

Graduate Research Grants will be made in the following category:

Grants will be awarded that support student presentations of original scholarship or research conducted with a faculty mentor at professional academic conferences (virtual, inpersonal, international, national, regional and state level) in the student's discipline.

There is a maximum of \$400 per grant for conference fees, travel, and accommodations. Incomplete applications will not be considered. Only students who have not received funding in the past are eligible to apply.

## **Explore Black History and Culture at Georgia College & State University**

Black History Month is an international celebration that offers Americans, especially, the opportunity to recommit ourselves to our foundational ideals of freedom and equality.

Begun as a weeklong commemoration of Black history, American Historian Dr. Carter G. Woodson proposed the observance that has

become Black History Month as a challenge to all people to recognize the stories of countless Black men and women who contributed to the advancement of human civilization. In doing so, he asked everyone to reconsider our understanding of history, not as a list of the accomplishments of great individuals, but as a story of the aspirations of a great people and our progress toward those goals.

Although Black History Month is celebrated in the month of February, it's meant to inspire ongoing reflection on the diversity that strengthens our collective identity as Americans and as true global citizens. As an institution of higher education, Georgia College & State University works to contribute to the broad understanding of human progress. Embarking upon this celebration of Black History Month, we'd like to highlight some of the resources available on our campus for learning more about Black history and culture:

Horsepower: An Exhibition by Cedric Smith – An exhibit of paintings by Smith, exploring the absence of Black representation among haute couture and in print and television advertisements. On display at the Leland Gallery in Ennis Hall through Friday, February 9.

Common Heritage: Reframing and Reconsidering the Community's Memories from the Perspective of Those Who Lived Them – A grant-funded collaboration between the National Endowment for the Humanities, the Common Heritage Program and the Ina Dillard Russell Library to document and preserve the overlooked history of Milledgeville's African American community. The project encourages people to preserve their history by digitizing historical documents such as papers and pictures. An exhibit developed from contributed digital artifacts is on display in the Russell Library.

Georgia's Old Governor's Mansion, Labor Behind the Veil Tour— This specialized tour of Georgia's Old Governor's Mansion interprets antebellum life through the perspective of the people who toiled behind the veil of slavery and the free persons who worked at the mansion during the time of the governors. This tour gives a more in-depth and focused view on topics mentioned in the mansion's daily tour.

<u>The Sallie Ellis Davis House</u> – Sallie Ellis Davis worked her entire career as a teacher and principal at the Eddy School to touch the lives of Baldwin County children. Ms. Davis was an

inspiration and a pillar of the African American community in segregated Milledgeville. She believed that through a combination of hard work and education one could accomplish anything. Her legacy, preserved in her home, is one of excellence.

The Soul of Georgia -- "The Soul of Georgia" documents the development of a distinct facet of American cultural history through the music of Black, Georgia musicians. A collection of music, video, photographs and memorabilia are on display in the Ina Dillard Russell Library Special Collections Galleries with a digital exhibit accessible online, "The Soul of Georgia" tells how Black artists shaped the sound of America—beginning in Southern churches, juke joints and summer picnics, exploding over regional radio and finding a home on record players throughout the United State and across the world.

Sodexo Soul Food Thursdays -- Chef Enoch Rutherford will explore the influence and proliferation of southern food traditions through a series of featured meals served from the Chef's Table in the Max between 11 a.m. and 2 p.m., each Thursday during February.

## President Cox honors the late Sandra Dunagan Deal by sharing story time with local school children

Georgia College & State University President Cathy Cox honored the legacy of the late Sandra Dunagan Deal with local school children on Wednesday.

Sandra Deal, '63, '66, devoted her life to the issues of education and literacy and used her public platform, as the wife of former Governor Nathan Deal, to model the civic virtues of volunteerism and community service. In recognition of Deal's lifetime of advocacy, Cox read the Dr. Seuss story "Sneetches" to kindergarteners at Lakeview Primary School in Milledgeville.

The story time took place on Deal's birthday, February 1—the first since her passing in 2022. Cox joined members of the Deal family and other education advocates across Georgia in reading to children on the former first lady's birthday. The Deal family hopes to make February 1 an annual celebration of education and literacy by encouraging all Georgians to read a book to a young person on that day.

During her eight years as Georgia's First Lady, Deal touched the lives of countless children—sharing story time with students in more than 1,000 schools and pre-K programs in all of Georgia's 181 school districts and each of the state's 159 counties.

In 2017, the Georgia General Assembly provided funding to open the Sandra Dunagan Deal Center for Early Language and Literacy at GCSU, continuing Mrs. Deal's commitment to advancing childhood literacy programs across the state of Georgia.

The Office of Inclusive Excellence is pleased to announce its request for nominations for the Georgia College Inclusive Excellence Award.

The Georgia College Inclusive Excellence Award honors the cumulative contributions of faculty and staff members to advance diversity, equity, and inclusion at Georgia College & State University through an exemplary commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion through leadership, recruitment and retention efforts, teaching, research, multicultural programming, cultural competency, community outreach activities, or other initiatives.

## **Eligibility**:

Success in leading and enhancing diversity, equity, and inclusion efforts can be demonstrated in many ways. Nominations should be based on demonstrated leadership in one or more of the following areas:

- Activities to recruit, retain, and professionally develop individuals who increase the diversity of our faculty and staff.
- Activities to attract or recruit students who increase the diversity of our University or to help ensure the successful retention and graduation of those students.
- Activities to create organizations that promote a diverse, equitable, and inclusive campus environment.
- Sponsorship or active promotion of programs, initiatives, or projects that advance diversity, equity, and inclusion.
- Collaboration with campus or community groups in the creation, sponsorship, and implementation of programs, initiatives, or projects in the area of diversity, equity, and inclusion.
- Recognition and celebration of an exemplary individual and/or team behaviors that promote diversity, equity, and inclusion.

#### Selection Criteria:

Nominees should be current faculty, staff, or administrators at Georgia College & State University. Nominations can be submitted by individual employees (including supervisors, direct reports, and peers of the nominees) students, University organizations, employee networks, or diversity leadership teams.

Applications will be judged on the following criteria:

- Demonstration of emerging or sustained commitment to the values of diversity, inclusion, and multiculturalism by documented efforts that are above and beyond the routine expectations of the job or project.
- Evidence of exceptional efforts to promote a University environment that is free from bias and discrimination.
- Substantiation of the contribution that the individual, team, or unit has made toward advancing diversity, inclusion, and inclusive excellence.

Two awards will be given, one for faculty and one for staff. Award recipients will be honored during the Celebration of Excellence ceremony in April.

## English professor receives accolades for book on goddess mythology in literature

Dr. Mary Magoulick, an English professor at Georgia College & State University, has received honorable mention for the Elli Köngäs-Maranda Prize from the American Folklore Society for her book, "The Goddess Myth in Contemporary Literature and Popular Culture: A Feminist Critique."

Assistant Professor of English Dr. Julian Knox said Magoulick's book is one most English professors dream of writing.

"The Goddess Myth in Contemporary Literature and Popular Culture' is not just a culmination of decades of research, but it is also a testament to the ways in which innovative, interdisciplinary scholarship enriches our interactions with the cultural products we encounter and share in our daily lives," Knox said.

"Its magisterial bridging of diverse fields of expertise, forms of representation and modes of discourse is a timely reminder of what the liberal arts is all about," he added, "as is the fact that the book's subjects are ones Dr. Magoulick has taught across multiple programs—ranging from English to Women's & Gender Studies to Global Perspectives—during her tenure here at Georgia College."

In addition to the American Folklore Society honor, Magoulick is the also recent winner of the College of Arts & Sciences (COAS) award for Excellence in Scholarship & Creative Endeavors at Georgia College.

Magoulick said she feels honored, grateful and proud to be recognized by her peers for both honors.

"So much work and time went into this project, including teaching numerous courses related to topics covered in the book, carving out time to write the manuscript, then rethinking it, reading more, revising more and repeating those steps," she said. "This book is the culmination of over 15 years' worth of work. But mostly it was a labor of love, and it is extremely rewarding to find it attended to and appreciated."

In an abstract on her book, Magoulick describes goddess characters as being revered feminist heroes in popular media. Their portrayal in film, television and fiction, however, often reflects patriarchal culture rather than the empowering feminist. This "remythologizing of the ancient past reflects a contemporary worldview and rhetoric," which she says precludes women from their fuller natures.

"Within apparent good-over-evil, pop-culture narrative frames," Magoulick wrote, "these goddesses all suffer significantly. Some recent intersectional writers, like N. K. Jemisin, break through these typically dark reflections of contemporary power dynamics to offer complex characters who resist typical simplified, reductionist absolutes to offer messages that resonate with potential for today's world."

Magoulick is author of a dozen publications that include articles, book reviews, poetry and creative non-fiction. She's been at Georgia College for 23 years, teaching classes like Myth, Magic & the Modern World; some world literature; Women and Popular Culture; Women and Sci Fi; Women and Myth; Native American Literature; and Folklore and Literature, among others.

While traveling in Southwestern France, Magoulick was immersed in prehistory from the Upper-Paleolithic era and noted many inaccurately-named art works. She noticed a prevalence of goddess characters in contemporary entertainment that followed certain patterns. Her book explores what those patterns mean.

It's a relevant topic in today's world, she said, as most of our goddess myths reflect society, including its problems.

"But the book also honors and explores how art can inspire and suggest reasons to continue making art, continue celebrating and explaining texts, and to carry on in the important work of inspiring others to appreciate the power of art in contemplating and celebrating the human condition," Magoulick said. "This is what I believe one can see at work in my book – the way scholarship of artistic expression and consumption of art—whether as student, teacher, writer or reader—can challenge and inspire on many levels. My book embodies the best of the liberal arts."

Honorable mention for the Elli Köngäs-Maranda Professional Prize from the Women's Section of the American Folklore Society is a peer-juried award. Every year, the American Folklore Society awards two prizes in honor of Elli Köngäs-Maranda—a pioneering scholar, anthropologist and feminist folklorist. The prizes recognize superior work on women's traditional, vernacular or local culture or feminist theory and folklore.

"The Goddess Myth in Contemporary Literature and Popular Culture: A Feminist Critique" came out in February 2022 from the University Press of Mississippi, a premiere academic press for titles in the fields of folklore, popular culture and women's and gender studies, all of which the book tackles. It is the result of 15 years of hard work supported by a number of grants from Georgia College including a semester of professional leave in 2018, a residency at the Hambidge Creative Arts Center in North Georgia and a summer research fellowship from the Provost's Office.

Magoulick reaches fresh and astute insights into how mythologies and archetypes work in today's world, reflecting our world while also influencing our perceptions, practices and art. Looking through lenses of past and present, Magoulick points to power structures and patriarchal patterns of goddess-type imagery in our stories—be it traditional folklore, fantasy fiction or blockbuster film. She shows that most goddesses we create are more relevant to, reflective of and created by our still very patriarchal culture and our times than any imagined or real past."



The SIs lead regular, peer-facilitated study sessions, outside of class time, to discuss course concepts, review or practice material, and help strengthen students' study skills. SI Leaders host peer collaborative learning experiences which also promote

skills. SIs provide peer collaborative learning experiences which also promote involvement and inclusion into our culture of learning.

As undergraduates, Supplemental Instruction Leaders are not responsible for grading course work, preparing exams, teaching new material, or assigning grades. These responsibilities belong only to the faculty or graduate assistants who are hired by the University to teach the course and who are listed as the instructor of record.





## Call for GC 1010 Instructors for The Bridge Scholars Program

**Bridge Scholars Program : Wednesday February 8, 2023** 

This is an open call for applications to teach a one-credit student success course in the summer Bridge Scholars Program.

About the Bridge Scholars Program:

The Bridge Scholars Program (BSP) is a yearlong Residential Learning Community which gives first-year students a head start on college through a special program designed to help them make a successful transition from high school to campus. During the summer program, BSP students are placed into a cohort and take a one-credit hour success course and six hours of core courses. Students who pass all courses with a grade of C or better are eligible to return to GC. Returning students then continue to participate in special extracurricular activities and peer mentoring during their first-year. Past BSP students have gone on to be academically successful campus leaders, this is due in part to the strong start they have had for their college experience. One of the highlights and benefits of the program is the close interaction that BSP students enjoy with their faculty and BSP staff. We hope that you will consider applying for this unique teaching opportunity. (For more information, please visit the Bridge Scholars Program webpage)

#### **Summer Teaching Opportunity:**

Instructors are needed to teach several sections of GC 1010: Student Success Seminar. This summer the course will meet from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on June 20th – June 22nd. The course does not replace the fall FYAS; rather it is a "study skills boot camp" of sorts, designed to help Bridge Scholars strengthen their academic success skills. Rather than functioning as an orientation to campus or a career exploration course, the GC 1010 seminar covers topics such as test anxiety, time management, note-taking, reading comprehension and learning styles. The course utilizes the open-source text, College Success. Our goal is to front-load students with intensive academic skill-building before they proceed to take their summer core courses.

Instructors should understand that due to the nature of this program, there is an expectation of involvement outside the classroom to support and facilitate student development via relationship building and mentoring during the transition to university life. In addition to instructional time, those hired to teach with the BSP during summer 2023 will be required to participate in the following events:

- Friday, April 14th: BSP faculty/staff orientation 2-5 p.m.
- Saturday, June 18th: BSP Orientation and move-in
- Thursday, July 21st: Closing banquet

#### Compensation:

Instructors hired to teach the course will have one of two options. 1) You may elect to take three days of annual leave and receive a \$625 stipend for teaching (on the June 30 payroll). 2) Obtain supervisory approval to teach the course as part of your regular work duties on those three days and forgo the stipend.

#### How to Apply:

Interested employees should submit a paragraph identifying: (1) their interest in the BSP program, (2) their qualifications for teaching this course, and (3) their thoughts on how instructor involvement outside of the classroom can support and enhance pedagogy. Hiring decisions will be made by late March.

The Office of the Provost is pleased to announce that the Office of Sustainability relocated administratively to the Department of Biological and Environmental Sciences from Facilities Management beginning February 1. ### Rehired Retirees: Act Early, Change + Details Outlined

**Human Resources, Office of : Thursday February 9, 2023** 

May, June, and July are the busiest time of year for retirement vendors (TRS, ORP, ERS). In order to avoid hiring delays, we strongly encourage you to submit Rehired Retiree Applications ASAP for any full-time and/or part-time rehired retirees that you currently employ and wish to return, or new staff or faculty needed for Summer 2023, Fall 2023, and/or Spring 2024. Summer 2024 rehired retirees may be submitted early Spring 2024.

TRS recently communicated a change in their expectations for processing rehired retirees. This change was announced via circulation to the Supervisors ListServ on November 18, 2022. To remain compliant with these amended regulations, and to keep all processing consistent regardless of retirement agency (TRS, ORP, or ERS), the following changes have been implemented:

- STAFF rehired retirees who work the full fiscal year a single application may be submitted (July 1-June 30 if 12-month or August 1-May 31 if 10-month)
- STAFF rehired retirees who work part of the fiscal year a single application may be submitted for the work they are expected to perform; the application dates must be within the span of the fiscal year (July 1-June 30)
- FACULTY rehired retirees who receive a full-time, limited term contract (this is extremely rare) -- a single application may be submitted (July 1-June 30 if 12-month or August 1-May 31 if 10-month)
- FACULTY rehired retirees who receive a semester-by-semester contract (ALL part-time faculty) a single application for each semester must be submitted
  - Fall: August 1-December 31
  - Spring: January 1-May 31
  - Summer: A separate application is required for each term
    - Maymester: May 1-31
    - June: June 1-30
    - July: July 1-31

The new TRS rehired retiree expectation is aligned with our institutional part-time faculty contract schedule. If you have a part-time faculty rehired retiree, know that every contract issued and accepted will require a corresponding rehired retiree application; this includes any amendments made to credit hours and/or compensation.

#### Reminders:

- ALL rehired retirees are considered TEMPORARY employees and must be re-approved annually.
- NO rehired retiree can begin work until all approvals have been obtained and onboarding requirements completed. Failure to comply with this may put the rehired retiree's pension in jeopardy.

- No rehired retiree's compensation can exceed 49% of the compensation the individual made at the time of retirement; there are no exceptions.
- If the rehired retiree will be teaching, you are required to include the "rate per credit hour" as a separate document with the required course information; if not included, we may deny the application and ask you to resubmit with the missing information.
- Maximum FTE (full-time equivalency) for an employee is 49% (or 0.49 FTE); no rehired retiree can work more than 19 hours per week. To calculate FTE:
  - Number of hours worked per week / 40 hours in a standard work week = Accurately prorated FTE.
    - Example: Working 12 hours/week would be 12 hours worked / 40 hours in a standard work week = 0.3 FTE
    - Part-time faculty: Use the table on the PT Faculty contract to convert the number of credit hours taught to total working hours per week; do NOT calculate FTE solely based on credit hours taught.
- If you are hiring a FACULTY rehired retiree for:
  - Maymester 2023 ONLY
    - Hire Date 05/01/2023
    - End Date 05/31/2023
  - Maymester & June 2023
    - Hire Date 05/01/2023
    - End Date 06/30/2023
  - June 2023
    - Hire Date 06/01/2023
    - End Date 06/30/2023
  - July 2023
    - Hire Date 07/01/2023
    - End Date 07/31/2023
  - June & July 2023
    - You must execute 2 separate contracts since this spans 2 fiscal years 1 for June 2023 (FY23), 1 for July 2023 (FY24)
  - Full Summer 2023 (Maymester, June, & July)
    - You must execute 2 separate contracts since this spans 2 fiscal years 1 for Maymester & June 2023 (FY23), 1 for July 2023 (FY24)
  - Fall Semester 2023 ONLY
    - Hire Date 08/01/2023
    - End Date 12/31/2023
  - Full Academic Year 2023-2024: Fall/Spring
    - Hire Date 08/01/2023
    - End Date 05/31/2024

## **FY2023 Year-End Deadlines Approaching**

Finance & Administration: Friday February 10, 2023

The fiscal year-end is approaching, which means we must accurately account for the institution's financials before closing out the fiscal year on June 30, 2023. This includes ensuring that any funding that can possibly lapse (go back to the State) is accounted for properly. As a state entity, we are governed by certain purchasing policies and procedures, which include deadlines for purchases of varying dollar amounts. To ensure that expenditures are properly reported during the transition of fiscal years, we have deadlines for receiving transactional items. These deadlines, as listed below, are necessary to guarantee that transactions are properly executed and that our financials are appropriately reported.

#### **CRITICAL DEADLINES**

#### Purchase Order cutoff dates:

- March 15, 2023 Non-contract requisitions over \$100,000. (Non-contract items are not available on state or agency contracts.)
- April 14, 2023 Non-contract requisitions between \$25,000 and \$100,000.
- May 1, 2023 Requisitions up to \$25,000, state or agency contract purchases for any amount.

#### **Project Requests and Purchases**

- March 15, 2023 Requests that require scope development and/or design components (Ex. Renovation, paint, carpet, HVAC, Electrical, furniture, etc.) should be received in the Facilities Planning Office by March 15, 2023. Contractor pricing, lead time for materials and items that require design (architectural, furniture) all take longer than in years past. If you have any questions, please contact Mark Bowen at 478-445-2541.
- e-Procurement will not allow requisitions to be entered after May 1, 2023. Requisitions
  must be entered before 5 pm on May 1, 2023, in order to be processed. Requisitions

## **Andrew J. Allen Elected President of North American Saxophone Alliance**

Music, Department of: Friday February 10, 2023

Georgia College & State University Assistant Professor of Music Andrew J. Allen will lead the main professional association of saxophone performers, teachers and students in the United States and Canada.

The 1,500 members of the North American Saxophone Alliance selected Allen to serve as president-elect in recent officer elections. NASA is dedicated to the promotion of the saxophone at all levels and sponsors national and regional conferences, as well as the premiere English-language, peer-reviewed journal of saxophone research in the world, The Saxophone Symposium.



"This is a bit of a surreal experience," Allen said. "I've been a member of the Alliance since I was 14, and I've had the pleasure of serving it through a number of committees in recent years. I look forward to promoting the saxophone and saxophonists in this new capacity."

Allen joined the faculty at Georgia College in Fall 2019. His responsibilities include the university's saxophone studio, saxophone chamber ensembles, and the newly-formed Georgia College Saxophone Choir. In addition, he teaches undergraduate and graduate courses in music fundamentals, music theory and woodwind methods and serves as Coordinator of Winds & Percussion and as the Coordinator for the Bachelor of Arts in Music. In the past four years, his students have been accepted to perform at state, regional, and national events, including the Georgia Music Educators Association Conference, the North American Saxophone Alliance Region VI Conference, and the American Single Reed Summit. His former students have also received assistantships to pursue graduate study in saxophone. Later this Spring, his students will present accepted recitals at the North American Saxophone Alliance National Biennial Conference at the University of Southern Mississippi.

As a performer, Allen has played as a soloist and chamber musician throughout the United States, Canada, Great Britain, France and Croatia. He has premiered more than two dozen original concert works for his instrument by such composers as François Rossé (France), Robert Lemay (Canada), Fang Man (China) and Jesse Jones (USA). As a jazz and pop saxophonist, he has accompanied artists as diverse as The Temptations and Ronnie Milsap. His recordings of contemporary classical music can be heard on the Ravello and Equilibrium labels.

Allen is also one of the most active researchers and public pedagogues of the saxophone

today. His articles have appeared in The Instrumentalist, Music Educators Journal, Teaching Music, The Saxophone Symposium, College Music Symposium, JazzEd and School Band and Orchestra, among many other publications. His transcriptions and arrangements are available through Dorn Publications and Lovebird Music.

Allen has lectured throughout the United States and abroad and has presented clinics across the country, including at the state music education conventions of Georgia, North Dakota, South Carolina, South Dakota and Texas. He has presented masterclasses at some of the most prominent schools of music in the country, including Duquesne, Emory, Shenandoah Conservatory and the University of Cincinnati's College-Conservatory of Music, among many others. In the Milledgeville community, Allen is also choir director and a vestry member of St. Stephen's Episcopal Church.

During his term as president, Allen would like to broaden NASA's reach to serve all saxophonists.

"NASA currently serves college professors and students very well," Allen said. "However, I'd love to push our focus outward to include resources for school band directors, younger students and adult amateurs. I think there are many saxophonists that we're ignoring at the moment. Ultimately, I want to promote the best instrument in the world (in my opinion) and find ways of teaching more and more people about how wonderful it is and what an incredible expressive tool it can be."



This technique of doing research, called pearl growing, allows researchers to find articles that are related to an earlier work. 



This project is two mini-documentaries that focus on two women pitmasters/bbq restaurant owners in Georgia—Jenica Gilmore of Vanna BBQ in Vanna and Tammy Woodard of Smokey's BBQ in Pooler.

# Talk by Dr. Dana Gorzelany-Mostak, "From Nope to Dope: How Barack Obama and Kamala Harris Found a Hip Hop Strategy"

Philosophy Religion & Liberal Studies, Department of: Thursday February 16, 2023

In celebration of Black History Month, please join Black Studies and the department of Philosophy, Religion, and Liberal Studies for a talk by Dana Gorzelany-Mostak, "From Nope to Dope: How Barack Obama and Kamala Harris Found a Hip Hop Strategy." There will be a question and answer period following the talk, in which we encourage all to participate.

The event will be held in the Arts and Sciences Auditorium (263) at 2pm on Monday, February 20. We welcome students, faculty, staff, as well as the public. A description of Dr. Gorzelany-Mostak's talk is as follows:

At a 2008 campaign event, presidential candidate Barack Obama dismissed the attacks of primary opponent Hillary Clinton by symbolically brushing dirt off his shoulder, a nod to hip hop mogul Jay Z's popular track "Dirt Off Your Shoulder." The casual gesture resonated with supporters and inspired countless memes and remixes across social media. Blogger Spencer Ackerman even referred to Obama's brush as "the coolest subliminal cultural reference in the history of American politics." While this unscripted act may affirm the candidate's cool quotient, hip dad character, or man of the people persona, on a less explicit level, such moments of musical engagement operate as aural articulations of race and racial identity that tether the candidates to specific values, insights, histories, and embodied knowledge. If we are to consider the American presidency as both a symbol and an index of American masculinity, and by extension whiteness, how might music serve as a vehicle for performing identities both within and outside of this "standard," and what value might these articulations offer candidates and the constituencies with which they wish to communicate?

Early in her 2019 presidential campaign, Kamala Harris notably engaged with music on several occasions, including a mixtape on The Late Show with Stephen Colbert where she opined on her favorite songs and artists, and an interview on The Breakfast Club where she professed her love for Tupac and Snoop Dogg. While both Obama and Harris engaged with hip hop on the campaign trail, Obama's forays were met with applause, whereas Harris's opened the floodgates to a flurry of criticism. This presentation analyzes the media discourses surrounding Harris' engagement against the backdrop of recent scholarship on the intersection of politics, race, and gender. Ultimately, this analysis shows that while music engagement bestows cultural capital on male candidates, for female candidates, and especially Black women, musicality becomes yet another minefield of double standards.



# Head Over Heels: GCSU Theatre presents romantic romp with message of inclusion

Just past St. Valentine's Day, Georgia College & State University (GCSU) presents its romantic spring musical, Feb. 22-26. "Head Over Heels" is an upside-down, frolicking fairy tale about prophetic doom, mistaken identities and self-discovery set in a kingdom with 1980s punk costumes, Elizabethan Old English and upbeat music from the Go-Go's.



But, mostly, it's a play about love, inclusiveness and acceptance.

James Magruder's adaptation of the original book by Jeff Whitty, "Head Over Heels" opens with the Go-Go's hit "We Got the Beat." The beat is what sustains the town of Arcadia. An oracle warns the town it's about to lose this essence, due to the king's refusal to change. The king is played by freshman <u>mass communication</u> major Jonathan Doss of Gwinnett.

The beat is "like the force in Star Wars," said freshman<u>management</u> major Ben McPherson of Sharpsburg, Georgia, who plays Musidorus, a lowly, forlorn shepherd looking for affection. He loves the king's younger daughter, who's barred from marrying beneath her status.

To marry, the princess must wait until her elder sister weds. But the haughty sister, played by sophomore <u>theatre</u> major Lexi Gordy of Covington, rejects every suitor.

It's a story of unfulfillment and awakening, of staunch traditions and tolerance—accompanied by 18 great songs by the Go-Go's including "Head Over Heels," "Vacation," "Our Lips are Sealed," "Get Up and Go," "Lust to Love," "Mad About You," "Cool Jerk" and "Heaven is a Place on Earth."

The hot-pink set opens like a fairytale book. There are sword fights, baggy pants from the '80s and lots of 'thee' and 'thou' language set in a kingdom where people are not who they appear to be.

It's retro. It's ancient. It's modern. It's timeless.

"It all comes together in a wonderful, magical mesh of personality, song and dance," said Director Amy Pinney.

A cast of 16 student actors is supported by about 50 students behind the scenes doing set, lights, makeup and costumes.

GCSU's production of "Head Over Heels" premieres at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, Feb. 22, in

Russell Auditorium and runs through Saturday, Feb. 25, with a matinee performance at 2 p.m. Sunday, Feb. 26. Tickets can be purchased at <u>tickets.gcsu.edu</u>. Cost is \$15 for general admission; \$10 for senior citizens, faculty and staff and non-GCSU students; and \$5 for GCSU students.

"You're going to feel great when you leave," Pinney said. "The show is uplifting."

Her sentiments were echoed by Gordy, who said the play "is a true happily-ever-after."

"You're going to regret it, if you don't come and see it. I can promise you that," McPherson said.







# Fall "Head over Heels" in Love with Musical Comedy, Opening Tonight!

Just past St. Valentine's Day, Georgia College & State University (GCSU) presents its romantic spring musical, Feb. 22-26. "Head Over Heels" is an upside-down, frolicking fairy tale about prophetic doom, mistaken identities and self-discovery set in a kingdom with 1980s punk costumes, Elizabethan Old English and upbeat music from the Go-Go's.



But, mostly, it's a play about love, inclusiveness and acceptance.

James Magruder's adaptation of the original book by Jeff Whitty, "Head Over Heels" opens with the Go-Go's hit "We Got the Beat." The beat is what sustains the town of Arcadia. An oracle warns the town it's about to lose this essence, due to the king's refusal to change. The king is played by freshman <u>mass communication</u> major Jonathan Doss of Gwinnett.

The beat is "like the force in Star Wars," said freshman<u>management</u> major Ben McPherson of Sharpsburg, Georgia, who plays Musidorus, a lowly, forlorn shepherd looking for affection. He loves the king's younger daughter, who's barred from marrying beneath her status.

To marry, the princess must wait until her elder sister weds. But the haughty sister, played by sophomore <u>theatre</u> major Lexi Gordy of Covington, rejects every suitor.

It's a story of unfulfillment and awakening, of staunch traditions and tolerance—accompanied by 18 great songs by the Go-Go's including "Head Over Heels," "Vacation," "Our Lips are Sealed," "Get Up and Go," "Lust to Love," "Mad About You," "Cool Jerk" and "Heaven is a Place on Earth."

The hot-pink set opens like a fairytale book. There are sword fights, baggy pants from the '80s and lots of 'thee' and 'thou' language set in a kingdom where people are not who they appear to be.

It's retro. It's ancient. It's modern. It's timeless.

"It all comes together in a wonderful, magical mesh of personality, song and dance," said Director Amy Pinney.

A cast of 16 student actors is supported by about 50 students behind the scenes doing set, lights, makeup and costumes.

GCSU's production of "Head Over Heels" premieres at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, Feb. 22, in

Russell Auditorium and runs through Saturday, Feb. 25, with a matinee performance at 2 p.m. Sunday, Feb. 26. Tickets can be purchased at <u>tickets.gcsu.edu</u>. Cost is \$15 for general admission; \$10 for senior citizens, faculty and staff and non-GCSU students; and \$5 for GCSU students.

"You're going to feel great when you leave," Pinney said. "The show is uplifting."

Her sentiments were echoed by Gordy, who said the play "is a true happily-ever-after."

"You're going to regret it, if you don't come and see it. I can promise you that," McPherson said.





# "This Might Hurt" - Virtual Documentary Screening

The Georgia College & State University Chapter of Psi Chi, Psychology Club, and STEM Club presents:

"This Might Hurt" - A documentary screening and virtual panel discussion!



Chronic pain impacts an estimated 50.2 million adults in the United States every day or nearly every day (Yong, Mullins, & Bhattacharyya, 2022). Many of those individuals report that "traditional" interventions (e.g., opiates, physical therapy, etc.) have limited to no effect on managing their pain. Over the past several years, researchers and clinicians have been testing the effectiveness of other interventions for managing chronic pain, including the use of cannabis (McDonagh et al., 2022) and psychological interventions like Pain Reprocessing Therapy (PRT - Ashar, Gordon, & Schubiner, 2021) and Emotional Awareness & Expression Therapy (EAET - Lumely & Schubiner, 2019).

This Might Hurt, "offers solutions to reduce and unlearn chronic pain. The film follows three chronic pain patients who have spent years searching for answers. Desperate for relief, they enter a new medical program — run by Dr. Howard Schubiner — that focuses on uncovering hidden causes of pain and retraining their brains to switch the pain off." The documentary focuses on PRT as an intervention and discusses psychological aspects of pain.

We have screening window for viewing the documentary that runs from February 21st through March 7th and on March 7th at 6 p.m., we will host a virtual panel discussion with one of the filmmakers and Daniel Lyman, LCSW MPA - Founder/director of the Mind Body Therapy & Coaching Center! During the panel where you can ask them questions as well as learn more about the film and the interventions.



# Reminder: Outdoor Emergency Notification System Test Wednesday, Mar. 1

Public Safety: Tuesday February 28, 2023

Georgia College will test the Outdoor Emergency Notification System (siren system) Wednesday, March 1, 2023. This test is scheduled to occur the first Wednesday of every month between 10 a.m. and noon and last approximately one minute. No action is required during the testing, and all campus operations should continue as normal. A message stating that this is a test will precede and follow the "alert" tone. In the case of an actual tornado warning, the message would advise of a tornado warning, and the tone would cycle through. This would be repeated every five minutes until the warning expires or is canceled, at which time an all clear message would sound. The audible system test will only be tested when clear sky conditions are present. Tests will not occur when skies are dark or severe weather is predicted for the area on the day the test is scheduled to occur. In this case, the test will be canceled for the month.

There are three sirens operated by GC in Baldwin County: one on West Campus and two on Main Campus.

This testing program is designed to maintain a reliable warning system and to meet recommended testing guidelines. Additionally, we want to maximize the effectiveness of the Outdoor Emergency Notification System. By performing these tests, we hope to enhance awareness and education regarding emergency preparedness at Georgia College and within the local community.
