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

Outdoor Emergency Notification System Test Wednesday, July 5

Public Safety : Wednesday July 5, 2023

Georgia College & State University will test the Outdoor Emergency Notification System (siren system) Wednesday, July 5, 2023. This test is scheduled to occur the first Wednesday of every month between 10 a.m. and noon and last approximately one minute. No action is required during the testing, and all campus operations should continue as normal. A message stating that this is a test will precede and follow the "alert" tone. In the case of an actual tornado warning, the message would advise of a tornado warning, and the tone would cycle through. This would be repeated every five minutes until the warning expires or is canceled, at which time an all clear message would sound. The audible system test will only be tested when clear sky conditions are present. Tests will not occur when skies are dark or severe weather is predicted for the area on the day the test is scheduled to occur. In this case, the test will be rescheduled for later in the month.

There are three sirens operated by GCSU in Baldwin County: one on West Campus and two on Main Campus.

This testing program is designed to maintain a reliable warning system and to meet recommended testing guidelines. Additionally, we want to maximize the effectiveness of the Outdoor Emergency Notification System. By performing these tests, we hope to enhance awareness and education regarding emergency preparedness at Georgia College and within the local community.

GCSU's Rural Studies Institute executive director lends expertise to CBS documentary on Black farmers

Dr. Veronica Womack, executive director of Georgia College & State University's Rural Studies Institute, was recently interviewed by CBS Reports and predominantly features in its new documentary "40 Acres and a Mule."



The piece aired Thursday, June 22, at 8 and 11 p.m. and is available for viewing at <u>cbsnews.com/land</u>.

Womack, a noted scholar of the rural South, was highlighted in the CBS piece that explores the ways Black Americans are reconnecting to their agrarian traditions, as well as developing ways to produce generational wealth through agriculture, land acquisition and ownership.

While America was residence to a small number of free Black people, most were held in chattel slavery, a system that began while America was a British colony and continued until 1865. Immediately after Emancipation, Black leaders voiced a desire for land and on January 16, 1865, General Sherman signed Field Order 15. It reserved 400,000 confiscated acres of land for newly emancipated Blacks near the Southeast coastal areas of South Carolina, Georgia and Florida.

The goal was to provide 40 acres of land, and in some cases, a U.S. Army mule. This plan became known as "40 acres and a mule." But the promise was short-lived and rescinded, as President Andrew Johnson revoked Field Order 15 and returned the confiscated land to its owners, immediately after taking office due to President Lincoln's assassination in April of 1865.

CBS reporter Skyler Henry—who formerly worked for 41NBC in Macon as multi-skilled journalist—interviewed Womack in May for the documentary. She's quoted as saying "Land has always been about freedom—political freedom, physical freedom, economic freedom."

Henry asks, "So, land is power?" Womack responds, "Most definitely."

The documentary explores Black agrarian traditions, the "Pigford" decisions—resulting from a class action lawsuit against USDA by Black farmers that affirmed discriminatory practices in loans and assistance by the agency from 1981 to 1996—as well as a history of violence and de facto and de jure discriminatory practices against Black farmers and landowners that resulted in a reported 326 billion dollars of lost Black American acreage.

The documentary also features prominent scholars like Georgia Historical Society President

Todd Groce, and Professor and MacArthur Fellow Thomas Mitchell of Boston College.

Herpetologist and students tracked snakes this summer on Jekyll Island

Dr. Dominic DeSantis, assistant professor of biology, and 12 students took their snake-sleuthing abilities to the coast this summer to get a better understanding of ways humans affect snake numbers on Jekyll Island.



The group collaborated with the Jekyll Island Authority to especially

study the movement ecology of Eastern Diamondback Rattlesnakes. Snakes have been individually tracked on the island for more than a decade. But DeSantis was asked to introduce his new technology that records where snakes go, when they strike, what they eat, how often they reproduce and how they interact.

The group placed tiny accelerometers on snakes to measure vibrations or changes in motion. It's important to observe rattlesnakes, because entire ecosystems can break down without them.

"Our overarching goal for this research is to understand the movement and foraging behaviors of snakes," DeSantis said. "This includes how ongoing habitat management efforts—such as prescribed burning, brush removal and habitat corridor construction—might alleviate negative effects of human development and activity on the island."

Students learned important skills, applying essential and emerging data collection techniques used in wildlife biology and natural resource jobs, like radio telemetry and accelerometry.

They were also exposed to the ongoing habitat restoration project at Jekyll Island, aimed at balancing the needs of human and wildlife populations. This gave students a real-life look at how many techniques discussed in class are used to achieve wildlife management goals.

High Demand Alert - Electricity Usage for 7/17

Georgia Power has issued a "day-ahead" Alert for today, 7/17 as higher temperatures result in peak electricity demand that significantly impacts pricing (pricing will rise to \$0.47 per kilowatt hour during this peak demand period). Judging from forecasted temperatures, we expect this status will persist throughout the week.

Subject to requirements of orientation and other campus operations, consider shutting down all non-essential lighting during the peak hours of 1 p.m. to 8 p.m. At your discretion, consider unplugging any equipment you deem non-essential. If you have access to windows, use the natural light. When not using natural light, close window blinds. Turn lights off when you leave your office. Keep temperature setpoints at 75 F or higher.



Psychology assistant professor co-writes biodiversity study on environmental behavior

Dr. Stephanie Jett, assistant professor of <u>psychology</u>, recently published a <u>study</u> with former co-workers from the University of South Alabama that examines human behavior towards the environment in the biodiverse coastal area of Mobile and Baldwin Counties, Alabama.

The Mobile-Tensaw Delta region is often referred to as <u>America's</u> <u>Amazon</u> due to the fact it's one of the nation's largest, intact



wilderness areas and wetland. The study, "Dominant attitudes and values toward wildlife and the environment in coastal Alabama," was recently posted by the <u>Society for Conservation</u> <u>Biology</u>.

Jett was the only psychologist, working alongside biologists and statisticians Sarah Weber Hertel, Jana Stupavsky, Kristine Alford, Hannah R. Hicks, Andrew Heaton, Nathan Katlein, Brandon T. Hasting, Adam Stern, Andrew Y. Wang, Bin Wang, Scott Glaberman and Ylenia Chiari.

"I was brought in because I was born and raised in Mobile," Jett said, "and they were interested in why people behave in a certain way towards the environment, which is the realm of psychology. They also wanted to create a survey measure, which is something that is also my area of expertise."

A hotspot for biodiversity, coastal Alabama has native plants and animals that are vulnerable and need protection, according to the authors. Land and wildlife management practices in that area don't focus on the environment. Land is often exploited for agriculture and plantation use.

"We therefore predicted that a large proportion of the population has a dominant view of the environment in which land and wildlife are primarily for human benefit," according to the study.

To test this hypothesis, the team surveyed more than 1,300 residents in Mobile and Baldwin Counties in Alabama. They wanted to discern attitudes toward local vertebrate wildlife, knowledge of the region's biodiversity and whether individuals value protected areas where they live and work.

Hunting was one aspect used to examine the relationship between humans and the environment. They discovered that hunters, overall, view land and wildlife for human benefit more so than non-hunters. Most survey participants indicated if they came across a snake,

they'd kill it regardless of whether it was venomous or not. This led the team to suggest environmental education was needed for the Southeast Alabama population in order to protect native snakes from unnecessary harm.

Hunters and non-hunters alike—regardless of income level and education—were also not familiar with the area's rich biodiversity or willing to invest money to protect the environment.

"Our results indicate that targeted education about the unique and rich biodiversity of Southern Alabama, compared to the rest of the United States, is needed to support successful environmental management, conservation actions and local participation," the study stated.

Jett is now planning a wider study to would include the work of students at Georgia College.

In the next few years, she hopes to tie this work in with another project her students did in 2019-20 on knowledge and attitudes toward sustainability. Students in the Jett's Experimental and Comparative Cognition lab used a variety of participants—including Georgia College peers—to conduct this survey. They found certain personality traits, like narcissism and conscientiousness, were related to different perceptions of sustainability and the importance of government policies being passed by to promote sustainability.

Students may add personality traits to the biodiversity study and expand the territorial area to include a wider, nationwide sample.

High Demand Alert - Electricity Usage for 7/18 - 7/21

Facilities Management : Tuesday July 18, 2023

Based on weather-driven forecasted demand across the regional power grid, peak hour pricing for main campus will remain elevated throughout this week, particularly during the peak hours of 1 p.m. to 8 p.m.

While orientation and other priority campus operations will take precedence, at your discretion, consider shutting down non-essential lighting and unplugging non-essential equipment as duty permits during these peak hours. Important Updates for GeorgiaVIEW

Significant changes are coming to Quizzes in GeorgiaVIEW! As of Friday, July 28, the following updates will be in effect:

- The New Quiz Creation Experience will be on by default, with no option to opt out. The layout is changing, but it closely matches the New Assignment and New Discussion tools.
- Major changes to the quiz timing options include:
 - The option to allow a grace period will no longer be available.
 - During quiz setup, instructors can choose to automatically submit a student's quiz attempt when the time limit expires.
 - Quiz Submission Views are now called Quiz Results. Additional "Views" can still be created as before.
 - Students will now be able to view the quiz description while in the quiz ("Quiz Information" link).
 - Students can choose to hide or show the timer count-down while taking a quiz.
 - Students will receive one-minute, five-minute and half-time warnings while taking a quiz.
 - Instructors now have the option to designate quizzes as synchronous or asynchronous.
 - A synchronous quiz will be available at the designated start time and last only for the time limit specified by the course instructor. Students who begin their attempt late will have only the amount of time remaining to complete the quiz. For example, if the time limit on a synchronous quiz is 30 minutes and scheduled to begin at 9 a.m., a student who begins their quiz attempt at 9:10 a.m. will only have 20 minutes to complete the quiz.
 - Asynchronous quizzes are similar to the current configuration in that a student will have the full time allotted to complete the quiz as long as the attempt begins within the availability specified by the instructor.
 - By default, new quizzes will be created as asynchronous unless an instructor changes that setting.
 - See <u>presentation</u> for more details on quiz timing changes. All three phases reviewed in the presentation will be live with this update.

In addition to the New Quiz Creation experience, the New Discussion Create and Edit experience will be on permanently.

Impact your teacher effectiveness ratings through the Objective Selection Form

Center for Teaching & Learning : Thursday July 27, 2023

The Objective Selection Form (OSF) is open for the summer 2023 semester and ends by the closing date of student surveys. The OSF allows faculty to identify targeted learning objectives to measure teaching effectiveness, and faculty response to the OSF drives summative results on the Student Rating of Instruction Survey (SRIS). The primary indicator of teaching effectiveness is how well students rate their progress on learning objectives that faculty mark as important or essential on the OSF. Since every course is different, this research-based, instructor-driven model interprets teaching effectiveness based on indicators identified by the instructor. Most instructors, familiar with their course learning objectives, decide and mark the OSF in 10 minutes or less per course.
