

Outdoor Emergency Notification System Test Wednesday, Nov. 1

Public Safety : Wednesday November 1, 2023

Georgia College & State University will test the Outdoor Emergency Notification System (siren system) Wednesday, Nov. 1, 2023. This test is scheduled to occur the first Wednesday of every month between 10 a.m. and noon and last approximately one minute. No action is required during the testing, and all campus operations should continue as normal. A message stating that this is a test will precede and follow the "alert" tone. In the case of an actual tornado warning, the message would advise of a tornado warning, and the tone would cycle through. This would be repeated every five minutes until the warning expires or is canceled, at which time an all clear message would sound. The audible system test will only be tested when clear sky conditions are present. Tests will not occur when skies are dark or severe weather is predicted for the area on the day the test is scheduled to occur. In this case, the test will be rescheduled for later in the month.

There are three sirens operated by GCSU in Baldwin County: one on West Campus and two on Main Campus.

This testing program is designed to maintain a reliable warning system and to meet recommended testing guidelines. Additionally, we want to maximize the effectiveness of the Outdoor Emergency Notification System. By performing these tests, we hope to enhance awareness and education regarding emergency preparedness at Georgia College and within the local community.

Open Enrollment is currently underway and will last until Friday, Nov. 3, 2023. This is the time of year for you to review your current health coverage, review any changes to plans since last year and make your elections for calendar year 2024. <u>Details can be found at the USG Benefits website</u>.

This is an active open enrollment, so this year everyone is encouraged to review and take action on the following:

- Certification questions (tobacco & working spouse): Be sure to answer all applicable certification questions; failure to do so will result in default surcharges of \$150 per month, up to \$600 per month total based on your covered dependents and/or spouse.
- FSA if you elected to contribute to a Flexible Spending Account for 2023, you must re-enroll for 2024. The FSA is one of the few plans that will not automatically rollover year to year.
- Beneficiaries nobody wants to talk about beneficiaries or the potential to ever need to make sure they're in place, but while you're reviewing your information, take a few moments to ensure you have a beneficiary, or beneficiaries, setup for the basic life insurance you are offered through the USG, any supplemental life insurance you may elect, your mandatory retirement plan (TRS or ORP) any supplemental life insurance plan(s) you elect [403(b) and/or 457(b)] and your Health Savings Account if you contribute to the Consumer Choice HSA/high deductible health plan.

GCSU Benefits will be set up in the Library, room 302 one final time during Open Enrollment to offer assistance with enrollment and/or to answer employee questions. Please come see us on Thursday, Nov. 2, from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Shared Sick Leave Program: Enrollment for 2024 Ends Tomorrow -Friday, Nov. 3rd

Human Resources, Office of : Thursday November 2, 2023

The Annual Shared Sick Leave Program Enrollment Window opened Monday, Oct. 23, 2023 and will close Friday, Nov. 3, 2023 for participation effective Jan. 1, 2024.

All interested participants, should complete and submit the Shared Sick Leave Enrollment Form to Employee Relations at <u>employeerelations@gcsu.edu</u> by 5 p.m. Friday, Nov. 3, 2023. Please submit all enrollment forms via email. Please do not send enrollment forms via interoffice mail.

Participation in the program is voluntary, but employees must give in order to receive.

Only employees who have voluntarily enrolled in the Shared Sick Leave Program after meeting all of the eligibility requirements outlined within the applicable USG policy are eligible to become Shared Sick Leave Program recipients. Enrollment is only open during the annual open enrollment period, barring any exceptions outlined within the applicable USG policy.

Eligibility for Enrollment (during USG Benefits Open Enrollment Period):

- Must be a regular, benefits eligible employee who has completed their provisional period (six month probationary period), and
- Must contribute a minimum of eight (8) hours sick leave (prorated based on FTE) up to 80 hours, and
- Must have a minimum of forty (40) hours of sick leave remaining after their donation at the time of enrollment.

Note:

- Initial Enrollment: At the time of initial enrollment, employee must have a minimum of 48 hours sick leave, of which eight hours will be deducted and added to the leave pool.
- Re-Enrollment: Those members who were granted sick leave from the shared sick leave pool in 2023 must submit a new enrollment form in order to participate in 2024.
- Special Enrollment: When the program is determined to be depleted (120 hours or less remaining balance) a "special enrollment period" will be conducted with an appeal to the Georgia College community at large to donate sick leave. Each member will be notified in writing that and additional (8) eight hours will be deducted from their sick leave balance.
- Current members: No action required; you will automatically be enrolled into the program for 2024 unless you request to terminate your membership.
- Terminate membership: An employee may terminate their membership at any time by completing and submitting the Shared Sick Leave Program Termination Form. Any leave contributed to the pool prior to withdrawal from the program shall be forfeited.

Kieh learned firsthand about autocracy and oppressions, while growing up in Liberia. He was imprisoned twice for organizing social-justice movements and protesting against his government.

For the symposium, Kieh invited 13 professors from Georgia College, University of West Georgia, North Carolina Central University and as far away as California to speak about the challenges facing democracy in the world today.

"In an autocracy, you got to go with the program," Kieh said. "There's no room for independent views. Eventually, authoritarian regimes consume their own supporters. If you challenge them, you do that at your own peril. You don't have the right to think freely anymore. You don't have the right to express alternative views. That's only in a democratic system."

Art history professor publishes book about Christian art in Tanzania

He reveals so much about the origins of missionary-based Christian art in Tanzania ..."

Cécile Fromont of Yale University highlighted Mshana's "valuable contribution to the all too scant scholarship on African Christian art in a generously illustrated volume that will enrich readers interested in religion, expressive cultures, and the many facets of cross-cultural missionary encounters."

Gary van Wyk of Axis Gallery wrote: "Mshana contributes a valuable Tanzanian perspective to the scholarship on Christian-mission patronage of art in Africa, assessing and contrasting five influential art centers in Tanzania."

Mshana's book was published in July 2023 by Lexington Books, an imprint of Rowman & Littlefield. "African Artists under Mission Patronage" is available in hard cover and e-book at <u>Lexington Books</u>, as well as Barnes & Noble and Amazon Books online.

This is an active open enrollment, so this year everyone is encouraged to review and take action on the following:

- Certification questions (tobacco and working spouse): Be sure to answer all applicable certification questions; failure to do so will result in default surcharges of \$150 per month, up to \$600 per month total based on your covered dependents and/or spouse.
- FSA if you elected to contribute to a Flexible Spending Account for 2023, you must re-enroll for 2024. The FSA is one of the few plans that will not automatically rollover year to year.
- Beneficiaries nobody wants to talk about beneficiaries or the potential to ever need to make sure they're in place, but while you're reviewing your information, take a few moments to ensure you have a beneficiary, or beneficiaries, setup for the basic life insurance you are offered through the USG, any supplemental life insurance you may elect, your mandatory retirement plan (TRS or ORP) any supplemental life insurance plan(s) you elect [403(b) and/or 457(b)] and your Health Savings Account if you contribute to the Consumer Choice HSA/high deductible health plan.



Rehired Retirees: Reminder to Act Early

Human Resources, Office of : Monday November 6, 2023

In order to avoid hiring delays, we strongly encourage you to submit Rehired Retiree Applications ASAP for any full-time and/or part-time rehired retirees that you currently employ and wish to return, or new staff or faculty needed for Spring 2024. Summer 2024 rehired retiree applications may be submitted after Summer courses have been determined based on registration.

TRS communicated a change in their expectations for processing rehired retirees in 2022. To remain compliant with these amended regulations and to keep all processing consistent regardless of retirement agency (TRS, ORP, or ERS), the following changes have been implemented:

- STAFF rehired retirees who work the full fiscal year a single application may be submitted (July 1-June 30 if 12-month or August 1-May 31 if 10-month)
- STAFF rehired retirees who work part of the fiscal year a single application may be submitted for the work they are expected to perform; the application dates must be within the span of the fiscal year (July 1-June 30)
- FACULTY rehired retirees who receive a full-time, limited term contract (this is extremely rare) -- a single application may be submitted (July 1-June 30 if 12-month or August 1-May 31 if 10-month)
- FACULTY rehired retirees who receive a semester-by-semester contract (ALL part-time faculty) a single application for each semester must be submitted
 - Fall: August 1-December 31
 - Spring: January 1-May 31
 - Summer: A separate application is required for each term
 - Maymester: May 1-31
 - June: June 1-30
 - July: July 1-31

The new TRS rehired retiree expectation is aligned with our institutional part-time faculty contract schedule. If you have a part-time faculty rehired retiree, know that every contract issued and accepted will require a corresponding rehired retiree application; this includes any amendments made to credit hours and/or compensation.

Reminders:

- ALL rehired retirees are considered TEMPORARY employees and must be re-approved annually or per term, whichever is applicable based on employment type.
- NO rehired retiree can begin work until all approvals have been obtained and onboarding requirements completed.
 - Failure to comply with this may put the rehired retiree's pension in jeopardy!
- No rehired retiree's compensation can exceed 49% of the compensation the individual made at the time of retirement; there are no exceptions.
- If the rehired retiree will be teaching, you are required to include the "rate per credit hour" as a separate document with the required course information; if not included, we may deny the application and ask you to resubmit with the missing information.
- Maximum FTE (full-time equivalency) for an employee is 49% (or 0.49 FTE); no rehired retiree can work more than 19 hours per week. To calculate FTE:
 - Number of hours worked per week / 40 hours in a standard work week = Accurately prorated FTE.
 - Example: Working 12 hours/week would be 12 hours worked / 40 hours in a standard work week = 0.3 FTE
 - Part-time faculty: Use the table on the PT Faculty contract to convert the number of credit hours

taught to total working hours per week; do NOT calculate FTE solely based on credit hours taught.

GCSU Theatre's "Leveling Up" is an emotional rollercoaster about growing up

: Monday November 6, 2023

Georgia College & State University's coming-of-age production, "Leveling Up," explores the fears, hesitancy, obstacles and sometimes courageous rites-ofpassage into adulthood facing today's youth.



The production opens Wednesday, Nov. 8, and runs through Sunday, Nov. 12, in the <u>Campus Black Box Theatre</u>.

Written by Deborah Zoe Laufer, the play explores the stagnant lives of three roommates who graduated from college two years earlier—but still spend their time on the couch playing video games.

While transitioning into adulthood is never trouble-free, upheavals like the 2008 financial crisis and COVID-19 pandemic made jobs and opportunity particularly scarce.

"I remember that period vividly. All the work just dried up. Even the entry-level and part-time side jobs were scarce for a while," said Director Jeremy Lee Cudd, an assistant professor of performance in Georgia College's <u>Department of Theatre and Dance</u>.

"Survival mode became the new normal," Cudd said. "These kinds of events, especially when they come at a key transitional age, can really knock the wind out of a generation."

Video games are the primary mode-of-escape for the group, who get into a fight and then compete to see who can get 'a real life' first.

Their frustration and loss of inspiration—coupled with a feeling the world is working against them—creates a "heaviness" of motionlessness at the beginning that will make audiences "love watching these characters kickstart their lives, fall flat and then still improvise their way forward," Cudd said.

Four students make up the cast. About 30 other students worked behind the scenes on stage construction, scenic painting, sound, light and make up.

"The students involved in this project, working onstage and off, are bringing a lot of heart and detailed care to the telling of this story," Cudd said. "I'm excited for the community to experience the fruits of all their collective labor."

"I hope audiences recognize bits of themselves in these characters and grow to care for them," he added. "I hope student audiences, in particular, are reminded that messy, awkward mistakes are an inevitable and necessary part of our growth as humans. The potential humiliations of growing up are not theirs alone to bear. On the contrary, all are in good company. I like it when stories remind me of that."

Stage manager and sophomore <u>theatre</u> major Hannah Zdancewicz of Roswell appreciates the realistic nature of the play's characters. Everyone, especially students, will be able to identify with them and learn something about themselves, she said.

She hopes audiences will walk away realizing that change doesn't always feel good, but that's OK.

"These characters are not perfect, but they are human," Zdancewicz said. "This is one of the most authentic productions I have ever been a part of."

Sophomore Olivia Langston of Woodstock, an <u>English</u> major with a minor in <u>theatre</u>, plays Jeanie. Her character studied psychology and has a passion for helping children. It's been challenging to play someone so much like herself, but also different.

The moral of the play, Langston said, is to live life.

"Hiding from the real world doesn't make it any less scary," she said, "it just makes you more scared. The best parts of life have to be lived to be cherished."For mature audiences. Shows are at 7:30 p.m. Nov. 8-11 and 2 p.m. Nov. 12 in the Campus Black Box Theatre, downtown Milledgeville. General admission is \$15 for adults; \$10 for senior citizens, GCSU faculty, staff and non-GCSU students; and \$5 for GCSU students. For tickets, visit: www.tickets.gcsu.edu.

University Communications wins two awards for bison story & video

Both awards were for coverage on "<u>Where bison roamed: Paleontological dig shows a different Georgia.</u>"

<u>CASE</u> stands for the Council for Advancement and Support of Education. It's a national public relations organization that supports education professionals in areas of advancement and communications. The awards were won in CASE's <u>Southeast District III</u> category.

These are the first awards Georgia College has won from CASE.

"This is an incredible honor for the University Communications office at Georgia College," said Alan Weston, interim associate vice president for Strategic Communications and director of <u>Marketing and Publications</u>.

"It is a testament to the hard work of all involved with the project," Weston said. "We take great pride in telling the amazing stories that occur on our vibrant campus, and we're proud to have elite-level communications professionals who represent us so well."

The bison story was written by Cindy O'Donnell,<u>media relations</u> specialist at Georgia College. The video was filmed and edited by alumnus and former <u>broadcast and video</u> staff member, Michael Gillett, '14, '20. The awards were for Best <u>Writing: News/Feature (1,000+ words)</u> and Best <u>Video: News and Research</u>.

The story and video posted <u>on Front Page</u> in August 2022. They tell a story about the paleontological dig in Brunswick headed by <u>Biology</u> Professor Dr. Al Mead. He's a paleomammalogist who studies ecosystems of the past and the state's sole expert on fossilized mammal bones.

Mead's dig spans more than 20 years of work and is the only excavation of its kind in Georgia.

The award application reads: The Georgia College & State University bison package was a unique opportunity to tell a story that not only celebrated the human element—reflecting well on our biology faculty and students—but delved into a subject most people would find interesting: the unlikely unearthing of bison and mammoth bones in the swampy, seaside marshes of Southeastern Georgia.

It's a story of discovery, perseverance and collaboration among universities, as well as climate change and survival.

For this package, a small team (writer and video producer) were sent overnight to the dig site in Brunswick, Georgia. The extra effort produced show-not-tell details in the writing, while giving the video specialist opportunity to capture the dirt and sweat nature of the dig.

The carefully crafted writing was supplemented by photos, video and social media. This helped entice media beyond the Central Georgia area. In addition to pictures and polished video, the press release included 3 minutes of raw footage for TV use.

The newswire was picked up by more than 350 news outlets with a potential audience of 186 million. The

press release garnered the usual flurry of regional media—like <u>13WMAZ's package</u>—but was also picked up by state newspapers like the <u>Atlanta Journal Constitution</u> and <u>Savannah Morning News</u>.

The story was shared on Facebook, Instagram and Linked-In, generating more than 12,000 impressions and 5200 views. There were an additional 2,000 views on Vimeo. To date, the story has nearly 2,500 views on Front Page.

In announcing the award, Hope Carter, chair for CASE District III, wrote: "You are one of dozens of CASE members in our District being recognized for extraordinary work. Your creative and innovative ideas will serve as inspiration for countless others in the months and years ahead. On behalf of everyone who will benefit, we thank you."

Case District III Awards will be presented at a conference dinner in February 2024 in Orlando, Florida.



GCSU's 2023 Coverdell Visiting Scholar holds symposium on democracy

War continues in the Ukraine. Widespread conflict threatens the Middle East. Around the world—according to a study released this month by the <u>International</u> <u>Institute for Democracy and Electoral Assistance</u> (IDEA)—democracy is on the decline.



Amid this turmoil, a voice from Georgia College & State University cries out this warning: "Don't go down that path."

"In an autocracy, you got to go with the program. There's no room for independent views," said Dr. George Kieh, Georgia College's <u>2023 Coverdell Visiting Scholar</u>.

"Eventually, authoritarian regimes consume their own supporters. If you challenge them, you do that at your own peril," Kieh said. "You don't have the right to think freely anymore. You don't have the right to express alternative views. That's only in a democratic system."

As Georgia College's visiting scholar in the department of <u>Government & Sociology</u>, Kieh teaches a class and holds public events. This week, he invited a dozen professors from Georgia College and other universities for a two-day symposium on "Democracy in the World," Nov. 10-11.

Friday's symposium will be 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the Pat Peterson Museum Education room in Ina Dillard Russell Library. Saturday's breakfast event will be 8:30 to 10:30 a.m. Topics include explanations of governance, the struggles of democratic systems and authoritarian regimes.

The symposium couldn't be more timely.

IDEA's study points to democracy faltering in almost half of the 173 countries it surveyed. This is due to weakening government checks and balances, restriction of freedom, corruption, rigged elections and a general lack of accountability from elected leaders, according to a <u>report</u> by United Press International (UPI).

Kieh knows firsthand about this kind of injustice.

He was born and raised on a rubber plantation in Liberia. His father worked at the plantation 35 years, and treatment for laborers could be harsh. By middle school, Kieh had organized his first social-justice movement. He later became president of the University of Liberia's Student Government Association.

In 1979, while in college, he was arrested, charged with treason and tortured.

He was imprisoned three months.

Twice, in 1989 and 1999, Kieh witnessed the oppression that disintegrates countries into civil war. He knows how hard it is for freedom to come back once a nation embraces the absolute power of dictatorship.

These life lessons pushed him to become an educator, and it's what continues to energize him—prompting him to warn all who will listen.

"The best authoritarian system," Kieh said, "is worse than the most flawed democratic system."

Kieh is on sabbatical from Texas Southern University in Houston, where he was dean of the Barbara Jordan-Mickey Leland School of Public Affairs. He is an expert on foreign policy, conflicts, civil wars, global terrorism and genocide.

Joining him for the symposium are three professors from the University of West Georgia: Dr. Elaine Mackinnon, Dr. Neema Noori and Dr. J. Sal Peralta; three professors from North Carolina Central University: Dr. Allan Cooper, Dr. Tennyson Joseph and Dr. Emmanuel Oritsejafor; Dr. Kelechi Kalu from the University of California at Riverside; and four professors from Georgia College: Dr. Scott Buchanan, Dr. Aran Mackinnon, Dr. Harold Mock and Dr. William Risch.

Opening addresses will be given at a 6 p.m. dinner Thursday, Nov. 9, by Dr. Costa Spirou, vice president for Academic Affairs, and Dr. Eric Tenbus, dean of the College of Arts & Sciences at Georgia College.

Vivian Cassaniti, a political science major, mentored by Dr. Min Kim, receives Pajari Best Undergraduate Research Paper Award

We are delighted to announce that Vivian Cassaniti, a dedicated political science major, under the mentorship of Dr. Min Kim, has been honored with the prestigious Pajari Best Undergraduate Research Paper Award at the recent Georgia Political Science Association Annual Meeting.

Vivian's research delves into the systematic examination of gender differences in attitudes toward public policy issues and their profound impact on American politics. Her work offers invaluable insights into the intricate patterns of gendered public opinion in the United States, elucidating the driving factors behind these patterns and exploring how gender intersects with other identities to shape political attitudes.

Employing data from the 2021 General Social Survey, Vivian meticulously analyzes the influence of partisanship and various identities on gender disparities in attitudes toward social welfare policies. Her research not only



sheds light on the nuanced dynamics at play but also culminates in policy recommendations aimed at addressing existing gender disparities in perspectives on welfare policies.


Library Special Collections at GCSU documents stories about Central State Hospital

Lost within the sensationalized history of the hospital is the tireless labor of the community to do good, despite challenges.



Over the years, thousands of community residents dedicated themselves to the success of Central State Hospital and care of the sick. They created a legacy of service that Milledgeville continues to take pride in.

The project will record their stories—documenting the lives of people who worked every day at the "State" and contributed to its complex history. These stories will also be part of the <u>Institute of Museum and Library</u> <u>Services</u> (IMLS) funded project, which will include a symposium and exhibit. The project is called "<u>Unsilenced Voices</u>: An Oral History Project of Central State Hospital."

"Georgia College Special Collections understands that the story of a place is made up of the many stories of the people who made it what it was," said Library Director Shaundra Walker. "One of the often-overlooked aspects of the historical record is the viewpoint of workers. We want to document the stories of those who went to work every day at the 'State' and contributed to this complex history."



Irish award-winning book includes essay by GCSU Creative Writing Associate Professor

An essay written by Dr. Kerry Neville, associate professor of English and coordinator of the Master's in Fine Arts program at Georgia College & State University, is included in a book that won the "2023 An Post Irish Book Award" for Best Irish-Published Book of the Year.



The book, "<u>Sunday Miscellany: A Companion, 2018-2023</u>," was edited by Sarah Binchy of RTÉ radio's Sunday Miscellany Program and published by New Island Books. Neville's essay, "Riverkeeper," was part of this book collection and also <u>broadcast</u> on the radio program in May.

"Riverkeeper" is about the western Ireland city of Limerick, Ireland, and the Shannon River that flows though the city. She writes about the volunteers who patrol the river's bridges at night, helping those who might be in mental health crisis.

"I am thrilled by this news," Neville said, "and honored to share space in this anthology with important contemporary Irish writers such as Colm Tóibín, Joseph O'Connor, Louise Kennedy, and Donal Ryan."

"I like to think that a piece of me—my story and my words in this anthology—lives in my beloved home away from home, Ireland. As we say in Irish, 'Táim an-bhuíoch. Grá mór!' I am very grateful. Big love!"

According to the book's sales website, RTÉ Radio 1's Sunday Miscellany is an Irish program that has provided comfort, joy and entertainment to hundreds of thousands of listeners for over half a century. Some of the best Irish writing from the last five years are included in this volume.



With all new costumes, Georgia College & State University celebrates its 27th annual production of Pyotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky's beloved 1892 two-act classical ballet "The Nutcracker."

Shows are Friday through Sunday, Dec. 8-10, in Russell Auditorium.

The Russian ballet has become a staple in many holiday celebrations. The fairytale follows the festivities of a family and their Christmas tree, and a young girl dreams of her handsome Nutcracker coming to life and waging battle with an evil Mouse King.


