



The Sacrifice Zone

If you travel down a one-mile stretch of Doremus Avenue in Newark, NJ, you pass a natural gas plant next to a sewage treatment facility next to an animal fat rendering plant next to a series of ominous looking chemical storage containers behind acres of fencing. Airplanes pass overhead every two minutes, their engines rattling windows, while a putrid smell wafts from the open pools at the sewage treatment plant.

This stretch is known as Chemical Corridor, and it's located just down the road from schools and apartment buildings. It borders the Ironbound neighborhood, where Portuguese, Brazilian, Central American and African American residents are separated from toxic substances by little more than a railroad track.

The Ironbound district of Newark, New Jersey, is one of the most toxic neighborhoods in the country. Maria Lopez-Nuñez, a Honduran-American resident there, is waging a war for environmental justice. She is part of the Ironbound Community Corporation, one of the most effective environmental justice organizations in the country. The Sacrifice Zone follows Maria as she leads a group of environmental justice fighters determined to break the cycle of poor communities of color serving as dumping grounds for our consumer society (52 min.).

Biology Student Benefits from Attending STEM Industry Night

Biology & Environmental Sciences, Department of: Monday April 3, 2023

STEM Industry Night, hosted by the Career Center, proved to have immediate benefits for one our students in the Department of Biological & Environmental Sciences. Dana Thiemann, a Biology Senior got an internship with Aalto Scientific, one of the event vendors. The research that she will be conducting this summer is essentially a continuation of the research she is currently learning in her Molecular Biotechniques class.



The Molecular Biotechniques course is a course-based undergraduate experience (CURE) designed to provide cutting-edge research training to students. Dana, who has not had an opportunity to participate in individual mentored research, is conducting an original class project with a team of 3 other students. Her team is working with the oncogene c-myc. The goal of team is to design a DNA molecule that can be used to validate the regulatory function of this oncogene.

Over this spring semester, students in this course learned how to design PCR primers, design, and simulate a molecular cloning experiment, perform cell culture techniques, and use some of the department's newer technology like the TapeStation and Nanopore sequencing.

Throughout the course, the students - including Dana - learned how to work in a scientific team and conduct multiple types of data analysis skills along with scientific communication (both written and oral). These transferable skills are evident in her success in getting this internship.

Dana credits Assistant Professor Dr. Arnab Sengupta for providing "...an opportunity like this to us students who have not participated in a research class and thank you for helping me personally with learning new lab techniques and helping with my resume. I truly believe that I would not be getting this internship without this class and your support".

Outdoor Emergency Notification System Test Wednesday, April 5th

Public Safety: Tuesday April 4, 2023

Georgia College will test the Outdoor Emergency Notification System (siren system) Wednesday, April 5, 2023. This test is scheduled to occur the first Wednesday of every month between 10 a.m. and noon and last approximately one minute. No action is required during the testing, and all campus operations should continue as normal. A message stating that this is a test will precede and follow the "alert" tone. In the case of an actual tornado warning, the message would advise of a tornado warning, and the tone would cycle through. This would be repeated every five minutes until the warning expires or is canceled, at which time an all clear message would sound. The audible system test will only be tested when clear sky conditions are present. Tests will not occur when skies are dark or severe weather is predicted for the area on the day the test is scheduled to occur. In this case, the test will be rescheduled for later in the month.

There are three sirens operated by GC in Baldwin County: one on West Campus and two on Main Campus.

This testing program is designed to maintain a reliable warning system and to meet recommended testing guidelines. Additionally, we want to maximize the effectiveness of the Outdoor Emergency Notification System. By performing these tests, we hope to enhance awareness and education regarding emergency preparedness at Georgia College and within the local community.







Two GCSU faculty named as Governor's Teaching Summer Fellows

Two Georgia College & State University educators have been selected to attend the Governor's Teaching Fellows (GTF) Summer Symposium—a selective program that helps teachers increase their knowledge of new technologies and innovative instruction for the classroom.



The two fellows are Dr. Suzanna Roman-Oliver, assistant professor of <u>Secondary Education</u>, and Dr. Omolola Akinola Ologunorisa, lecturer in <u>Geography</u>. They join about a dozen other educators statewide for an intensive five days of learning at the University of Georgia (UGA) May 15 to 19.

"I feel very honored to have been nominated by Georgia College and selected by this program as a fellow for the Summer Symposium. I look forward to engaging in the learning activities and meeting other like-minded educators from different institutions," Roman-Oliver said.

Ologunorisa said, "I love teaching and I value it as a higher calling, and because of this, I always look for avenues to train myself with innovative teaching strategies that will provide my students with active, enhanced and engaging learning experiences."

The <u>Governor's Teaching Fellows Program</u> was established in 1995 by former Georgia Governor Zell Miller to give higher-education faculty more opportunities to develop important teaching skills. GTF is designed to bring professors up-to-speed, so Georgia students are taught tech-savvy skills and can compete for jobs in an ever-changing, global job market.

An outreach program of the Louise McBee Institute of Higher Education at UGA for 25 years, GTF has represented more than 75 different disciplines, professions and teaching areas with over 600 fellows from more than 70 public and private statewide institutions.

Fellows are chosen to participate in an intensive summer symposium or the yearlong symposium that meets three days each month. Both are held at UGA.

Past symposiums addressed numerous themes, like using technology in the classroom and other pedagogical innovations. This year's summer symposium focuses on STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math)-related topics.

As fellows, Roman-Oliver and Ologunorisa will explore issues related to redesigning courses and learn about things like educational technology and assessment, conflict management,

law and ethics and the future of education.

Participants are selected based on their teaching experience, instructional and professional development and positive impact on campuses.

At Georgia College, Roman-Oliver teaches courses in the online Masters of Arts in Teaching (MAT) Secondary Education program. She's currently doing research with two other faculty, conducting a document analysis of the "Protect Students First Act." She's completing a proposal for a book and often incorporates social justice and culture into curriculum. As part of her work with the College Of Education's Diversity, Equity and Inclusion committee, she and her colleagues were awarded an Inclusive Excellence Faculty Research Grant to support the use of book clubs in promoting social justice.

Roman-Oliver is working to redesign the course, Secondary Science Pedagogy, for students who want to teach high school science. Her revision will help ensure MAT graduates are prepared to meet the needs of diverse learners in science classrooms. She's looking forward to learning innovative instructional strategies to enhance the courses she teaches.

"I believe this experience will help me grow as an educator in many areas," Roman-Oliver said. "My goal is to be more intentional about connecting my teaching with my research interests. I also want to be exposed to new technologies that can be integrated in online teaching, as well as non-traditional ways to assess students' learning."

At Georgia College, Ologunorisa teaches courses on Geographic Information Systems (GIS), geospatial science, landforms, remote sensing and global connections. She's currently working to help train students in piloting drones and asks all her students to volunteer four hours of service to the university or community.

After the May symposium, Ologunorisa will travel to Nigeria. She was recognized recently by the Institute of International Education and awarded by the Carnegie African Diaspora Fellowship Program to work with Osun State University in Osogbo, Nigeria (UNIOSUN). She'll collaborate on curriculum co-development in Digital Humanities and GIS, as well as mentor graduate students in GIS and remote sensing.

As a fellow, Ologunorisa hopes to redesign some of her courses to better prepare students to "meet contemporary environmental challenges in the fields of disaster management, crime mapping and hot spot assessment, traffic management, mineral exploration, land resources management, military and defense studies and homeland security, among others."

The redesign will positively impact student learning and success, she said, as well as improve her effectiveness as a teacher.

"I am confident that the evidence-based practices and inclusive teaching strategies that I will acquire in the Governor's Teaching Fellows Summer Symposium will prepare me to

redesign some courses as well as optimize the learning experience for students across all my classes," Ologunorisa said. "This fellowship would transform the way I have been teaching for more than ten years and take my teaching pedagogy to the next level for my 21st-century students."

Diversity 360 Series Event: Allyship in the Workplace

The Office of Inclusive Excellence's final Diversity 360 Series for the Spring semester is called "Allyship in the Workplace". The virtual workshop will be held on Wednesday, Apr. 19 at 3:30 p.m. Dr. Joanna Schwartz, Professor of Marketing from the College of Business and Technology, will be the facilitator.

When you hear the word "allyship", what do you think it is? While a majority of employees think of themselves as allies, research shows many employees don't know how to do it, or even know what it means. According to Deloitte's 2019 State of Inclusion Survey, while 92% of people already see themselves as allies in the workplace, only 29% say they actually speak up when they perceive bias, and 34% simply ignore it.

Being an ally at work means acknowledging your power and influence and using them to advocate for fairness and equity in the workplace. As an employee of GCSU, you have the ability to become an ally and help shape the actions and culture around you—thus fostering an environment that is respectful, inclusive, and supportive, and helps everyone have a secure sense of belonging.

"In the Media Studio" is a 45 minute long lecture and guest series with various media personalities from the broadcast, print, public relations, and other media backgrounds. The event is hosted by Professor Molly Wilkins, Lecturer in the Department of Communication at Georgia College & State University along with a guest student host. The event is produced by Professor Bill Burke, Keith Bergeron, and a team of communication students.

"In the Media Studio" takes its inspiration from the famed "Inside the Actors Studio" series.

Broadcast journalist Judy Woodruff is the Senior Correspondent for the PBS NewsHour, after serving for 11 years as its Anchor and Managing Editor. During 2023 and 2024, she is undertaking a reporting project, "America at a Crossroads," to better understand the country's political divide. She has covered politics and other news for more than four decades at CNN, NBC, and PBS.

The recipient of numerous awards, including the Peabody Journalistic Integrity Award, the Poynter Medal, an Emmy for Lifetime Achievement, and the Radcliffe Medal, she and the late Gwen Ifill were together awarded Arizona State University's Walter Cronkite Award for Excellence in Journalism after Woodruff and Ifill were named co-anchors of the PBS NewsHour in 2013, marking the first time an American national news broadcast would be co-anchored by two women.

For 12 years, Woodruff served as anchor and senior correspondent for CNN, where her

duties included anchoring the weekday program, Inside Politics. At PBS from 1983 to 1993, she was the chief Washington correspondent for The MacNeil/Lehrer NewsHour. From 1984-1990, she also anchored PBS' award-winning weekly documentary series, Frontline with Judy Woodruff. In 2011, Woodruff was the principal reporter for the PBS documentary Nancy Reagan: The Role of a Lifetime. And in 2007, she completed an extensive project for PBS and other news outlets on the views of young Americans called Generation Next: Speak Up. Be Heard.

In 2006, Woodruff was a visiting professor at Duke University's Terry Sanford Institute of Public Policy. In 2005, she was a visiting fellow at Harvard University's Joan Shorenstein Center on the Press, Politics and Public Policy. From 2006-2013, she anchored a monthly program for Bloomberg Television, Conversations with Judy Woodruff.

At NBC News, Woodruff was White House correspondent from 1977 to 1982. For one year after that she served as NBC's Today show chief Washington correspondent. She wrote the book, This is Judy Woodruff at the White House, published in 1982 by Addison-Wesley.

Woodruff is a founding co-chair of the International Women's Media Foundation, an organization dedicated to promoting and encouraging women in communication industries worldwide. She serves on the boards of trustees of the Freedom Forum and The Duke Endowment. Formerly she was a trustee of the Carnegie Corporation of New York and the Urban Institute, and a member of The Knight Foundation Commission on Intercollegiate Athletics.

We have a very exciting inaugural speaker, Catherine Coleman Flowers, a 2020 MacArthur genius fellow, who is internationally recognized for her work on environmental issues. Below you will find more discussion of her exciting work.

She is a 2020 MacArthur "genius" grant recipient, and an author. She has dedicated her life's work to advocating for environmental justice, primarily equal access to clean water and functional sanitation for communities across the United States.

She is the Founder of the <u>Center for Rural Enterprise and Environmental Justice</u> (CREEJ), and has spent her career promoting equal access to clean water, air, sanitation, and soil to reduce health and economic disparities in marginalized, rural communities.

Flowers is a Board Member for the Center for Earth Ethics at Union Theological Seminary, and sits on the Board of Directors for the Climate Reality Project and the Natural Resources Defense Council. Flowers is also Co-Chair of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences Commission on Accelerating Climate Action and Practitioner in Residence at Duke University.

She serves as the Vice Chair of the inaugural White House Environmental Justice Advisory Council. Flowers was also named Levenick Resident Scholar in Sustainable Leadership at the University of Illinois for the spring 2021 and was awarded an honorary PhD in science from Wesleyan University.

As the author of <u>Waste: One Woman's Fight Against America's Dirty Secret</u>, Flowers shares her inspiring story of advocacy, from childhood to environmental justice champion. She has been featured in The New York Times, The Washington Post, Bloomberg, The Guardian, and on PBS.



"In the Media Studio" is a 45 minute long lecture and guest series with various media personalities from the broadcast, print, public relations, and other media backgrounds. The event is hosted by Professor Molly Wilkins, Lecturer in the Department of Communication at Georgia College & State University along with a guest student host. The event is produced by Professor Bill Burke, Keith Bergeron, and a team of communication students.

"In the Media Studio" takes its inspiration from the famed "Inside the Actors Studio" series.

Broadcast journalist Judy Woodruff is the Senior Correspondent for the PBS NewsHour, after serving for 11 years as its Anchor and Managing Editor. During 2023 and 2024, she is undertaking a reporting project, "America at a Crossroads," to better understand the country's political divide. She has covered politics and other news for more than four decades at CNN, NBC, and PBS.

The recipient of numerous awards, including the Peabody Journalistic Integrity Award, the Poynter Medal, an Emmy for Lifetime Achievement, and the Radcliffe Medal, she and the late Gwen Ifill were together awarded Arizona State University's Walter Cronkite Award for Excellence in Journalism after Woodruff and Ifill were named co-anchors of the PBS NewsHour in 2013, marking the first time an American national news broadcast would be co-anchored by two women.

For 12 years, Woodruff served as anchor and senior correspondent for CNN, where her duties included anchoring the weekday program, Inside Politics. At PBS from 1983 to 1993, she was the chief Washington correspondent for The MacNeil/Lehrer NewsHour. From 1984-1990, she also anchored PBS' award-winning weekly documentary series, Frontline with Judy Woodruff. In 2011, Woodruff was the principal reporter for the PBS

documentary Nancy Reagan: The Role of a Lifetime. And in 2007, she completed an extensive project for PBS and other news outlets on the views of young Americans called Generation Next: Speak Up. Be Heard.

In 2006, Woodruff was a visiting professor at Duke University's Terry Sanford Institute of Public Policy. In 2005, she was a visiting fellow at Harvard University's Joan Shorenstein Center on the Press, Politics and Public Policy. From 2006-2013, she anchored a monthly program for Bloomberg Television, Conversations with Judy Woodruff.

At NBC News, Woodruff was White House correspondent from 1977 to 1982. For one year after that she served as NBC's Today show chief Washington correspondent. She wrote the book, This is Judy Woodruff at the White House, published in 1982 by Addison-Wesley.

Woodruff is a founding co-chair of the International Women's Media Foundation, an organization dedicated to promoting and encouraging women in communication industries worldwide. She serves on the boards of trustees of the Freedom Forum and The Duke Endowment. Formerly she was a trustee of the Carnegie Corporation of New York and the Urban Institute, and a member of The Knight Foundation Commission on Intercollegiate Athletics.



Requirements for Georgia College Programs Serving Minors

School of Continuing and Professional Studies: Friday April 14, 2023

Georgia College must ensure that all programs involving non-GC student minors (children ages 17 and under) follow the established policy and procedures concerning their protection.

When you choose to offer a program, course, or event where Georgia College assumes custody of the children, you as the Program Administrator are responsible for the safety and protection of the children, staff, and volunteers. You must agree to comply with Georgia College's written policy and procedures. Non-University organizations who operate programs or activities involving minors at Georgia College are also required to run consistent with our guidelines.

Georgia College has a Protection of Minors "one-stop" website that provides step-by-step guidance to assist all Georgia College supervisors and program administrators who offer programs for children. Anyone offering a program serving minors is required to thoroughly review and implement the information provided on this website.

GEORGIA COLLEGE PROTECTION OF MINORS WEBSITE (log in required)

Before offering an authorized program, the Program Administrator must register the program and gain the necessary approval to proceed. All ongoing programs and new programs must register their program on an annual basis. Program Administrator training is also required annually. Please visit the website to review all requirements and resources provided.

REGISTER YOUR PROGRAM (log in required)

There is no one centralized department for all Georgia College programs that work with children.

Born Digital: Artistic Production in the Age of ARPANET



Recent headlines suggest that applying computer algorithms to art is a recent development. While it may be hard to resist trying on the latest AI filter dominating your favorite social media application, the origins of computer-assisted and -generated art go back much further. Building upon a series of high-profile collaborations between artists and engineers during the 1960s, the 1970s witnessed a wildly fertile period of creativity that led choreographers, musicians, and visual artists to explore the possibilities of digital technologies. In this talk, you will learn about leading-edge forays into artistic production during the earliest days of the internet.

Alana Wolf-Johnson is an art historian, critic, and curator whose work examines how modern and contemporary artists express human perception and engage with technology. Most recently serving as the Utah Museum of Fine Arts' collections research curator, Dr. Wolf-Johnson has organized and curated exhibitions for the North Carolina Museum of Art, the Atlanta Contemporary, and the Ronald Rettner Hall for Media Arts and Innovation. She co-founded and served as artistic director for Public Acts of Art, a non-profit dedicated to arts education and exhibition in nontraditional venues, and her research has been sponsored by the National Endowment for the Arts and the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation. Presently writing for Southwest Contemporary magazine, Wolf-Johnson is preparing a book project that explores how art, technology, and countercultural movements intersected on North American college campuses in the 1970s. In 2021, Wolf-Johnson received her doctorate in Visual and Cultural Studies from the University of Rochester.





FY2023 Year-End Deadlines Approaching

Finance & Administration: Friday April 21, 2023

UPCOMING CRITICAL DEADLINES

The fiscal year-end is approaching, which means we must accurately account for the institution's financials before closing out the fiscal year on June 30, 2023. This includes ensuring that any funding that can possibly lapse (go back to the state) is accounted for properly. As a state entity, we are governed by certain purchasing policies and procedures, which include deadlines for purchases of varying dollar amounts. To ensure that expenditures are properly reported during the transition of fiscal years, we have deadlines for receiving transactional items. These deadlines, as listed below, are necessary to guarantee that transactions are properly executed and that our financials are appropriately reported.

CRITICAL DEADLINES

Purchase Order cutoff dates:

• May 1, 2023 – Requisitions up to \$25,000, state or agency contract purchases for any amount.

Project Requests and Purchases

e-Procurement will not allow requisitions to be entered after May 1, 2023. Requisitions
must be entered before 5 p.m. May 1, 2023, in order to be processed. Requisitions must
also be approved and have a valid budget check by the dates above in order to provide
adequate time for processing. If you have any questions concerning whether items are
non-contract or contract, please contact the Purchasing staff at 478-445-4458.

P-Card cutoff dates:

• May 26, 2023 – All P-Card transactions occurring between April 28, 2023, through May 27, 2023, must be allocated and signed off by cardholders and approvers in Works. P-Card purchases after this date will not be included in the FY2023 budget. This cutoff will help ensure that all transactions posted on or before this date are posted to your FY 2023 budgets. There may be circumstances where a transaction is delayed and does not post until after the above date. In those cases, the charge will be posted against your FY2024 budget. You can continue to use your card after the above date with the understanding that those charges will be posted against your FY2024 budget.

• June 9, 2023 – Signed P-Card statements with receipts and approvals are due in the Purchasing Department by 5 p.m.

Accounting Services cutoff dates:

- May 1, 2023 Last day to submit online check requests (i.e., registrations, memberships, direct billings for hotel/car rental, hotel prepayments, refunds, food items, Sodexo invoices, etc.), that are needed before July 14, 2022.
- June 9, 2023 All petty cash requests for reimbursements are due to Accounting Office by 5 p.m.
- June 16, 2023 Approved paper travel expense statements (for non-employee, encumbered or international travel) are due by 5 p.m.

Travel cutoff dates:

- May 1, 2023 Year End Travel Form (see attached)- This form is required for any travel within May 1, 2023 June 30, 2023, period for encumbrances purposes.
- June 14, 2023 –Last day to submit Online Travel for reimbursement. For questions on year-end travel, please call Omega Hedgepeth at 478-445-1178 or email her at omega.hedgepeth@gcsu.edu.

User Charges cutoff dates:

Temporary Employees (students, casual labor, hourly rehired retirees) will be posted to

Chemistry Professor wins 2023 COPLAC Award for impactful teaching

Dr. Catrena Lisse, chemistry professor and director of Georgia College & State University's <u>Science Education Center</u>, has won the 2023 <u>Charles Dunn Award</u> from the Council of Public Liberal Arts Colleges (<u>COPLAC</u>).

Dr. Eric Tenbus, dean of the <u>College of Arts & Sciences</u>, called the honor well-deserved, saying Lisse continues to be a "tremendous ambassador" for Georgia College.

"We're ecstatic for Dr. Lisse to have won the COPLAC's Dunn award," Tenbus said. "She fully represents the teacher-scholar model as a faculty member and has been a tireless proselytizer for science education throughout the region for many years."



"We are so pleased that she represents the College of Arts and Sciences in her interactions with the area's schools—whether running a statewide science fair or mentoring high school and possibly future GCSU students in our Young Scientists Academy in the summer," he said.

Along with the distinction, Lisse was given a \$500 cash prize.

The award is given in memory of the late Charles Dunn, former president of Henderson State University who appreciated the role faculty play in student success.

In giving Lisse the news, COPLAC Executive Director Cole Woodcox wrote: "Your work exemplifies the value of attending a place like Georgia College & State University. On behalf of the 30-member COPLAC Board of Directors, I wish to congratulate you on this recognition of your exceptional work to advance students' success at GCSU. Thank you for making a public liberal arts education so meaningful."

Lisse got her Ph.D. at Georgia Institute of Technology and has taught at Georgia College since 2002. She is heavily involved in undergraduate research and community outreach. Through programs like the annual Chemistry Fair, STEMing into the Community and Young Scientists Academy—Lisse works tirelessly to break down barriers that impede historically underrepresented groups from higher education and STEM-related fields.

Lisse made accessibility in STEM-related fields a priority at GCSU and within the community. She also participates in a Leadership Development Affinity Group, Women in Science, which provides professional support and networking to women in STEM. She has mentored more

than 60 undergraduate research students.

At Georgia College, Lisse also received the university's Inclusive Excellence Award and, more recently, the Bobcat Award for Outstanding Service to Students.



Writing for Success grant brings author Mary Carpenter to Milledgeville

O'Connor Institute: Tuesday April 25, 2023

Mary Carpenter, author of "Flannery O'Connor: A Girl Who Knew Her Own Mind" will visit Midway Hills Academy and Lakeview Academy for a two-week writing residency as part of the Writing for Success grant through the Andalusia Institute. The Writing for Success Grant is a 100% federally funded project that aims to increase reading,



writing, speaking and listening skills in the Milledgeville/Baldwin County community. The \$385,000 grant supports local educators in crafting a responsive 5th grade literacy curriculum by providing resources including text sets, classroom supplies, field trips, podcasting and GCSU mentor support. Project Director Dr. Jordan Cofer says, "We are very excited about hosting Ms. Carpenter. Her book has made O'Connor accessible to a whole new audience who will be able to enjoy and appreciate not just O'Connor's writing but the important contributions she has made in her life."

"Flannery O'Connor: A Girl Who Knew Her Own Mind" is the anchor text for the fourth unit of study for the 5th grade of Baldwin County Schools. This high-low text is about renowned American author, Flannery O'Connor: her rural southern upbringing, her relationship to race, her chronic lupus and her Catholic faith. Through her fiction, O'Connor became a role model for unconventional girls everywhere and for anyone who dreams of becoming a writer. High-low texts are written for readers with a high interest level and low reading skill level. Mary Carpenter has written three high-low texts, inspired by her son's struggle to find interesting books while learning to read.

Carpenter will visit with 5th grade students and teachers at both academies to discuss her writing process and answer questions. She'll lead students through a writing exercise and encourage them to find inspiration in the place they live, much like Flannery O'Connor was inspired by the sights, sounds and settings of Milledgeville during her time writing at Andalusia Farm in the 1950s and 1960s. Carpenter states, "Much of what I say about Flannery and my biography of her is connected to Georgia. Even after she was compelled at age 25, because of her lupus, to return to Georgia and to move back in with her mother, Flannery said, "The best of my writing has been done here." I'm looking forward to my own return to Milledgeville, to the places where Flannery lived and wrote most of her fiction -- and where so much of her life and work are preserved, at Andalusia and at Georgia College."

The community is invited to attend a Book Signing co-sponsored by Allied Arts and the

Andalusia Institute Wednesday, April 26 from 4 to 5 p.m. at the Marlor House and a Meet the Author event at Mary Vinson Memorial Library children's theater Thursday, April 27 at 4 p.m. Both events are free and open to the public.

Guidance & Clarification: Summer Schedule 2023

Human Resources, Office of : Tuesday April 25, 2023

In preparation for the start of the summer schedule, which is Monday – Thursday 8 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. and Friday 8 a.m. to 12:00 p.m., beginning on May 8 and continuing through August 4, 2023, the Office of Human Resources and Payroll Services has outlined important information for guidance and procedural awareness:

30-Minute Lunches

Supervisors have the flexibility to work with their staff to modify lunch breaks up to 1 hour, as needed. If an additional 30 minutes are approved for lunch:

- 1. The employee will be required to work an additional 30 minutes to ensure the required hours are worked for the day; the 30 minutes can be added to the beginning or the end of the scheduled workday.
- 2. The full 1-hour lunch break must be taken around the middle of the workday (ideally between 11 a.m. 2 p.m.); the additional 30 minutes for lunch may NOT be taken at the beginning or end of the workday to allow for a later arrival or earlier departure.

Working Beyond Summer Operational Hours (Noon on Fridays and Weekends)

Departmental authorities can modify employee schedules as deemed appropriate to ensure commitments are met. Every effort will be made to accommodate scheduling needs using flextime before using compensatory time or overtime when circumstances arise:

- Flextime: Modifications to work schedules should be requested by the employee and will be subject to approval by the supervisor and the VP of their respective area. See the attached document, Flextime Agreement for Summer 2023; this form must be completed for any employee requesting a modification to the standard summer hours. Any modifications to the standard summer work schedule must be documented in accordance with the Flextime, Compensatory Time and Overtime Policy.
- Compensatory time (comp time): Employees are prohibited from working any hours
 outside of the scheduled workday unless a supervisor has authorized the unscheduled
 work in advance in accordance with USG policy. Bi-weekly paid employees must
 maintain accurate time records in OneUSG and comply with the established policy
 above.
- 3. Overtime: Only certain departments have been pre-approved to work overtime should the need exist. All other departments should follow the guidelines outlined above related to flextime and compensatory time.

Work Schedules, Leave Requests and Holidays

- 1. All employees have work schedules within OneUSG. All work schedules will be changed by Payroll Services no later than May 5, 2023, to reflect the new summer work schedule. Any exceptions require a fully executed Flextime Agreement for Summer 2023 form on file with the Office of Human Resources, copied to Payroll Services.
- 1. Action item: Flextime Agreement for Summer 2023 forms must be submitted by all deadlines listed in the table at the end of the Flextime Agreement for Summer 2023 form to avoid inaccurate pay or leave balances.



Visiting author begins residency with Flannery O'Connor book event

O'Connor Institute: Wednesday April 26, 2023

Mary Carpenter, author of "Flannery O'Connor: A Girl Who Knew Her Own Mind" will visit Midway Hills Academy and Lakeview Academy for a two-week writing residency as part of the Writing for Success grant through the Andalusia Institute. The Writing for Success Grant is a 100% federally funded project that aims to increase reading,



writing, speaking and listening skills in the Milledgeville/Baldwin County community. The \$385,000 grant supports local educators in crafting a responsive 5th grade literacy curriculum by providing resources including text sets, classroom supplies, field trips, podcasting and GCSU mentor support. Project Director Dr. Jordan Cofer says, "We are very excited about hosting Ms. Carpenter. Her book has made O'Connor accessible to a whole new audience who will be able to enjoy and appreciate not just O'Connor's writing but the important contributions she has made in her life."

"Flannery O'Connor: A Girl Who Knew Her Own Mind" is the anchor text for the fourth unit of study for the 5th grade of Baldwin County Schools. This high-low text is about renowned American author, Flannery O'Connor: her rural southern upbringing, her relationship to race, her chronic lupus and her Catholic faith. Through her fiction, O'Connor became a role model for unconventional girls everywhere and for anyone who dreams of becoming a writer. High-low texts are written for readers with a high interest level and low reading skill level. Mary Carpenter has written three high-low texts, inspired by her son's struggle to find interesting books while learning to read.

Carpenter will visit with 5th grade students and teachers at both academies to discuss her writing process and answer questions. She'll lead students through a writing exercise and encourage them to find inspiration in the place they live, much like Flannery O'Connor was inspired by the sights, sounds and settings of Milledgeville during her time writing at Andalusia Farm in the 1950s and 1960s. Carpenter states, "Much of what I say about Flannery and my biography of her is connected to Georgia. Even after she was compelled at age 25, because of her lupus, to return to Georgia and to move back in with her mother, Flannery said, "The best of my writing has been done here." I'm looking forward to my own return to Milledgeville, to the places where Flannery lived and wrote most of her fiction -- and where so much of her life and work are preserved, at Andalusia and at Georgia College."

The community is invited to attend a Book Signing co-sponsored by Allied Arts and the Andalusia Institute Wednesday, April 26 from 4 to 5 p.m. at the Marlor House and a Meet the Author event at Mary Vinson Memorial Library children's theater Thursday, April 27 at 4 p.m. Both events are free and open to the public.

Junior Biology Major describes a new species

Biology & Environmental Sciences, Department of: Friday April 28, 2023

Junior Biology major Lizzie Durham and Assistant Professor Kris White have published a paper in an international journal. The work describes a new species of amphipod crustacean from Panama. This paper is the first of a series that will document the diversity of amphipods collected from Bocas del Toro, Panama.

Emergency Water Conservation Advisory

University Communications: Saturday April 29, 2023

Update: April 29, 2023, 6:18 p.m.

The City of Milledgeville has canceled the Boil Water Advisory issued on Friday, April 28.

City officials ask that water conservation efforts continue through Wednesday, May 3, when repairs to the high service pump at its water treatment facility are expected to be complete.

Georgia College & State University will continue normal operations throughout the week of Monday, May 1 through Friday, May 5. Final exams will continue as scheduled.

Thank you for your patience as the City of Milledgeville issued its emergency water conservation and boil water advisories.

Update: April 27, 2023, 4:36 p.m.

On Friday April 28, normal campus operations will resume for students, faculty and staff.

Although we are seeing improvements to the water pressure across campus, the City of Milledgeville is continuing to work on repairs to its water system and issued a boil water advisory notice earlier today. While the boil water advisory is in effect, we encourage everyone to be familiar with CDC Boil Water Advisory guidelines.

Georgia College continues to stay in close contact with the City of Milledgeville. The city's water officials are testing water samples to ensure the safety of the water supply before ending the boil water advisory, so we do not know how long it will be in effect. (In the past, the city's boil water advisories have lasted from 24 hours up to 72 hours.) Also, water conservation measures will remain in effect for today (Thursday) although we anticipate that they will be withdrawn when the city completes its portable pump installation. We will notify the campus community as soon as we learn more.

Bottled water is available for students who reside in on-campus housing at The MAX dining hall and on GCSU buses. Please make sure to have your Bobcat Card ready when picking up water.

Students who reside in off-campus housing are encouraged to take advantage of the water

<u>distribution site organized by the City of Milledgeville at the Baldwin County Government Annex building</u> not far from campus. We also encourage faculty and staff to bring bottled water to work tomorrow.

Due to the boil water advisory currently in effect, some of our dining operations need to be modified as follows:

- The MAX will remain open regular operating hours with a limited menu.
- Chick-fil-A and AFC Sushi will remain open during regular operating hours.
- The West Campus convenience store will remain open until midnight, but the Pizza Hut will not be able to serve pizza.
- All other retail dining locations will be closed until further notice.

As water pressure is restored across campus, please notify our Facilities Department at 478-445-4279 between 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. or contact your CA or Public Safety after business hours if you notice anything unusual related to our water infrastructure.

Update: April 27, 2023, 10:33 a.m.

Georgia College & State University will distribute bottled drinking water to residents of oncampus housing beginning at 11 a.m., today in the Max Dining Hall. Housing residents will need to present their Bobcat Card to receive bottled water.

Students who reside in off-campus housing are asked to utilize a water distribution center set up by the City of Milledgeville at the Baldwin County Government Annex building, located at 1601 N. Columbia Street.

Drinking water distribution at the city site began at 9:00 a.m., this morning, April 27, 2023.

Update: April 26, 2023, 6:16 p.m.

Milledgeville city officials have made some progress today in replacing valves in the water system, but have informed us that they do not expect significant improvement in the water pressure situation until the new pump arrives on Thursday from New Jersey and is installed as soon thereafter as possible.

Accordingly, the city has asked us as one of its top water users to support their ongoing conservation efforts by continuing to have as many employees work remotely as possible. We have monitored buildings all around campus, including West Campus, and have found the most impact on upper levels of multi-floor buildings where toilets/urinals may not flush well because of the low water pressure. Other toilets on campus are flushing but may refill very slowly. We have not had any reports of water outages, but should you encounter this issue please notify Facilities as soon as possible (students in residence halls should notify their CA's).

Given the urgency here at the end of the semester, we will again modify our operations on Thursday, April 27, as much as we can without disrupting the essential things that need to be wrapped up at this time of year. Specifically:

- All classes will meet as scheduled and all instructional personnel will report for normal schedules on Thursday, April 27.
- Non-instructional personnel who can work from home are encouraged to continue doing so on Thursday with the approval of your supervisors.
- If your supervisor has asked you to return to campus to work today, Wednesday, please plan to do so again on Thursday, April 27.

Sodexo continues to provide dining services as normal, and other parts of our campus are operating without interruption. We are all hopeful that this situation will be improved by late Thursday – but we will provide another update on Thursday as soon as we can get additional information from the city.

Update: April 25, 2023, 4:48 p.m.

Milledgeville city officials have advised us this afternoon that they have located a temporary pump to help remedy the current water pressure situation but it cannot be installed until Thursday at the earliest. Accordingly, GCSU campus operations will be modified on Wednesday, April 26, just as they were today.

Specifically, all classes will be held and all instructional personnel will report for normal schedules on Wednesday, April 26. Other non-instructional personnel who were notified to report to campus today (Tuesday) will need to report to work on Wednesday. If your supervisor notified you to work remotely or to remain off campus on Tuesday, you should do the same on Wednesday.

So far, our reports are that all parts of campus do have water, but some low-pressure issues have been reported. Sodexo has been able to maintain all dining operations, including scheduled special events, and we expect that library, transportation, dining, bookstore operations and scheduled athletic competitions will continue on normal schedules.

We will provide another update by mid-afternoon on Wednesday about Thursday conditions as we continue to be briefed by city officials.

Update: April 24, 2023, 11:16 p.m.

Georgia College & State University has been advised by City of Milledgeville officials that water system issues are likely to continue throughout the day tomorrow, Tuesday, April 25, resulting in low water pressure or no water in many downtown businesses in and around the campus. As a result, GCSU campus operations will need to be adjusted.

All classes will be held, and all instructional personnel will report for normal schedules on Tuesday. Other non-instructional personnel will hear from their supervisors tonight or early tomorrow about their need to report to campus or work remotely tomorrow. Library, transportation, dining and book-store operations will continue on normal schedules.

We will provide updates by mid-afternoon on Tuesday as we are briefed by the city that could impact campus events scheduled for Tuesday afternoon and evening. Look for further communications through Front Page and GC Alert from Public Safety.

Original Message from the City of Milledgeville

The City of Milledgeville has issued an emergency water conservation request for all customers served by the city's water and sewer utility. The city has determined that system-wide water conservation measures are needed at this time due to the system experiencing a motor failure with a high service pump at the city's water treatment facility. This issue may cause widespread water pressure loss.

While the emergency conservation notice is in effect, all water system customers are asked to please refrain from the following:

- No outside water use in any capacity or volume.
- No filling of swimming pools.
- No watering of gardens, lawns or washing cars. (Commercial car washes using recycling techniques may continue to operate.)

The Recommendation for indoor water conservation is as follows:

- Condense loads of laundry.
- Reduce showering times.
- Turn water off when brushing teeth or shaving.
- Make sure all faucets are turned off.
- Make sure dishwashers are full to minimize loads

Voluntarily following this conservation request will make it less probable that complete water pressure will be lost. This conservation request remains in effect until further notice by the City of Milledgeville. For more information, please visit the City of Milledgeville's website.
