

GCSU Thirst for Knowledge: Georgia Adopt-a-Stream Chemical and Macroinvertebrate Trainings

Academic Outreach: Friday September 1, 2023

Through the GCSU Thirst for Knowledge Program, you can become Georgia Adopt-a-Stream certified in these upcoming trainings. Trainings will be offered Sept. 6 (9 a.m. - 12 p.m.: Chemical monitoring) (1 p. m. - 5 p.m.: Macroinvertebrate monitoring) at Lake Laurel Lodge and Sept. 8 (9 a.m. - 1 p.m.: Macroinvertebrate monitoring) (2 p.m. - 5 p.m. Chemical monitoring) at Andalusia Farm. Trainings certification is valid for 1 year.



The Chemical Monitoring Workshop is designed to teach volunteers about basic stream water chemistry and how to conduct various chemical tests using hand-held field equipment. The basic set of tests include dissolved oxygen, conductivity, pH, and temperature. Volunteers who collect data within 10% accuracy and pass the written test with a score of 80% or better will be certified to conduct chemical monitoring.

Stream macroinvertebrates (insects,mollusks, and crustaceans) are excellent indicators of the condition of both water quality and habitat. This workshop will focus on macroinvertebrate collection techniques and identification; in other words, catching cool animals! Volunteers who identify the macroinvertebrates with 90% accuracy and pass the written test with a score of 80% or better will be certified to conduct macroinvertebrate monitoring and can "adopt" a section of a local stream.

Students can satisfy CbEL requirements for GC Journeys through the GCSU Thirst for Knowledge Program.





Request for Proposals: Affordable Materials Grants Round 24

Ina Dillard Russell Library: Tuesday September 5, 2023

Affordable Learning Georgia, an initiative of the University System of Georgia focused on providing affordable course materials, recently released a Request for Proposals for Affordable Materials Grants. Applications are due by Oct. 30, 2023. Three types of grants are available:

Transformation Grants support individual instructors, teams of instructors and entire departments, along with supporting professional staff, in replacing their existing commercial textbooks and materials in a specific course with no- or low-cost-to-students learning materials. The maximum award for Transformation Grants is \$30,000.

Continuous Improvement Grants support projects that increase the sustainability of open educational resources through substantial revisions and the creation of new materials. The maximum award for Continuous Improvement Grants is \$10,000.

Research Grants (new category)

In order to learn more about how implementations of open resources affect various aspects of instruction and student outcomes, new research studying the impact of open educational resources and open pedagogy also qualifies through the same funding structure as a Continuous Improvement Grant project.

Interested faculty should review the attached timeline and return the Intent to Apply form to grants@gcsu.edu no later than Oct. 11, 2023.

Georgia College's Affordable Learning Georgia Champions Team is available to assist with building OER projects. The Office of Grants and Sponsored Projects is available to assist with budget preparation, application review, the grants acknowledgment form and application submission.

Georgia College & State University (GCSU) established the Women's Leadership Faculty Fellows Program in 2019 to provide a selected group of faculty and faculty in administrative positions with dedicated time to develop and hone leadership skills and gain a deeper understanding of the challenges and opportunities confronting higher education. The program will specifically focus on issues women face in academic administration.

- Two letters of recommendation; one of which needs to be from an immediate supervisor. Each recommendation letter is limited to one page in length.
- A current C.V. or résumé.

Outdoor Emergency Notification System Test Wednesday, Sept 6

Public Safety: Wednesday September 6, 2023

Georgia College & State University will test the Outdoor Emergency Notification System (siren system) Wednesday, Sept. 6, 2023. This test is scheduled to occur the first Wednesday of every month between 10 a.m. and noon and last approximately one minute. No action is required during the testing, and all campus operations should continue as normal. A message stating that this is a test will precede and follow the "alert" tone. In the case of an actual tornado warning, the message would advise of a tornado warning, and the tone would cycle through. This would be repeated every five minutes until the warning expires or is canceled, at which time an all clear message would sound. The audible system test will only be tested when clear sky conditions are present. Tests will not occur when skies are dark or severe weather is predicted for the area on the day the test is scheduled to occur. In this case, the test will be rescheduled for later in the month.

There are three sirens operated by GCSU in Baldwin County: one on West Campus and two on Main Campus.

This testing program is designed to maintain a reliable warning system and to meet recommended testing guidelines. Additionally, we want to maximize the effectiveness of the Outdoor Emergency Notification System. By performing these tests, we hope to enhance awareness and education regarding emergency preparedness at Georgia College and within the local community.







Dr. Joanna Schwartz honored for faculty award at USG gala

Dr. Joanna Schwartz, professor of <u>marketing</u> at <u>Georgia College & State</u> <u>University</u>, was honored Friday, Sept. 8, at the University System of Georgia Gala as a recipient of the <u>2023 Felton Jenkins Jr. Hall of Fame Faculty Award</u>

Schwartz joins a growing list of Georgia College faculty to win this prestigious award—five in the last six years.



Three of those faculty—Schwartz this year; Dr. Brooke Conaway, associate professor of economics in 2022; and Dr. Christopher Clark, professor of economics in 2019—teach in the <u>J. Whitney Bunting College of Business & Technology</u>. Dr. Hasitha Mahabaduge, associate professor of <u>physics</u>, won the award in 2020; and Dr. Betta Vice, former associate professor of <u>Secondary Education</u>, won in 2018.

"Professor Joanna Schwartz has done an outstanding job serving and mentoring our students through excellence in teaching," said Dr. Costas Spirou, provost and vice president of <u>Academic Affairs</u>. "It is also deeply gratifying that Georgia College faculty members have received this award five times during the past six years from the University System of Georgia – further demonstrating our intentional focus on student success."

The award is dedicated to Felton Jenkins Jr., who passed away in 2011 leaving a legacy of service to Georgia. He had a distinguished legal career and was appointed to the Board of Regents in 2006.

On the USG website, it says "Regent Jenkins was driven by a desire that every student in Georgia would have access to top-quality higher education. His focus was always on what was best for the students, and he understood keenly the connection between the success of the System's students and the success of the state of Georgia. Education, he knew, was the key to all of life's opportunities and possibilities."

Georgia's Gov. Brian Kemp gathered with USG officials at the gala to celebrate these extraordinary achievements of public higher education in the state. USG awards three Felton Jenkins Jr. Hall of Fame Faculty Awards each year to recognize faculty with a strong commitment to teaching and student success.

For her award, Schwartz was honored for outstanding teaching at the state university level. She was recognized for her ability to create original coursework, integrate real-world experiences in her classes, offer stellar research opportunities and generate partnerships with off-campus organizations.

She was also praised for her ability to make students feel valued.

"It was an incredible honor for the Board of Regents to find my work deserving of this award," Schwartz said. "Attending the gala and getting this recognition was a remarkable experience and easily one of the highlights of my career in academia."

"I really want to emphasize how much it means to me and how much I appreciate the support and encouragement I've received from our leadership team, from my college and from all of my peer faculty and my students," she said, "who all inspire me to be better every day."

The gala supports need-based scholarships for more than 340,000 students who attend 26 public colleges and universities of the University System of Georgia. Its mission is to advance the work of the University System of Georgia through leadership, engagement in philanthropy, asset management and institutional advancement.







Over the 2023 Labor Day Holiday weekend, students from Dr. Pascoe's "Southern Foodways and Traditions" course and Dr. Welborn's "Southern Pitmastery: History of Race and BBQ in the U.S. Civil War Era" course participated in a service-learning activity at the local non-profit Comfort Farms in Milledgeville, GA. Students provided volunteer staff assistance for the annual "Q for the Few Backyard Barbecue Competition" hosted by Jon Jackson of Comfort Farms. Some students got the opportunity to judge the BBQ competition. John Gilley, a junior history major, served as one of the 12 judges and said that it was an "awesome experience."

Both courses are part of the Global Foodways Studies Program in the Department of History & Geography at Georgia College & State University. This is an interdisciplinary undergraduate certificate program that focuses on patterns of food production, distribution, consumption and associated cultural meanings to enable students to better understand history, society and culture in the past and present as they look toward the future. Service-learning opportunities, such as this event and other experiential learning experiences, are an essential part of the program curriculum in all foodways courses.

Comfort Farms is the nation's first Acute Veterans Crisis Agriculture center. It prepares veterans and students for careers in sustainable food production that integrates economic profitability, environmental stewardship and healing through the use of a model of Agro-Cognitive Behavioral Therapy and organic holistic approaches. The farm serves veterans in acute situations where time and help are critical. Comfort Farms provides shelter and peer-to-peer therapy to veterans and their families so that they can regain strength and re-boot for everyday life. With the support of the USDA through agricultural grants, Comfort Farms has provided services to several hundred veterans and their families.

On Tuesday, 19 September 2023, at 5 p.m, Georgia College & State University Leadership Programs will host Peggy H. Walker, senior judge of Douglas County, Georgia. The event will mark the first in the Usery Forum on Leadership series of the 2023-24 academic year.

Senior Judge Peggy H. Walker served as the Chief Juvenile Court judge in Douglas County from 1998 to 2019. Since her retirement, Walker has been tapped by the American Bar Association to provide mentorship to judges in the Republic of Georgia, specifically focused on the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child.

Walker served as president of the National Council of Juvenile and Family Court Judges in 2015. She was a Harris fellow of Zero to three Class of 2005 and a senior fellow at Emory University in 2008. She served as chair of the Georgia Commission on Family Violence for two years and served six years on the commission, leading the effort to draft a state plan to end domestic violence. She currently serves on the Advisory Group for Safe Babies Infant and Toddler Courts for the State of Georgia. Walker graduated from Georgia College with honors, earning a Bachelor of Arts degree in political science and education. She attended Georgia State University and earned a master's degree in education and J.D. with honors.

"We are delighted and honored to welcome Judge Peggy Walker back to her alma mater," says Dr. Harold Mock, director of leadership programs. Judge Walker represents the best of Georgia College's commitment to leadership for the public good."

The Learning Center is accepting requests for Supplemental Instruction support for spring semester 2024. Individual faculty members or departments may request this direct academic support service for the students enrolled in their course(s). The Learning Center will support a number of student Supplemental Instruction Leader (SI) positions for spring 2024 using the peer-led Supplemental Instruction model:

SIs are undergraduate students assigned to a section(s) of particular, often introductory, courses. A primary goal of the SI program is to increase enrolled students' successful completion of historically difficult classes. SIs attend all class meetings, take notes, coordinate with faculty as needed and serve as models to those students currently enrolled in the section. The SIs lead regular, peer-facilitated study sessions, outside of class time, to discuss course concepts, review or practice material and help strengthen students' study skills. SI Leaders host peer collaborative learning experiences which also promote skills. SIs provide peer collaborative learning experiences which also promote involvement and inclusion into our culture of learning.

As undergraduates, Supplemental Instruction Leaders are not responsible for grading course work, preparing exams, teaching new material or assigning grades. These responsibilities belong only to the faculty or graduate assistants who are hired by the university to teach the course and who are listed as the instructor of record. It's time to plan for SIs for the upcoming spring semester. If you would like to request SI/PASS support for sections in your department or have your faculty members make a direct request, please submit requests via the following online Qualtrics form by COB, Friday Sept. 22. We realize this is a rapid turn-around but would like additional time for recruiting an excellent pool of student candidates.

The Learning Center will continue to hire, train and supervise SI Leaders, as well as survey faculty partners and the participants at the end of the semester. Allocation decisions will be announced to recipient departments on or about Sept. 25, allowing time for us to recruit, collaborate and identify candidates for the best matches for our SI Leaders. We will partner with you in identifying SI Leaders this month and until mid-October. Outdoor Emergency Notification System Test Thursday, Sept. 21

Public Safety: Thursday September 21, 2023

Georgia College & State University will test the Outdoor Emergency Notification System (siren system) Thursday, Sept. 21 2023. This test is scheduled to occur the first Wednesday of every month between 10 a.m. and noon and will last approximately one minute. No action is required during the testing, and all campus operations should continue as normal. A message stating that this is a test will precede and follow the "alert" tone. In the case of an actual tornado warning, the message would advise of a tornado warning, and the tone would cycle through. This would be repeated every five minutes until the warning expires or is canceled, at which time an all clear message would sound. The audible system test will only be tested when clear sky conditions are present. Tests will not occur when skies are dark or severe weather is predicted for the area on the day the test is scheduled to occur. In this case, the test will be rescheduled for later in the month.

There are three sirens operated by GCSU in Baldwin County: one on West Campus and two on Main Campus.

This testing program is designed to maintain a reliable warning system and to meet recommended testing guidelines. Additionally, we want to maximize the effectiveness of the Outdoor Emergency Notification System. By performing these tests, we hope to enhance awareness and education regarding emergency preparedness at Georgia College and within the local community.

Professor Craig Pascoe of the History & Geography Department has been appointed to the Georgia National Register Review Board of the National Register of Historic Places. The National Register of Historic Places is the nation's official list of historic properties that are worthy of preservation. Properties listed in the National Register include buildings, sites, structures, objects and districts that are significant in American history, architecture, archaeology, engineering and culture. The National Register of Historic Places is managed at the federal level by the National Park Service but each state has their own agency administering the National Register of Historic Places. In Georgia, the National Register of Historic Places program is administered by the Historic Preservation Division (HPD) of the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO). The review board is comprised of "a body whose members represent the professional fields of American history, architectural history, historic architecture, prehistoric and historic archaeology and other professional disciplines and may include citizen members." The Georgia Review Board is responsible for reviewing and commenting on the National Register eligibility of all propose National Register nominations before they are submitted by the Georgia Historic Preservation Division to the National Park Service.

Greetings Georgia College & State University Community:

In accordance with the Georgia Open Records Act, Georgia College follows the <u>Board of Regents Policy on Employee Personnel Records.</u>

Please click the following link to review the Georgia Open Records Act O.C.G.A. § 50-18-70, -74 (2021).

In the course of your duties at GCSU, you may receive an open records request. If you do, whether verbal or written, please direct it to the Office of Legal Affairs where we will then take it from there. If you would like copies of public records, as allowed under the Act, please submit an Open Records Request via the online submission form.

The Georgia Open Records Act requires that public records be open and available for review by any member of the public whether they are a Georgia citizen or not. The vast majority of documents in the possession of University personnel must be made available under the Open Records Act. These documents include for example:

- student evaluations of academic courses;
- personnel files of all employees (excluding Social Security numbers, medical information or information relating to the designation of beneficiaries);
- employee performance evaluations;
- · any email sent or received relate to work matters;
- hand-written notes;
- videotapes; and photographs.
- Records held by private persons for a state agency, and records held away from the work site, are also subject to the Open Records Act.

It is important to note that any work-related records (writings, pictures, videos, etc.) that you store on your devices can be subject to public disclosure. Please keep this in mind when saving records. Please also do not delete any work related records unless doing so follows USG records retention schedules. 

New trends in phishing and scams

Information Technology: Monday September 25, 2023

GCSU Information Security would like to make you aware of a few new trends in phishing and scams that we're seeing frequently on campus.

Many GCSU employees are receiving texts on their personal cell phones that state that they're from either the president, the provost or one of the deans at GCSU. Please look carefully at these before responding. The numbers are never local, and for most of us, it's highly unlikely that we'd receive a text from this person.

This is just one of the many scams directed to your personal cell phone so that the scammer can bypass all of our security layers and practices on campus.

Another new trend is for scammers to send QR codes that you'll use on your phone to do something; again bypassing all of our security layers and practices. Look carefully at the sender. Lately, many of these are coming in from Japan and purport to be from Microsoft, Apple or GCSU.

When in doubt, if it's email, please route it through Phish Alert. If you can't, please forward the potential threat to iso@gcsu.edu and we'll look at it as soon as we can.



Dr. Elliott-Gower named higher education ambassador for Council on Foreign Relations

Dr. Steve Elliott-Gower, associate professor of <u>political science</u>, is one of more than 70 college professors in North America invited to become a 2023-24 <u>CFR Higher Education Ambassador</u> through the <u>Council on Foreign Relations</u> (CFR).

The nine-month professional development initiative is designed to promote global literacy among undergraduate students through engaging, creative materials and pedagogies. The ambassadors are "educators committed to equipping students with the knowledge, skills and perspective to navigate today's connected world," according to the CFR website.



"I'm honored to be selected for this program." Elliott-Gower said. "It's a great opportunity to network with other college professors who share a commitment to global education."

Elliott-Gower has taught at Georgia College & State University for 14 years and been associated with the CFR for 10 years. He often uses the Council's <u>World 101</u> and <u>Model Diplomacy</u> tools in his global issues, foreign policy, and national and international security classes.

Model Diplomacy is a role-playing simulation exercise in which students play members of the U.S. National Security Council or United Nations Security Council. They debate pressing security issues using real scenarios and case studies.

World 101 provides high school and college materials to educators who champion global affairs in their curriculum. CFR materials also include games, interactive maps, video, infographics, quizzes, discussion guides and other online resources that help make complex international topics easier to understand.

Ambassadors participate in monthly meetings which include focus groups and briefings from CFR foreign relations experts. Ambassadors also share their experience in using CFR's educational tools.

Elliott-Gower looks forward to participating in professional development opportunities with CFR. He'll be able to help shape educational products for World 101, Model Diplomacy and iCivics' Convene the Council. He'll also have the opportunity to exchange ideas in CFR's email, blogs, and social media.

"I've always enjoyed teaching international relations," says Elliott-Gower, "but being a part of a teaching and learning community like the CFR Ambassadors gives that teaching new meaning—a sense of being a part of a bigger national and international effort."

The Council on Foreign Relations is an American think tank specializing in U.S. foreign policy and international relations. Founded in 1921, it is an independent and nonpartisan nonprofit organization.



For National Forensics Week, <u>Georgia College & State University</u> is hosting two science nights filled with information and forensic fun for the community to enjoy—a Science Café Wednesday, Sept. 27, and Forensics Night Thursday, Sept. 28.

Dr. Catrena Lisse, director of the university's <u>Science Education Center</u>, will give an interactive presentation called "Molecules of Murder: A Glimpse into Forensic Chemistry" at 6:30 p.m. Wednesday in the Birdhouse of Blackbird Coffee in Milledgeville.

The STEM Club wanted to center their kickoff Science Café around the professor's advanced research course "Molecules of Murder."

"The purpose of a Science Café is to learn about something scientific in a relaxing, non-intimidating environment," Lisse said. "This month we had the opportunity to combine the Science Café with Forensics Night, and we are excited to bring our community another crime to solve with Thunder."

Thunder is the Georgia College's Bobcat mascot, who needs help cracking a 'whodunit' crime mystery. Forensics Night, 5 to 8 p.m. Thursday, is for all ages and open to the public. The evening is a hands-on opportunity for ordinary folks to play Crime Scene Investigators (CSI), like their favorite detectives on TV.

This year, someone has used counterfeit money at a local hardware store to buy suspicious materials that could be used dangerously. Thunder and his CSI pals have only hours to prevent a possible catastrophe.

In Herty Hall, room 354, participants will be given a badge and investigator materials. They'll collect and process evidence in the forensics lab, analyze data and help Thunder determine the culprit and who to arrest.

Hosted by the university's Science Education Center and Chemistry Club, Forensics Night was partly designed by students in the Forensics capstone course. About 30 students will be on hand that night to help participants solve the crime.

"It's important to share our love of science and engage with our local community," Lisse said. "This is an opportunity to showcase real-world science in a fun way—everyone loves solving mysteries."
