Thinking about adding an experience to a course to make it more transformative for students? Earn the "Transformative Experiences Faculty Certification"!

As we all prepare for a summer likely to be spent sheltering at home, we may find a hidden blessing – more time to develop new courses or tweak current ones. This is a course for those who are interested in adding a transformative experience/high impact practice to one of your courses or developing a course around an experience: – Leadership, Community-based Engaged Learning, Internships, Study Abroad, or Undergraduate Research. Now is an ideal time to work on that with plenty of support. You can also earn \$300 in faculty development funds for your own use for AY 20-21.

Georgia College launches Honors College, selects Dean to lead

Dr. W. Brian Newsome has been selected as the dean of the Honors College, which is set to launch Fall 2020.

Newsome comes to Georgia College from Elizabethtown College in Pennsylvania, where he is currently the Dean for Curriculum and Honors and a professor of history. During his eleven years with Elizabethtown College, Newsome has also served as Assistant Dean for General Education and Assessment and Dean for Curriculum and Assessment and College Registrar.



"I am delighted that Dr. Newsome will be joining Georgia College to provide our intellectually gifted student scholars with a stimulating academic experience", said Georgia College Provost Costas Spirou. "Our cross disciplinary approach combined with our high quality discipline-specific honors courses will provide the type of transformative experiences that makes Georgia College so unique. I want to thank the members of the Search Committee which began this process in the Fall 2019 semester."

On the heels of the 50th anniversary of the Honors Program at Georgia College, the university is set to launch the Honors College this fall. The College is designed for intellectually talented and motivated individuals, aiming to attract top student scholars by providing a stimulating atmosphere—both academically and personally. Newsome will spearhead the launch of the new Honors College.

"I am excited to lead the Honors College at Georgia College and to build on the success of the existing Honors Program," said Dr. Brian Newsome. "I am honored to serve as the inaugural dean and look forward to working with colleagues across campus to support the outstanding students who are members of the Honors community."

Newsome's experience in higher education revolves around streamlining and structuring Honors programming. During his time as Dean for Curriculum and Honors, he focused on finding a balance between cohort curricular opportunities and individual contract courses as well as increasing accessibility for students of diverse socio-economic backgrounds. Newsome has also served as co-principal investigator for a \$300,000 Mellon Foundation Humanities grant.

Newsome received his doctorate and master's degree from the University of South Carolina. He received his Bachelor of Arts in history from Augusta College.

Newsome will begin his role as Dean of the Honors College on July 1, 2020.

Message from President Dorman: Campus Update

President, Office of the : Thursday May 7, 2020

Georgia College Colleagues,

I would like to share a video message with each of you. The link can be viewed [here](#), and a written transcript of the video is below.

I want to take this opportunity at the close of this Spring semester to thank you all for remaining steadfast and supportive as we transitioned to an online learning environment. We have all had to adapt in different ways through online teaching and working remotely.

I am grateful for the way everyone transitioned to complete the semester despite the many unexpected challenges we faced due to the coronavirus. Congratulations to all faculty and staff for concluding this semester so successfully given all that we have experienced thus far. And, we have seen Georgia College faculty, staff and students who have stepped up to help others with their time, energy and their financial generosity. It truly warms my heart to see all of us care and support each other during these uncertain times.

As you know, our system office has asked us to develop reopening procedures for our campus as we anticipate an eventual resumption of in-person work and instruction. Although we do not have a precise timeframe, please know that the health and safety of our entire campus community will always be paramount. There are several working groups that are deliberating on how we can best move forward, and we can expect to hear more from them soon.

Unfortunately, the unprecedented and sharp economic contractions caused by the coronavirus here in Georgia has also impacted our state budget. Although I remain confident that Georgia College will weather this storm, I am also keenly aware of the very real impact this will have on campuses across Georgia.

Chancellor Wrigley, in his letter last Friday, informed us that all state agencies, including the University System of Georgia, are being asked to submit proposals that include a 14% reduction of their base budgets. While this is not surprising given the devastation that COVID-19 has inflicted thus far, I also know this is not the news we wanted to hear.

I want you to know that we will do all that we can to be strategic and measured in how we comply with these directives. Please also know that we will do everything we can to minimize any impact to the Georgia College community; however, a budget revision of this magnitude will hurt. I know that it is our people and our focused mission that make Georgia College so special, and we will do all that is possible to ensure that we take care of our faculty and staff so that we can better serve our students.

Georgia College remains a nimble and adaptive institution. This isn't surprising – we are Georgia's designated liberal arts university, after all. And there's a reason our slogan is to Think Independently and Lead Creatively. I am calling on each of you to help us think and lead. We need your best ideas and thoughts regarding areas we might examine as we adapt to this new budgetary reality.

Last week, I sent you a letter describing several work groups that were beginning to think about the process of reopening the university. If you have ideas or suggestions about the budget reduction or the reopening effort, we welcome your thoughts. You can do this by sending your email to: feedback@gcsu.edu.

While the situation is still very fluid, the Executive Cabinet is working diligently to explore ways to develop this new budget. I will update you as we learn more about next steps. Let me end by saying how very proud and honored I am to serve our students, faculty and staff here at Georgia College. As we have done in the past, together, we are going to negotiate these uncharted waters; and, together, we will see our way through.

Fiscal Year End Deadlines Approaching

Materials Management : Tuesday May 12, 2020

Fiscal year-end is coming. Georgia College is responsible for ensuring that financials for the institution are accurately accounted for before closing-out the fiscal year on June 30, 2020. This includes making sure that any funding that can possibly lapse (go back to the State) is accounted for properly. Being a state entity, we have to follow certain purchasing policies and procedures which include deadlines for purchases on varying dollar amounts. To ensure that expenditures are reported properly during the transition of fiscal years, we have included deadlines on receiving transactional items. The following deadlines are necessary to ensure that transactions are properly executed and that our financials are appropriately reported.

CRITICAL DEADLINES/DATES:

Purchase Order cutoff dates:

- April 22, 2020 - Non-contract requisitions over \$100,000.
Non-contract items are not available on state or agency contracts.
- May 13, 2020 – Non-contract requisitions between \$25,000 and \$100,000
- June 4, 2020 – Requisitions up to \$25,000, state or agency contract purchases.

e-Procurement will not allow requisitions to be entered after June 4, 2020. Requisitions must be entered prior to close of business on June 4, 2020 in order to be processed. Requisitions must be approved and have a valid budget check by the dates above in order to assure adequate time for processing. If you have any questions concerning whether items are non-contract or contract, please contact the Purchasing staff at 478-445-4458. Please plan ahead and contact the Purchasing Department if you need any assistance.

P-Card cutoff dates:

- May 27, 2020 – No P-Card purchases after this date will be allowed for the FY 2020 budget. All transactions for period 4/28/2020 through 5/27/2020 should be allocated and signed off by cardholders and approvers in Works. This cutoff will help ensure that all transactions posted on or before this date are posted to your FY 2020 budgets. However, there may be circumstances where a transaction may be delayed and does not post until after the above date. In those cases, the charge will be posted against your FY 2021 budget. You can continue to use your card after the above date with the understanding those charges will be posted against your FY 2021 budget.
- June 17, 2020 – Signed P-card statements with receipts and approvals are due in the Purchasing Department by 5 pm.

Accounting Services cutoff dates:

- Travel and Travel Encumbrance deadlines have been posted to FrontPage in separate announcements and reminders will be sent. For questions on year-end travel, please call Omega at 478-445-1178 or email her at omega.hedgepeth@gcsu.edu.
- June 12, 2020 – All petty cash requests for reimbursements are due to the Comptroller's Office by 5 pm.
- June 12, 2020 – Last day to submit online check requests (i.e., registrations, memberships, direct billings for hotel/car rental, hotel prepayments, refunds, food items [Sodexo invoices, etc.] that are needed before July 17, 2020.)
- June 19, 2020 – Paper travel expense statements, when accepted, due by 5:00 pm. These will only be appropriate for nonemployee, encumbered, or International travel.

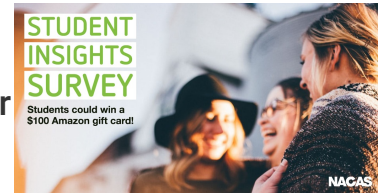

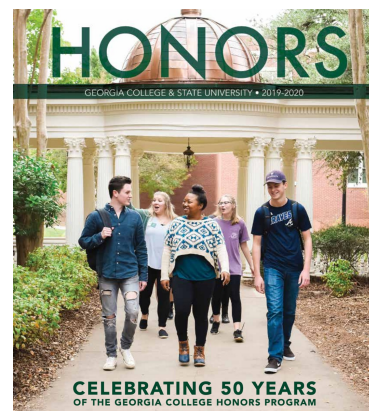

Student Rating of Instruction Survey (SRIS): May Term 2020

The Student Ratings of Instruction (SRIS) survey is now open and available for students to complete through June 3. Please encourage your students to complete the Student Rating of Instruction (SRIS) survey. We need a 65% completion rate for usable data. To locate updates to your class response rate, log in to Campus Labs using your Unify credentials.

Research and best practice consistently show the single greatest factor to increase participation in online student rating surveys is for faculty to express and demonstrate how the results are important and used in making meaningful change. The next most influential factor is to set aside time during studies to complete the surveys.

We understand time to complete coursework can be limited. However, when applicable, if you allow approximately 20 minutes for your students to complete surveys during their studies, research shows response rates improve.
