly, just super grateful for the opportunity and support that I had throughout the process," Swarner said. "Georgia College prepared me by teaching me what I need to know in order to develop my ideas and present them professionally."

"One of my favorite parts of the research," she said, "was looking at the construction and history of old theatres, where the (ballet) company performed and the magnificence of their architecture. As part of my research, I was also able to read a portion of Nijinsky's diary and learn about schizophrenia and the treatment of mental illness during the early 1900s."

In April, Swarner will get a free trip to the Kennedy Center in Washington D.C. to compete against seven other regions. She'll be one of only eight undergraduates in the nation to compete for the Center's top award in scenic design. She'll also receive master classes at

the Kennedy Center from acclaimed professional scenic designers in the U.S.

Pillay is double majoring in history and liberal studies. He won first place for his dramaturgical research on "Ballet Russes," as well. Berman considers the combination of history and theatre to be "a hybrid of traditional undergraduate research and creative endeavors." The speech given to introduce Sachen at the award ceremony was "quite spectacular," she said, "as the judges seemed particularly impressed with his work. I am so proud as his mentor."

A new research skill Pillay learned that surprised him was "blending the abstract emotional work" of creating a theatrical stage with "the empirical research of a historian." Two seemingly opposite practices helped him "find a deeper understanding of my work." It was Pillay's job to explain the play's context to actors. He found it challenging to condense large amounts of political and cultural history into short explanations that didn't waste valuable rehearsing time.

Diverse, interdisciplinary coursework at Georgia College helped prepare Pillay for this research. He developed key skills in history and learned how "to combine my skills in historiography with other disciplines, such as theatre and geography."

"I feel incredibly honored by this experience," Pillay said. "I never expected that my research would make such a positive impact on myself or other people."

"I did not expect I would be presenting research, when I first came to Georgia College," he said. "The experience has helped me grow as a historian and an artist. The theatre world has always been a passion of mine, and my work as a dramaturge helped me find a deeper understand of crafting a stage play and how to educate people's perspectives through historical research."

Georgia College sends six students to 2nd Annual 'Posters at the Capitol'

GC Journeys: Monday February 24, 2020

The Georgia House of Representatives and Senate are getting ready to welcome 54 students from 15 colleges and universities for the 2nd Annual "Posters at the Capitol"—an event started by Georgia College last year to spotlight undergraduate research.

Students will present projects to state legislators and the public from 2 to 4 p.m. Tuesday, Feb. 25, in the south wing of the Georgia State Capitol building. The program is modeled on the popular "Posters on the Hill" event held each year by the Council on Undergraduate Research (CUR) in Washington D.C. This year, the state event was adopted by the Georgia Undergraduate Research Collective (GURC) and includes a wide range of projects from accounting, biomedical technology and environmental engineering to health communications, political science and education.

It's selective. Due to limited space, only 42 of 78 projects were accepted from private and public institutions throughout Georgia.

"We came up with the idea," said Dr. Doreen Sams, professor of marketing and coordinator of Georgia College MURACE (Mentored Undergraduate Research and Creative Endeavors). Sams and Robin Lewis, director of the Office of Grants and Sponsored Projects, noticed other states had legislative days for undergraduate research, but Georgia didn't.

"The applications go through a blind-review process with faculty reviewers from all over the state," Sams said. "It's not an easy hurdle, and that's what makes these research presentations truly preeminent. Just making it through the review process is something to celebrate."

Georgia College is sending six students with five research projects involving <u>physics</u>, <u>psychology</u>, <u>music therapy</u> and <u>chemistry</u>.

The other institutions are: Augusta University, Berry College, Clark Atlanta University, Fort Valley State University, Georgia Gwinnett College, Georgia Southern University, Georgia State University, Kennesaw State University, LaGrange College, Mercer University, Middle Georgia State University, University of North Georgia, University of West Georgia and Valdosta State University.

Using saliva, senior chemistry major Megan Andrews of Covington is studying prostate cancer in men of African descent, who are disproportionately affected by the disease. She's working with three Georgia College Chemistry and Public Health professors, along with the state Department of Public Health, to determine how socioeconomic status affects onset of this particular cancer.

"The most impactful experience I've had at Georgia College has been undergraduate research," Andrews said. "This presentation will help me practice public speaking skills, which are vital to have in graduate school. It will also allow me to network, as there are a variety of different people that work at the state Capitol."

Senior psychology major Amelia DuBose of Thomasville is working with a partner to study aggression levels in children, as perceived by parents and teachers, and how this connects to socioeconomic status.

"I think the 'Posters at the Capitol' event is such an important and incredible opportunity for students to come together and present their research to important Georgia leaders," she said.

Reminder: Something to Die For: Mencius on What People Really Want - A Special Talk with Franklin Perkins

Philosophy Religion & Liberal Studies, Department of : Monday February 24, 2020

The ancient Confucian philosopher Mencius (Mengzi \mathbb{A}) claimed that everyone has things they would refuse to do, even if refusing would lead to death. That is, everyone has something they would die for. If true, this is a profound observation because it means that ultimately, our deepest concerns are not for our own self-interest. In addition to discussing this claim, the talk will also examine the seemingly paradoxical fact that while many of us would risk our lives to help a person in danger, we often resist minor sacrifices that might greatly benefit others.

Franklin Perkins is a Professor of Philosophy at the University of Hawai'i, Manoa. He received his Ph.D. from Pennsylvania State University and has been a professor at Nanyang Technological University (Singapore) and at DePaul University (Chicago), where he was also director of the Chinese Studies Program. His main teaching and research interests are classical Chinese philosophy, early modern European philosophy, and the challenges of doing philosophy in a comparative or intercultural context. In the past few years, he has been focused particularly on the philosophical significance of recently excavated Chinese texts that were buried around 300 BCE. He is the author of Heaven and Earth are not Humane: The Problem of Evil in Classical Chinese Philosophy (Indiana, 2014), Leibniz: A Guide for the Perplexed (Bloomsbury, 2007), and Leibniz and China: A Commerce of Light (Cambridge, 2004), and he was co-editor (with Chenyang Li) of Chinese Metaphysics and Its Problems (Cambridge, 2015). His books have been translated into Portuguese, Chinese, and Japanese. He is editor of the journal Philosophy East and West.



Georgia College sends six students to 2nd Annual 'Posters at the Capitol'

University Communications: Tuesday February 25, 2020

The Georgia House of Representatives and Senate are getting ready to welcome 54 students from 15 colleges and universities for the 2nd Annual "Posters at the Capitol"—an event started by Georgia College last year to spotlight undergraduate research.



Students will present projects to state legislators and the public from 2 to 4 p.m. Tuesday, Feb. 25, in the south wing of the Georgia State Capitol building. The program is modeled on the popular "Posters on the Hill" event held each year by the Council on Undergraduate Research (CUR) in Washington D.C. This year, the state event was adopted by the Georgia Undergraduate Research Collective (GURC) and includes a wide range of projects from accounting, biomedical technology and environmental engineering to health communications, political science and education.

It's selective. Due to limited space, only 42 of 78 projects were accepted from private and public institutions throughout Georgia.

"We came up with the idea," said Dr. Doreen Sams, professor of marketing and coordinator of Georgia College MURACE (Mentored Undergraduate Research and Creative Endeavors). Sams and Robin Lewis, director of the Office of Grants and Sponsored Projects, noticed other states had legislative days for undergraduate research, but Georgia didn't.

"The applications go through a blind-review process with faculty reviewers from all over the state," Sams said. "It's not an easy hurdle, and that's what makes these research presentations truly preeminent. Just making it through the review process is something to celebrate."

Georgia College is sending six students with five research projects involving <u>physics</u>, <u>psychology</u>, <u>music therapy</u> and <u>chemistry</u>.

The other institutions are: Augusta University, Berry College, Clark Atlanta University, Fort Valley State University, Georgia Gwinnett College, Georgia Southern University, Georgia State University, Kennesaw State University, LaGrange College, Mercer University, Middle Georgia State University, University of North Georgia, University of West Georgia and Valdosta State University.

Using saliva, senior chemistry major Megan Andrews of Covington is studying prostate cancer in men of African descent, who are disproportionately affected by the disease. She's working with three Georgia College Chemistry and Public Health professors, along with the state Department of Public Health, to determine how socioeconomic status affects onset of

this particular cancer.

"The most impactful experience I've had at Georgia College has been undergraduate research," Andrews said. "This presentation will help me practice public speaking skills, which are vital to have in graduate school. It will also allow me to network, as there are a variety of different people that work at the state Capitol."

Senior psychology major Amelia DuBose of Thomasville is working with a partner to study aggression levels in children, as perceived by parents and teachers, and how this connects to socioeconomic status.

"I think the 'Posters at the Capitol' event is such an important and incredible opportunity for students to come together and present their research to important Georgia leaders," she said.

Chemistry and Art combine for library display

A scientific-looking exhibit at Special Collections in Ina Dillard Russell Library—with its molecule-shaped photographs, flasks, beakers and test tubes—are easy companions to containers of inks and screen-printing materials. The large-window display is called, "Chemistry in Art: How STEAM-Based Projects Can Be Integrated



Into Any Area at GC" and shows off student work resulting from the collaboration of two professors.

Assistant Professors Dr. Peter Rosado Flores in chemistry and Matt Forrest in art began working together in 2016 to create an overlap of science and art. Chemistry students used organic-compound reactions to produce a Creamsicle-orange pigment. Art students added oils and acrylics to thicken the dye for screen printing. This provided students with real-world applications of chemistry, while giving artists the means to produce orange-tinted photographs of Herty Hall and other art topics from Star Wars to pop culture.

"A traditional lab would involve dropping the dye in a waste bucket for disposal after synthesis, writing a lab report and being graded on it," Rosado said. "The way we've concocted this means students don't stop in the lab but find applications outside of the lab."

"We should engrain in our students the need to be circular, meaning well-rounded, not straight lines," he said. "They don't need to only focus on one field of study. Students should be encouraged to find applications outside their field of study, as well."

Forrest's expertise is in printmaking. He also teaches digital design courses. Rosado has a background in inorganic synthesis and experience in the cosmetics industry, which utilizes color theory.

Over the years, the professors moved their students to other applications for chemistry and art. Using the same concept, they started offering demonstrations. Students mix dye and synthesize with different binders, showing fellow students the importance of elements that hold paint together.

They moved out of the classroom, as well. Recently, students worked at Andalusia with restoration grants to produce prints based on pictures of Flannery O'Connor's farm. Advanced printmaking students learned to mix multiple colors, based off photographs and reproduce imagery on Lino-cut, also known as a wood cut. Students also experimented with the chemistry behind watercolor and acrylics. They prepared their own dye and learned how pantone colors play a role in the development of art and how reproduction of color can be achieved in chemistry labs.

"Working with Peter on these projects, going to conferences and working together on grants

has changed my own teaching and the projects I introduce," Forrest said. "We can see students look at art in a different light from having these experiences, and chemistry expands that understanding."

"That collaboration is the foundation of a liberal arts experience," he said, "and this experience, like many at Georgia College, helps bridge that understanding."

In the future, Rosado envisions an industrial aspect being added to his collaboration with Forrest. He hopes students will design tailored colors for mock clients and, maybe, even real ones.

Senior art major Sophia Daniel jumped into this collaboration to conduct undergraduate research. She dyed different fabrics—organic, synthetic and blended fibers—to see which material dye adheres to best. Working with chemistry major Shira Duke, Daniel measured the color on each dyed fabric swatch with an RGB Color Analyzer, which shows the amount of red, blue and green on an item.

The student team experimented with different light sources (indoor light, white light and sunlight) and put fabrics through three wash cycles (hot, cold and dry clean). Then, they measured how much dye was lost in each cleaning process. They found dry cleaning is best for preserving colors.

"I love the overlap of departments because, even though students have friends from different majors, they don't always get to participate in what each are learning," Daniel said. "A lot of chemistry goes into art, especially art products and certain medium processes, such as print making or ceramics. Having the overlap be more direct caters to creativity and critical thinking that can be utilized by all students."

The chemistry/art display will be in the library through spring semester.

HR Deadline Today for March 22, 2020 Starts

Today—Friday, February 28, 2020—is the deadline for offer letter submission to Human Resources for any staff or student bi-weekly new hire or rehire starting on March 22, 2020. Offer letter submission is the first step on the updated start date matrices for all new and rehires. All student and staff offer letters must be sent to HR for review and approval before extending them to the new hire or rehire. This helps ensure that we remain compliant with our many institutional, USG, state and federal regulations.

The next bi-weekly start date for eligible new hires and rehires will be April 5, 2019.

There is a deadline within the matrix for document submission to HR. Please encourage your new hires and rehires to deliver their offer letter acceptance and all enclosures along with original I-9 identification documents to HR by this deadline (March 4, 2020) to ensure that there will be no immediate delay in start date of April 5, 2020. All documents should be submitted together; a complete new hire/rehire packet makes for a smoother onboarding experience.

Offer Letter Templates:

The offer letter templates for students and staff were updated July 3, 2019, and are available on the intranet for review; this includes the Faculty and Staff Forms section of the Intranet and the HR Intranet, specifically the Employment Services section. Please discard any old saved templates and use the current documents online. The HR Intranet can be accessed by following the steps below:

- 1) Login to Unify
- 2) Click on Service Apps, then scroll down and click on Human Resources.
- 3) Toward the middle of the screen on the right side, there's a gray menu box--click on Employment Services.
- 4) Click the blue box that says Employment Services Intranet Site.
- 5) From the menu on the left side, click on Onboarding Employees.
- 6) Select your Employment Type (Regular Staff, Temp. Staff, Students, Graduate Assistants, etc.)

Start Date Matrices and Clearances for Start Dates:

I'd like to extend a reminder of the Start Date Matrices we have in place for our monthly

and bi-weekly paid staff and students. These matrices are in place in order to allow for adequate processing of new hire/rehire paperwork, and to ensure that your new/returning employees have all access they need on the day they are scheduled to report to work. We need all pertinent paperwork (offer letters, PAFs, etc.) prior to the effective date. Please keep these dates in mind as you consider adding/changing information such as, but not limited to:

- New hires
- Rehires
- Changing position titles
- Adding concurrent position
- Changing managers/timecard reports to
- Funding source changes

This window of time allows for processing of pre-employment background checks, credit checks and drug screens (when required), review and processing of PAFs in all pertinent departments, compliance checks regarding eligibility for employment based on federal regulations and data entry into multiple systems to ensure all necessary access is granted.

Please be mindful of your records and adhere to the start and end dates for all employees. This ensures that we remain compliant with institutional, USG, state and federal regulations and that we minimize any risk to the institution. If you wish to extend an employee's original term date, please contact us prior to that date and in accordance with the respective start date matrix per the employee type.

All employees must meet all required clearances before they are eligible to begin work. There are no exceptions. HR will issue a formal clearance email to the manager once the employee is clear to begin work. If HR issues a clearance date, employees cannot "volunteer" before said clearance date unless they have met the appropriate clearances required of a volunteer.
