



Artist in Residence and current Leland Gallery exhibitor Esteban Patino will be speaking on his process and work on March 9, 5:00-6:00 PM, in A&S 272.

"Aesthetically, each iteration of my language study is distinct: my sculptures are sinuous sentinels, seeking symbolic approximation to atemporality and the possibility of universal shapes; my collages are humanoid bricolages, amorphous inquisitive monsters that portray the complexities of time and human existence; my paintings are deeply intuitive forms that awaken on the canvas, often drawing on the colors and landscapes of my native Colombia. However distinct, these styles are deeply in concert with one another—forming my praxis and pushing to me (re)consider the multifarious nature of words as symbols with infinite idiosyncratic interpretations."



IMERYS geology team takes time to work with ceramic art students in Sandersville, GA.

IMERYS geology team takes time to work with ceramic art students in Sandersville, GA.

This week GCSU students explored the site of our prime clay mineral in one of IMERYS' active kaolin mines. Kaolin is our primary clay for creating the porcelain and glazes that allows for students' art and ideas to come to life. Thanks to Laura Holly Mock and the invitation, IMERYS generously donated the time of two of their geologists and two of their ceramic engineers to guide the students through one of their processing plants and clay mines. Students gained knowledge of IMERYS' worldwide product reach and their commitment to environmental reclamation in Georgia.

As the students geared up and stepped foot on the giant kaolinite bed, some 70 feet below the road, they had one of those a-ha moments when they saw – first-hand- the strata of earth minerals. The experience combined with the knowledge that the very same clay mineral underfoot was formed 70 million years ago put their artist material for pottery into perspective.



This excursion combined with images of our clays from Dr. Kalina Manolov's expert microscopic lens created a good circle of experiential learning that combines art in the making and science. A typical ceramics class at GCSU is always a fabulous mix of our majors including ART, PALS, Psychology, Department of World Languages, Environmental Science, Business, and Nursing – it's evident here that liberal arts is what we do best!

Outdoor Emergency Notification System Test Tuesday, Mar. 7

Public Safety: Monday March 6, 2023

Georgia College will test the Outdoor Emergency Notification System (siren system) Tuesday, March 7, 2023. This test is scheduled for once a month, every month between 10 a.m. and noon and last approximately one minute. No action is required during the testing, and all campus operations should continue as normal. A message stating that this is a test will precede and follow the "alert" tone. In the case of an actual tornado warning, the message would advise of a tornado warning, and the tone would cycle through. This would be repeated every five minutes until the warning expires or is canceled, at which time an all clear message would sound. The audible system test will only be tested when clear sky conditions are present. Tests will not occur when skies are dark or severe weather is predicted for the area on the day the test is scheduled to occur. In this case, the test will be Rescheduled for later in the month.

There are three sirens operated by GC in Baldwin County: one on West Campus and two on Main Campus.

This testing program is designed to maintain a reliable warning system and to meet recommended testing guidelines. Additionally, we want to maximize the effectiveness of the Outdoor Emergency Notification System. By performing these tests, we hope to enhance awareness and education regarding emergency preparedness at Georgia College and within the local community.







Dr. Al Mead was elected Academy President during the 100th Annual Meeting of the Georgia Academy of Science hosted by Georgia College & State University on March 3-4. Dr. Mead is a Professor in the Department of Biological and Environmental Sciences. The position is a six-year term with two years as President-elect, two years as President, and two years as post-President. The Academy brings together STEM colleagues from across the state in the disciplines of Biology, Chemistry, Earth and Atmospheric Sciences, Physics, Math, Computer Science, Biomedical, Anthropology, Psychology, Philosophy and History of Science, and Science Education. TODAY: The state's only K-5 Science & Engineering Fair will be largest ever at GCSU

Science Education Center: Thursday March 9, 2023

Georgia College & State University (GCSU) will host its annual state science competition for kindergarten through fifth grade from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Thursday, March 9, at Centennial Center.

It'll be the largest group of elementary students since the fair started in 2018.



This year, 49 school districts across Georgia will send 439 K-5 students presenting 317 projects to compete in the state fair. All projects in Thursday's competition won first place in local school districts.

"This competition started 6 years ago as Georgia College was the only regional competition in the state still holding K-5 fairs. Other regions wanted to send their students to us," said Dr. Catrena Lisse, director of the university's Science Education Center.

"We expanded beyond our region and became the official K-5 state science and engineering fair," she said. "It's exciting to see so many young people engaging in the scientific process and solving the mysteries of their own curiosity."

Several new school systems from North and Southeastern Georgia will be at the fair this year. Counties participating from Central Georgia include Baldwin, Bibb, Jones, Monroe, Washington and Wilkinson.

The K-5 State Science Fair follows the 46th Annual Regional Science & Engineering Fair for 6-12th graders held at Georgia College in February. Several projects at that fair experimented with spiders, sugar and humidity.

Topics for the upcoming the K-5 level include:

- studying the aerodynamics of paper airplanes
- investigating the strength of triangle trusses to build stronger bridges
- exploring the chemistry of making big bubbles
- using electric motors to improve transportation in metro areas
- considering the optimum angle for kicking a football.

About 180 Georgia College students will volunteer at the science fair, along with more than 120 professional judges who specialize in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics). Activities for participants include a STEM marketplace and movie, engineering design challenges, science games and tours of the university's Natural History Museum and new Integrated Science Complex.

Students will be at their project exhibits starting at 8 a.m. with judging from 10 a.m. to noon. The fair is open to the public from 1:30 to 4 p.m., and the awards ceremony is at 5 p.m. at Centennial Center.

"As a scientist, I have an obligation to share my love of science with our youth, especially our smallest ones, in order to keep their interest alive as they grow," Lisse said. "By the time they reach middle and high school, either the seed of love for science has been planted and nurtured or it hasn't."



Sallstrom Honors College & MURACE and which will be held on Tuesday, March 28 at 6:00 p.m. in Magnolia Ballroom. This is a signature event for us, and we would love for you to be a part of it! The keynote speaker is Dr. Destenie Nock, Assistant Professor of Engineering and Public Policy and Civil and Environmental Engineering at Carnegie Mellon University. Her address is titled "Stepping Stones for a Meaningful Career."

Abstract: Landing a meaningful career is a worthy goal, but how do you know which stepping stones will get you to your dream job? Dr. Nock will share her experiences navigating through academia, studying abroad in Ireland and Malawi, and how all of that ultimately led to a career working in solving energy poverty. She will talk about her experience as a Mitchell Scholar, the graduate study that she facilitated at Queen's University in Belfast, her research on sustainable energy planning and how students can craft paths that positively benefit communities around the world.

Bio: Dr. Nock is a leader in energy justice, environmental justice, sustainable energy transitions, and the energy-poverty-climate change nexus. In her current work she is developing frameworks for understanding the sustainability and equity trade-offs for different power plant investments across the US. In addition, she has pioneered new measures of energy poverty to help utility companies identify vulnerable populations and energy deficits (i.e., energy limiting behavior and forgone thermal comfort). Dr. Nock is the Chief Executive Officer of Peoples Energy Analytics, a data driven company which uses energy analytics to identify energy poverty in vulnerable households. She is also the Chief Sustainability Officer of DevvStream a carbon streaming company. Dr. Nock received her PhD in Industrial Engineering and Operations Research from the University of Massachusetts Amherst, and two BS degrees in Electrical Engineering and Applied Mathematics from North Carolina A&T state University.

Bringing science to the elementary level: GCSU holds 5th Renewable Energy Day

Chemistry, Physics, & Astronomy, Department of: Tuesday March 21, 2023

About 65 first and second graders will attend Georgia College & State University's 5th Renewable Energy Day from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. today—Tuesday, March 21 at Centennial Center—as physics students demonstrate the power of sun, wind, water, biofuel and other sustainable sources

It's the first Renewable Energy Day since the COVID-19 pandemic.

"Even if they cannot fully comprehend the ideas of climate change or global warming, it's important to expose children at very young ages to these topics," said Dr. Hasitha Mahabaduge, associate professor of physics.

"We've seen how they light up when watching demonstrations related to different renewable energy technologies," Mahabaduge said. "Georgia College students do a great job presenting these ideas at a level first and second graders can understand. It's a win-win situation for both parties and, most importantly, a win for our planet earth."

Students from Lakeview Primary and Midway Hills Primary Schools in Milledgeville will rotate between several instructional and engaging demonstrations lasting 15 minutes each. There will also be lunch, a video, craft and closing activity.

Experiments include:

- Making solar cells using raspberries and blackberries
- Using popsicle sticks and paper cups as spinning wind turbines
- Watching waves move plastic tubes coiled in a wire, bobbing magnets up-and-down to generate an electrical current
- Creating a microbial fuel cell, where naturally-occurring electrochemical processes of anaerobic bacteria break down food into energy
- Games that demonstrate the electric grid and how solar cell works

Georgia College students helped organize the event and will assist with activities. They are volunteers from Mahabaduge's renewable energy class, the GCSU Physics Club and Office of Sustainability.

The day closes with elementary students signing a banner, pledging their commitment to conserve energy.







College of Health Sciences hosts poverty simulation to give glimpse of frustration and anxiety experienced by the poor

College of Health Sciences: Tuesday March 21, 2023

A unique poverty simulation Friday, March 24, will replicate the conditions of the poor, giving participants a hint of what it's like to face everyday hardships, scarceness of food and insufficient shelter.

The Community Action Poverty Simulation will be 2 to 4:30 p.m. in Georgia College & State University's Health Sciences building on N. Wilkinson Street, room 314. About 80 participants—from students, faculty and staff to local civic leaders—will experience this virtual reality of deprivation, designed by the Community Action Poverty Simulation (CAPS) in Missouri.



Millions live at or below the federal poverty level. Nearly 40% of Milledgeville's residents live in poverty. That's 26% higher than the state average and nearly 30% higher than the national average, according to the U.S. Census Bureau.

The simulation is designed to sensitize people who frequently deal with low-income families, creating a broader awareness of poverty among policymakers and community leaders. The ultimate goal is to inspire change and improve lives.

"This program helps people understand the complexities and frustrations of living in poverty daily," said Toyia Barnes, diversity officer in the College of Health Sciences (CoHS). "With a greater awareness of its impact, CoHS is meeting its goal of developing equity-minded, healthcare practitioners."

Participants will role-play the lives of low-income families using simulation kits. Some will be single mothers with children receiving Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF). Others will play the disabled, senior citizens on Social Security or people with chronic illnesses.

All will have the stressful task of meeting basic needs and finding shelter on limited budgets during the course of four, 15-minute 'weeks.'

The room is the community; a participant's chair is their home; and those sitting nearby, their neighbors. Participants will move around the room perimeter to get resources they need. They'll interact with human service agencies, schools, banks, grocers, pawnbrokers, bill collectors, job interviewers and police officers, among others.

Volunteers from local community service agencies will act as resource agents.

"Understanding the reality of poverty," Barnes said, "will help our future healthcare practitioners as they enter their chosen fields of study."

Political Science Student Wins Best Student Paper Award

Under the direction and guidance of Dr. Min Kim, Vivian Cassaniti presented her research paper, "Gender Gap in Social Welfare Policy Attitudes," at the 2023 Georgia Academy of Science conference (March 3-4) and won the award for Best Student Paper.

Ms. Cassaniti's study explores the dynamics of gender differences in attitudes to public policy issues and how they shape American politics. This study sheds light on what gendered patterns of public opinion look like in the United States, what underlying factors drive these patterns, and how gender interacts with other identities to influence political attitudes. To examine how partisanship and other identities influence gender disparities in social welfare policy attitudes, this study analyzes data from the 2021 General Social Survey.



Affecting the Conflict: Art, Film, and War in Colombia

Wednesday, March 29th, 1:00 PM, Peabody Auditorium

For nearly 60 years, Colombia was in the grip of a harrowing internal armed conflict. By the time the peace treaty between FARC—the largest of the country's guerrilla groups—and the government was signed in 2016, nearly 17% of the population had been a direct victim of the war (according to UNICEF). While the conflict ravaged the countryside, it was, for the most part, experienced as a distant event in the main cities, where citizens mostly new about it through the media.

Visual artists have referred to the conflict since its beginning in the late 1950s. However, how they approach it has changed throughout the years. While in the early stages of the conflict, the explicit representation and denunciation of violence and human suffering was the norm, later, artists resorted to less explicit aesthetic strategies. In this lecture, I will address this shift toward an implicit mediation of the conflict and what that means in the context of the main cities, where most of the art in question has been produced and exhibited. A key focus will be on its capacity to affect Colombian urbanites, thereby bridging the distance between them and the predominantly rural conflict.

Ruben Yepes Munoz is an Assistant Professor of Art History at Georgia College. He received his PhD from the University of Rochester in 2017. His dissertation, which addresses the mediation of the Colombian armed conflict in visual art and film, was published in 2018. Current research focuses on the art produced in Latin America in response to the Covid-19 crisis and the genealogy of Latin American Visual Studies.

Ruben is the author of three books: Afectando el conflicto: Mediaciones de la guerra colombiana en el arte y el cine contemporáneo (2018), María José Arjona: Lo que puede un cuerpo (2015) and La política del arte: Cuatro casos de arte contemporáneo en Colombia (2012). He is also the author of a number of peer-reviewed articles and book chapters published in Argentina, Canada, Colombia, Mexico, and the United States.

Ruben has received several important fellowships, grants and awards, including the National Prize for Scholarly Essay in Art History (2017, Colombia), a Mellon/ACLS Dissertation Completion Fellowship (2016), a Grant for Research on Colombian Art from the Colombian Ministry of Culture (2015) and a Fulbright Scholarship (2012).

History faculty member receives grant to collect oral histories on Flannery O'Connor

History & Geography, Department of : Thursday March 23, 2023

Dr. Stephanie Opperman, associate professor of history at Georgia College & State University, won a grant of nearly \$150,000 from the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) for a faculty/student project collecting oral histories on the life and works of alumna and author Flannery O'Connor.

The funds were part of \$28.1 million in grants awarded recently by NEH for more than 200 humanities projects nationwide. These were given for initiatives at colleges and universities, conservation research, innovative digital resources and infrastructure projects at cultural institutions, according to the NEH website.

"We are excited to interview community members who lived in Milledgeville during the heart of O'Connor's writing career (1951-1964)," Opperman said.

"We hope to learn more about experiences with class, gender, race, disability, the Cold War, religious beliefs, commercialism and old/new South mythologies in 1950s rural Georgia," she said. "Given that the grant is centered on student engagement, we are also looking forward to what our undergraduates produce in collaboration with the community."

Opperman is listed as principal investigator and project co-director. Dr. Jordan Cofer, associate provost for Transformative Learning Experiences, will serve as co-director. English Professor Dr. Bruce Gentry and Dr. Bob Wilson, emeritus professor of history and university historian, will serve as scholarly consultants.

Their endeavor, titled "Collecting the Past," will take three years to complete. It'll include related podcasts and videos, as well as oral histories about O'Connor.

The project team will begin hiring student researchers this summer. Oral history interviews will start taking place in spring 2024, as part of Opperman's HIST 4010 Local History course. Students interested in conducting interviews and/or producing podcasts should be on the lookout for future announcements related to the grant.

New Technology for Students in the Integrated Science Complex

Dr. Arnab Sengupta, Assistant Professor of Biology, and his students returned from spring break excited to set up the Illumina iSeq next-



generation sequencer in the Integrated Science Complex. Students, Alexandra Furney, Brittany Benner, Jin Yeong Kim, and Jonathan Hoffman, came in on a Sunday to help unpack and set up the new sequencer. This instrument boosts the department's capacity to conduct cutting-edge biotechnology research entirely in-house.

Next-generation sequencing (NGS) reads individual building blocks that make a DNA molecule. NGS has a number of different applications and will be utilized by multiple labs in the department. Hands-on training in NGS sample preparation, instrument operation, and data analysis will provide highly impactful training to our students, preparing them for advanced research and rewarding careers in the biotechnology industry and biomedical sciences. The easy-to-operate iSeq 100 system will be incorporated into teaching courses such as Molecular Biotechniques, providing hands-on NGS training to a large number of students.

This technology directly impacts the mentored undergraduate research projects of several students in the various labs in the department, including the groups of Drs. Sengupta, Andrei Barkovskii, and Bruce Snyder as well as faculty and students affiliated with the GCSU Aquatic Sciences Center.

The department's prior acquisition of the Agilent TapeStation – an automated electrophoresis system for sample quality control of DNA and RNA samples - paved the way for our students to use this instrument effectively. Institutional research support from the College of Arts & Sciences, Academic Affairs, GC Journeys mini-grants and the department have enabled our students to have prepared samples ready to run on this technology right away.





The Rural Studies Institute (RSI) in partnership with the Sustainability Council is launching the inaugural Rural Changemakers Lecture Series on April 11, 2023 at 6:30 pm at Peabody Auditorium. We have a very exciting inaugural speaker, Catherine Coleman Flowers, a 2020 MacArthur genius fellow, who is internationally recognized for her work on environmental issues. Below you will find more discussion of her exciting work.

She is a 2020 MacArthur "genius" grant recipient, and an author. She has dedicated her life's work to advocating for environmental justice, primarily equal access to clean water and functional sanitation for communities across the United States.

She is the Founder of the <u>Center for Rural Enterprise and Environmental Justice</u> (CREEJ), and has spent her career promoting equal access to clean water, air, sanitation, and soil to reduce health and economic disparities in marginalized, rural communities.

Flowers is a Board Member for the Center for Earth Ethics at Union Theological Seminary, and sits on the Board of Directors for the Climate Reality Project and the Natural Resources Defense Council. Flowers is also Co-Chair of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences Commission on Accelerating Climate Action and Practitioner in Residence at Duke University.

She serves as the Vice Chair of the inaugural White House Environmental Justice Advisory Council. Flowers was also named Levenick Resident Scholar in Sustainable Leadership at the University of Illinois for the spring 2021 and was awarded an honorary PhD in science from Wesleyan University.

As the author of <u>Waste: One Woman's Fight Against America's Dirty Secret</u>, Flowers shares her inspiring story of advocacy, from childhood to environmental justice champion. She has been featured in The New York Times, The Washington Post, Bloomberg, The Guardian, and on PBS.

Outdoor Emergency Notification System Test Thursday, March 30

Public Safety: Wednesday March 29, 2023

Georgia College & State University will test the Outdoor Emergency Notification System (siren system) Thursday, March 30, 2023. No action is required during the testing, and all campus operations should continue as normal. A message stating that this is a test will precede and follow the "alert" tone. In the case of an actual tornado warning, the message would advise of a tornado warning, and the tone would cycle through. This would be repeated every five minutes until the warning expires or is canceled, at which time an all clear message would sound. The audible system test will only be tested when clear sky conditions are present. Tests will not occur when skies are dark or severe weather is predicted for the area on the day the test is scheduled to occur. In this case, the test will be rescheduled for later in the month.

There are three sirens operated by GC in Baldwin County: one on West Campus and two on Main Campus.

This testing program is designed to maintain a reliable warning system and to meet recommended testing guidelines. Additionally, we want to maximize the effectiveness of the Outdoor Emergency Notification System. By performing these tests, we hope to enhance awareness and education regarding emergency preparedness at Georgia College and within the local community.

FY2023 Year-End Deadlines Approaching

Finance & Administration: Wednesday March 29, 2023

NEXT UPCOMING CRITICAL DEADLINE IS IN TWO WEEKS.

The fiscal year-end is approaching, which means we must accurately account for the institution's financials before closing out the fiscal year on June 30, 2023. This includes ensuring that any funding that can possibly lapse (go back to the state) is accounted for properly. As a state entity, we are governed by certain purchasing policies and procedures, which include deadlines for purchases of varying dollar amounts. To ensure that expenditures are properly reported during the transition of fiscal years, we have deadlines for receiving transactional items. These deadlines, as listed below, are necessary to guarantee that transactions are properly executed and that our financials are appropriately reported.

CRITICAL DEADLINES

Purchase Order cutoff dates:

- April 14, 2023 Non-contract requisitions between \$25,000 and \$100,000.
- May 1, 2023 Requisitions up to \$25,000, state or agency contract purchases for any amount.

Project Requests and Purchases

- March 15, 2023 Requests that require scope development and/or design components (Ex. Renovation, paint, carpet, HVAC, electrical, furniture, etc.) should be received in the Facilities Planning Office by March 15, 2023. Contractor pricing, lead time for materials and items that require design (architectural, furniture) all take longer than in years past. If you have any questions, please contact Mark Bowen at 478-445-2541.
- e-Procurement will not allow requisitions to be entered after May 1, 2023. Requisitions must be entered before 5 p.m. May 1, 2023, in order to be processed. Requisitions must also be approved and have a valid budget check by the dates above in order to provide adequate time for processing. If you have any questions concerning whether items are non-contract or contract, please contact the Purchasing staff at 478-445-4458.

P-Card cutoff dates:

- May 26, 2023 All P-Card transactions occurring between April 28, 2023, through May 27, 2023, must be allocated and signed off by cardholders and approvers in Works. P-Card purchases after this date will not be included in the FY2023 budget. This cutoff will help ensure that all transactions posted on or before this date are posted to your FY 2023 budgets. There may be circumstances where a transaction is delayed and does not post until after the above date. In those cases, the charge will be posted against your FY2024 budget. You can continue to use your card after the above date with the understanding that those charges will be posted against your FY2024 budget.
- June 9, 2023 Signed P-card statements with receipts and approvals are due in the Purchasing Department by 5 p.m.

Accounting Services cutoff dates:

- May 1, 2023 Last day to submit online check requests (i.e., registrations, memberships, direct billings for hotel/car rental, hotel prepayments, refunds, food items, Sodexo invoices, etc.), that are needed before July 14, 2022.
- June 9, 2023 All petty cash requests for reimbursements are due to Accounting Office by 5 p.m.
- June 16, 2023 Approved paper travel expense statements (for non-employee, encumbered or international travel) are due by 5 p.m.

Travel cutoff dates:

- May 1, 2023 Year End Travel Form (see attached)- This form is required for any travel within May 1, 2023 June 30, 2023, period for encumbrances purposes.
- June 14, 2023 –Last day to submit Online Travel for reimbursement. For questions on year-end travel, please call Omega Hedgepeth at 478-445-1178 or email her at omega.hedgepeth@gcsu.edu.

Reminder - New Vendors:

• Purchasing and Accounting will need to allow four (4) weeks to validate new suppliers as we approach the year-end deadlines. The supplier information form must be completed in full by suppliers, otherwise, forms will be returned for updates.

• June 9, 2023 - Deadline for monthly user charges including Bookstore, gas, mail and

Payroll fiscal year-end notice:

Temporary Employees (students, casual labor, hourly rehired retirees) will be posted to

June 25 – June 30, 2023, pay period.




