



Chair of Chemistry, Physics and Astronomy publishes scholarly article with two students

Chemistry, Physics, & Astronomy, Department of: Monday October 2, 2023

Dr. Sayo Fakayode, chair of Georgia College & State University's <u>Department of Chemistry, Physics and Astronomy</u>, is pleased to announce the publication of a study he conducted with four other scientists, including two of his research students.

The new publication is called "Rapid Screening and Multicomponent Quantifications of Active Components of Oral Syrup Over-the-Counter Medications by Raman and UV-visible Spectroscopy and Multivariate Regression Analysis."



"When undergraduates present their finding at national conferences and co-author studies in high-impact journals, such as "Spectrochemical Acta Part A. Molecular and Biomolecular Spectroscopy," Fakayode said, "It's a testament to the quality of research we are doing at Georgia College."

"This experience also opens the doors of opportunity for our students, promoting their professional development and personal growth," he said.

Other co-authors were Kairy Galvez and Harmeet Chohan, undergraduate students who studied under Fakayode at the University of Arkansas, Fort Smith. Galvez now attends a Physician Assistant school, and Chohan is currently in a Ph.D. program at Purdue University.

The group's goal was to develop portable, low-cost, accurate rapid screening to evaluate the integrity of Oral Syrup Over-the-Counter Medications using simple Raman and a UV-visible spectrometer.

The study provides an example of the benefits of using Raman and UV-visible spectral profiling and chemometric approaches, Fakayode said. These include principal component and regression analysis for examination of oral syrups and over-the-counter medications. It also provides a multicomponent count of active ingredients without using sample extraction.

In addition, Fakayode said the method can be easily adapted and scaled for online detection analysis used in the drug manufacturing industry—both in-lab and field analysis—and for the

quality control of syrups and over-the-counter medications regulated by agencies and quality control officers.

"Over-the-counter medications are frequently recommended as a first-line treatment for common ailments, diseases and illnesses," Fakayode said. "Although the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) provides strict guidelines to drug manufacturers of these products, the risk of counterfeiting is a global issue."

"Drug counterfeiting can lead to several adverse effects and health issues," he said.
"Counterfeiting also infringes on intellectual property rights, which can lead to harmful financial implications for drug manufacturers, thereby causing a snowball effect on international trade and transactions."



FEMA and FCC plan nationwide Emergency Alert Test for Oct. 4, 2023

University Communications: Tuesday October 3, 2023

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and Federal Communications Commission (FCC) will conduct a nationwide test of the Emergency Alert System (EAS) and Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA) Wednesday, Oct. 4, at 2:20 p.m. Test messages will be sent to all TVs, radios and cell phones.

The EAS portion of the test is scheduled to last one minute. It'll be done with the participation of radio and television broadcasters, cable systems, satellite radio and television providers and wireline video providers.

The WEA portion will last approximately 30 minutes. Cell towers will broadcast the test. All wireless phones should receive the message only once.

In case the Oct. 4 test is postponed due to widespread severe weather or other significant events, the back-up testing date is Oct. 11.

Outdoor Emergency Notification System Test Wednesday, Oct. 4

Public Safety: Wednesday October 4, 2023

Georgia College & State University will test the Outdoor Emergency Notification System (siren system) Wednesday, Oct. 4, 2023. This test is scheduled to occur the first Wednesday of every month between 10 a.m. and noon and last approximately one minute. No action is required during the testing, and all campus operations should continue as normal. A message stating that this is a test will precede and follow the "alert" tone. In the case of an actual tornado warning, the message would advise of a tornado warning, and the tone would cycle through. This would be repeated every five minutes until the warning expires or is canceled, at which time an all clear message would sound. The audible system test will only be tested when clear sky conditions are present. Tests will not occur when skies are dark or severe weather is predicted for the area on the day the test is scheduled to occur. In this case, the test will be rescheduled for later in the month.

There are three sirens operated by GCSU in Baldwin County: one on West Campus and two on Main Campus.

This testing program is designed to maintain a reliable warning system and to meet recommended testing guidelines. Additionally, we want to maximize the effectiveness of the Outdoor Emergency Notification System. By performing these tests, we hope to enhance awareness and education regarding emergency preparedness at Georgia College and within the local community.

Affordable Learning Georgia, an initiative of the University System of Georgia focused on providing affordable course materials, recently released a Request for Proposals for Affordable Materials Grants. Applications are due by Oct. 30, 2023. Three types of grants are available:

Transformation Grants support individual instructors, teams of instructors and entire departments, along with supporting professional staff, in replacing their existing commercial textbooks and materials in a specific course with no- or low-cost-to-students learning materials. The maximum award for Transformation Grants is \$30,000.

Continuous Improvement Grants support projects that increase the sustainability of open educational resources through substantial revisions and the creation of new materials. The maximum award for Continuous Improvement Grants is \$10,000.

Research Grants (new category)

In order to learn more about how implementations of open resources affect various aspects of instruction and student outcomes, new research studying the impact of open educational resources and open pedagogy also qualifies through the same funding structure as a Continuous Improvement Grant project.

GCSU Thirst for Knowledge: Georgia Adopt-a-Stream Chemical and Macroinvertebrate Trainings

Academic Outreach: Wednesday October 11, 2023

Through the Georgia College & State University Thirst for Knowledge Program, you can become Georgia Adopt-a-Stream certified in these upcoming trainings. the Macroinvertebrate Training will be offered Friday, Oct. 13, from 1 p.m. until 5 p.m. at Lake Laurel Lodge (Register here: https://givepul.se/qel9d6). The Chemical training will be Saturday, Oct. 21, from 9 a.m. until 12 p.m. (Register here: https://givepul.se/qel9d6). Trainings certification is valid for one year.

Stream macroinvertebrates (insects,mollusks and crustaceans) are excellent indicators of the condition of both water quality and habitat. This workshop will focus on macroinvertebrate collection techniques and identification; in other words, catching cool animals. Volunteers who identify the macroinvertebrates with 90% accuracy and pass the written test with a score of 80% or better will be certified to conduct macroinvertebrate monitoring and can "adopt" a section of a local stream.

The Chemical Monitoring Workshop is designed to teach volunteers about basic stream water chemistry and how to conduct various chemical tests using hand-held field equipment. The basic set of tests include dissolved oxygen, conductivity, pH and temperature. Volunteers who collect data within 10% accuracy and pass the written test with a score of 80% or better will be certified to conduct chemical monitoring.

Students can satisfy CbEL requirements for GC Journeys through the GCSU Thirst for Knowledge Program, and the trainings are open to all.







Critical Language Scholarship Information Session

National Scholarships Office at Georgia College: Thursday October 12, 2023

The National Scholarships Office will host an information session on the Critical Language Scholarship Monday Oct. 16 at 5 p.m. in the Humber-White House.

The CLS Program is a funded program sponsored by the U.S. Department of State that provides overseas language and cultural immersion to U.S. students enrolled in all degree programs. The CLS Program offers two options for students to study critical languages either overseas (CLS Program) or at home, through CLS Spark, a virtual initiative for Russian, Arabic and Chinese.

Through the CLS Program, students spend eight to 10 weeks abroad studying one of 13 critical languages (https://clscholarship.org/languages) and earn academic credit for their work. The scholarship includes travel expenses, coursework, group excursions and even a small stipend to cover daily living expenses. Most languages offered by the CLS Program do not require applicants to have any prior experience studying critical languages.

CLS Spark, provides opportunities for American undergraduate students to study Arabic, Chinese and Russian at the beginning level through virtual language and cultural programming. CLS Spark provides the opportunity to study critical languages for students who may not have access to critical languages on their campus or the ability to study abroad.

The CLS Program seeks participants with diverse interests and from a wide range of fields of study and career paths. Students from all academic disciplines including business, engineering, law, medicine, science, social sciences, arts and humanities are encouraged to apply.





Georgia College & State University's Chemistry Department and Science Education Center will hold its biggest celebration of the year —a free Family Fun Night filled with hands-on science activities from 5 to 8 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 19, at Herty Hall.



Family Fun Night is part of National Chemistry Week (NCW), a community-based program of the American Chemical Society (ACS). Its goal is to promote the importance of chemistry for quality of life.

This year's theme, "The Healing Power of Chemistry," highlights how chemistry is used in our everyday lives—especially in the healthcare field. To show this, GCSU's Science Education Center is partnering with the School of Nursing. Five nursing students and nursing faculty Talecia Warren will demonstrate the significance of chemistry for nurses in a healthcare-themed lab in Herty Hall.

"Last year, we welcomed over 400 people to campus for Family Fun Night," said Dr. Catrena Lisse, professor of chemistry and director of the Science Education Center.

"We love showing the community how fun science can be" Lisse said. "I believe this event is so popular each year because it is free, educational and fun for all ages."





New wireless networks for campus – Action needed before Nov. 1

Information Technology: Monday October 16, 2023

We shared earlier this month that Information Technology rolled out a new set of wireless networks for campus. The new campus wireless networks are Bobcats, Bobcat Guests and Bobcat Devices. The new campus wireless networks are currently available in parallel with GC_Secure and GC_Guest until Nov. 1.

- Bobcats will take the place of GC_Secure and will be used by students, faculty and staff. You will use your GCSU credentials to sign in to the network just as you do for GC_Secure.
- Bobcat Guests will take the place of GC_Guest and is used by guests of the campus who do not have GCSU credentials. A user is prompted to create an account just like GC_Guest does.
- Bobcat Devices is the new network used by devices that cannot sign in to the Bobcats network. Currently these devices are on the GC_Guest network. Devices on campus such as Apple TVs, Rokus, smart TVs, and others will need a manual intervention to move them over to the Bobcat Devices wireless network. Please go ahead and do this now. The devices will not work if this is not done before the Nov. 1 cutoff date. Please submit an IT Help Desk ticket at https://AskIT.gcsu.edu or call 478-445-7378 if you need assistance with moving devices over.



The Objective Selection Form (OSF) opens today, Oct. 17, for the fall 2023 semester through Dec. 11. The OSF allows faculty to identify targeted learning objectives to measure teaching effectiveness and faculty response to the OSF drives summative results on the Student Rating of Instruction Survey (SRIS). The primary indicator of teaching effectiveness is how well students rate their progress on learning objectives that faculty mark as important or essential on the OSF. Since every course is different, this research-based, instructor-driven model interprets teaching effectiveness based on indicators identified by the instructor. Most instructors, familiar with their course learning objectives, decide and mark the OSF in 10 minutes or less per course.





Shared Sick Leave Program: Enrollment open Oct. 23 - Nov. 3

Human Resources, Office of : Monday October 23, 2023

The Annual Shared Sick Leave Program Enrollment Window will be open Monday, Oct. 23, 2023 through Friday, Nov. 3, 2023 for participation effective Jan. 1, 2024.

All interested participants, should complete and submit the Shared Sick Leave Enrollment Form to Employee Relations at employeerelations@gcsu.edu by 5 p.m. Friday, Nov. 3, 2023. Please submit all enrollment forms via email. Please do not send enrollment forms via interoffice mail.

Participation in the program is voluntary, but employees must give in order to receive.

Only employees who have voluntarily enrolled in the Shared Sick Leave Program after meeting all of the eligibility requirements outlined within the applicable USG policy are eligible to become Shared Sick Leave Program recipients. Enrollment is only open during the annual open enrollment period, barring any exceptions outlined within the applicable USG policy.

Eligibility for Enrollment (during USG Benefits Open Enrollment Period):

- Must be a regular, benefits eligible employee who has completed their provisional period (six month probationary period), and
- Must contribute a minimum of eight (8) hours sick leave (prorated based on FTE) up to 80 hours, and
- Must have a minimum of forty (40) hours of sick leave remaining after their donation at the time of enrollment.

Note:

- Initial Enrollment: At the time of initial enrollment, employee must have a minimum of 48 hours sick leave, of which eight hours will be deducted and added to the leave pool.
- Re-Enrollment: Those members who were granted sick leave from the shared sick leave pool in 2023 must submit a new enrollment form in order to participate in 2024.
- Special Enrollment: When the program is determined to be depleted (120 hours or less remaining balance) a "special enrollment period" will be conducted with an appeal to the Georgia College community at large to donate sick leave. Each member will be notified in writing that and additional (8) eight hours will be deducted from their sick leave

balance.

- Current members: No action required; you will automatically be enrolled into the program for 2024 unless you request to terminate your membership.
- Terminate membership: An employee may terminate their membership at any time by completing and submitting the Shared Sick Leave Program Termination Form. Any leave contributed to the pool prior to withdrawal from the program shall be forfeited.

Open Enrollment begins today and will last until Nov. 3, 2023. This is the time of year for you to review your current health coverage, review any changes to plans since last year and make your elections for calendar year 2024. Details can be found at the USG Benefits website or employees can register to attend a presentation virtual and in-person options available with Georgia College & State University's Benefits Team; these presentations typically last 30-45 minutes.

This is an active open enrollment, so this year everyone is encouraged to review and take action on the following:

- Certification questions (tobacco & working spouse): Be sure to answer all applicable certification questions; failure to do so will result in default surcharges of \$150 per month, up to \$600 per month total based on your covered dependents and/or spouse.
- FSA if you elected to contribute to a Flexible Spending Account for 2023, you must reenroll for 2024. The FSA is one of the few plans that will not automatically rollover year to year.
- Beneficiaries nobody wants to talk about beneficiaries or the potential to ever need to make sure they're in place, but while you're reviewing your information, take a few moments to ensure you have a beneficiary, or beneficiaries, setup for the basic life insurance you are offered through the USG, any supplemental life insurance you may elect, your mandatory retirement plan (TRS or ORP) any supplemental life insurance plan(s) you elect [403(b) and/or 457(b)] and your Health Savings Account if you contribute to the Consumer Choice HSA/high deductible health plan.

GCSU Benefits will be set up in the Library, room 302 during Open Enrollment to offer assistance with enrollment and/or to answer employee questions on the following dates from 11 a.m. until 1 p.m.:

- Monday, Oct. 23
- Wednesday, Oct. 25
- Friday, Oct. 27



- Adobe Express (formerly Adobe Spark) This license is the default for all faculty, staff
 and students. It is a web-based, template-driven approach that is designed to compete
 with products like Canva. It contains the basics of several of the main Adobe products –
 Acrobat, Photoshop, Lightroom, Illustrator, etc. IT recommends that you start with
 Express for your Adobe needs, as it works great for social media posts, basic PDFs,
 flyers or posters, newsletters, videos, and images. If you need more than this product
 can provide, you may be able to add one of the following two options.
- Adobe Acrobat Pro While Adobe Express can manage several aspects of a PDF, the PDFs created with that product are not ADA-approved. If you are creating PDFs that will either go on web pages or be distributed to a larger audience, you may want to upgrade to Acrobat Pro. Limited licenses of Acrobat Pro are available to faculty and staff only. This license will automatically be assigned to all faculty due to the need for posting syllabi and other resources online. If you are a staff member who needs the ability to produce ADA-approved PDFs, you can request the Acrobat Pro license. Because we have a limited number of licenses, please include a justification for your request.
- Adobe Creative Cloud All Apps For those in programs or positions requiring the full Creative Cloud suite, we have a limited number of Creative Cloud All Apps licenses that can be assigned to faculty, staff or students. This is the traditional Adobe Creative Cloud product that allows license holders to download the apps to their computers. Note that this comes with Adobe Acrobat Pro, so if you have this license, you will not need Acrobat Pro as well. Because we have more limited licenses of the Creative Cloud All Apps product, you must include a justification of your need when requesting this license.

The new licensing model will start being applied to all faculty, staff and students this week. If you receive a license for Adobe Express only and have a need to add Acrobat Pro or Adobe Creative Cloud All Apps, please submit a Service Request using our IT Help Desk ticketing system. Go to https://askit.gcsu.edu. Click on "Other Request" if that is available under the "Recommended for you" section. Otherwise, search for "Other Request" in the "How can we help?" bar.





School bus safety

Public Safety: Wednesday October 25, 2023

In October, we celebrate National School Bus Safety Week, so we feel it is the perfect time to remind you about the laws pertaining to school buses. It has come to our attention that some of our students are not abiding by the school bus laws and this needs to be corrected before a tragedy occurs. I know we all want to do our part to keep all school children safe as they board and depart their school buses. While we need to be vigilant in all areas, one area in which we need to be especially mindful is around Central City Park, Franklin Street and Clarke Street, as many schoolchildren in that area ride our Baldwin County school buses.

Here are a few of the basic tips to always remember and heed:

- Be ready to act when you see the red flashing lights on the front and the rear of a school bus. This is your warning that a bus stop is about to take place. Begin to slow down and look for students in the area. Never speed up to beat a school bus. You must be focused and exercise caution any time you are in the vicinity of a school bus stop, as student riders can sometimes be impulsive.
- Abide by the law when a school bus comes to a full stop and you see the flashing red lights activate and the stop arm deploy. Motorists are required to STOP in nearly every instance. The only exception to this rule is when highways are separated in the center by a dirt, grass or concrete median. In this situation, only vehicles following or traveling alongside a school bus in the same direction must stop.
- Be attentive after stopping. You must remain stopped until all loading students are aboard in the morning or all unloading students have cleared 12 feet off the roadway in the afternoon.
- Avoid distractions such as texting or talking on your cell phone. If distracted, you threaten everyone's safety.
- Analyze what is happening at and around the bus. Carefully observe student actions, look for stragglers and expect the unexpected.
- Respond appropriately and defensively to the situation. A school bus means children, and children equal unpredictability.
- Proceed with caution only after all students have safely cleared the roadway, the stop arm is canceled and the flashing red lights are deactivated. Obey all traffic laws and speed limits, paying extra attention to the lower speed limits in school zones.

Abiding by the laws will help us ensure the safety of all students and prevent a tragedy from happening.

Administrative Graduate Assistant Request, AY 2024-2025

Non-academic offices that wish to request an Administrative Graduate Assistant (GA) for AY 2024-2025 should complete the Administrative Graduate Assistant Request form on or before December 15, 2023. To submit a request, click here or <a href="mailto:visit The Graduate School's graduate assistants web page.

If you received an Administrative Graduate Assistant allocation, formerly Supplemental Graduate Assistant allocation, in prior years, you are still required to apply each year. This application does NOT relate to academic departments or graduate degree programs that have a "regular" state-funded Graduate Assistant allocation, but rather to the non-academic offices that typically hire or would want to hire an Administrative Graduate Assistant for various administrative tasks. The stipend for an Administrative Graduate Assistant must be paid out of the hiring department's budget. Stipend amounts will often vary according to the hiring area. In the past, the common pay for Administrative Graduate Assistants was \$2,315 per semester, some were higher, others lower.

Review & Notification:

Requests will be reviewed by The Graduate School and email notifications of decision will be sent mid-January 2024. If approved, the deadline to hire an Administrative Graduate Assistant will be September 2024.


