

GCSU Combats the Regional K-12 Teacher Shortage Through "Grow Your Own" Partnership with Baldwin Schools

University Communications: Thursday February 1, 2024

Georgia College is excited to establish yet another vital regional partnership with the Baldwin County School District. In a significant step toward addressing the ongoing teacher shortage in rural Georgia, Baldwin County Schools launched the "Grow Your Own" Teacher Program. The initiative was developed in collaboration with



GCSU and other post-secondary institutions in middle Georgia. "Grow Your Own" aims to create a sustainable model to build a robust teacher pipeline to alleviate the critical shortage of K-12 teachers in the region.

Academic leadership from GCSU, Baldwin County Schools and Central Georgia Tech signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) at a ceremony in the Baldwin High School Fine Arts Center Wednesday morning, January 31.

"The signing of the MOU by President Cathy Cox formalizes our goal of cultivating, recruiting, and preparing high quality students who will become well-prepared and committed educators in Baldwin County," said Dr. Holley Roberts, associate provost and director of The Graduate School at Georgia College.

Roberts added, "This partnership and MOU formalized our commitment to prepare teachers who come from Baldwin County and who will remain in Baldwin County to positively impact student success and promote a vibrant community."

Collaborating with Baldwin County Schools supports not only the mission of the John H. Lounsbury College of Education, but also aligns with the "Engage" Pillar of the Imagine 2030 Strategic Plan to promote lasting positive change by sustaining meaningful, reciprocal relationships that value and elevate the contributions of all on campus, with local communities, with alumni, and beyond.

The "Grow Your Own" program enables students to graduate from high school with an Associate's degree or college credits from partner institutions in Middle Georgia. They will then seamlessly transfer to a partner institution to complete their undergraduate degree in education. Candidates who successfully meet Professional Standards Commission (PSC) requirements (including a background check and passing a GACE ethics test) are eligible for an interview for employment in the Baldwin County School District.

It is once again time for departments to submit their Institution Online Resources (IOR) inventory. In keeping with University System of Georgia (USG) policy and guidance, the IOR submission and documentation process is an annual requirement for all departments/offices on campus. IORs include all websites, social media accounts, and mobile apps that are intended for broad public audiences and used for a department's business operations.

New for 2024

- 1. Web Communications has simplified the reporting process. Each office/department will only need to fill out the submission form one time for their area.
- 2. Any website containing a gcsu.edu address (examples include gcsu.edu/communications, training.gcsu.edu, admissions.gcsu.edu) should NOT be reported moving forward.
- 3. The submission form has been simplified to include more pre-filled in selections and choices that are easier to understand and to reduce the amount of write in answers.
- 4. Language and terms used in the form and on help webpages have been simplified to make them easier to understand.
- 5. The help website has also been reworked to walk users step-by-step through the submission process with screenshots explaining exactly what information is being requested. You can view the submission training webpage on My GCSU.

Submissions are due by March 1, 2024. You can submit your online inventory now by visiting the form here.

FY2024 Year-end deadlines approaching

Finance & Administration: Friday February 2, 2024

The fiscal year-end is approaching, which means we must accurately account for the institution's financials before closing out the fiscal year on June 30, 2024. This includes ensuring that any funding that can possibly lapse (go back to the State) is accounted for properly. As a state entity, we are governed by certain purchasing policies and procedures, which include deadlines for purchases of varying dollar amounts. To ensure that expenditures are properly reported during the transition of fiscal years, we have deadlines for receiving transactional items. These deadlines, as listed below, are necessary to guarantee that transactions are properly executed and that our financials are appropriately reported.

CRITICAL DEADLINES

Purchase Order cutoff dates:

- March 15, 2024 Non-contract requisitions over \$100,000. (Non-contract items are not available on state or agency contracts.)
- April 15, 2024 Non-contract requisitions between \$25,000 and \$100,000.
- May 1, 2024

 Requisitions up to \$25,000, state or agency contract purchases for any
 amount.

Project Requests and Purchases

 March 15, 2024 - Requests that require scope development and/or design components (Ex. Renovation, paint, carpet, HVAC, Electrical, furniture, etc.) should be received in the Facilities Planning Office by March 15, 2024. Contractor pricing, lead time for materials and items that require design (architectural, furniture) all take longer than in years past. e-Procurement

Will not allow requisitions to be entered after May 1, 2024. Requisitions must be entered
before 5 pm on May 1, 2024, in order to be processed. Requisitions must also be
approved and have a valid budget check by the dates above in order to provide adequate
time for processing. If you have any questions concerning whether items are noncontract or contract, please contact the Purchasing staff at 478-445-0504.

P-Card cutoff dates:

- May 26, 2024- All P-Card transactions occurring between April 28, 2024, through May 27, 2024, must be allocated and signed off by cardholders and approvers in Works. P-Card purchases after this date will not be included in the FY2024 budget. This cutoff will help ensure that all transactions posted on or before this date are posted to your FY 2024 budgets. There may be circumstances where a transaction is delayed and does not post until after the above date. In those cases, the charge will be posted against your FY2025 budget. You can continue to use your card after the above date with the understanding that those charges will be posted against your FY2024 budget.
- June 7, 2024 Signed P-card statements with receipts and approvals are due in the Purchasing Department by 5 p.m.

Accounting Services cutoff dates:

- May 1, 2024 Last day to submit online check requests (i.e., registrations, memberships, direct billings for hotel/car rental, hotel prepayments, refunds, food items, Sodexo invoices, etc.), that are needed before July 14, 2024.
- June 7, 2024 All petty cash requests for reimbursements are due to Accounting Office by 5 p.m.
- June 14, 2024 Approved paper travel expense statements (for non-employee, encumbered, or international travel) are due by 5 p.m.

Travel cutoff dates:



GCSU's new workforce readiness program will prep high schoolers for local jobs

School of Continuing and Professional Studies: Tuesday February 6, 2024

In the Middle Ages, youth were matched with master craftsmen through apprenticeships. Employers received inexpensive labor, while molding and training an upcoming workforce.

Similarly, Georgia College & State University, in collaboration with the Milledgeville-Baldwin County Chamber of Commerce, is launching a new Workforce Readiness Program. It will connect businesses with high school seniors who want to stay in Milledgeville and find local employment.

A <u>Zoom information session</u> for business owners to learn about the program will be at noon Wednesday, Feb. 7.

"If you're a high school student standing at the intersection of 441 looking down Columbia Street, what do you see as a job opportunity? Running a cash register and selling fries, right? Milledgeville is so much more than that," said Angela Criscoe, executive director of the School of Continuing and Professional Studies at Georgia College.

"We want to match a high school student who wants to stay here in Milledgeville with businesses seeking quality talent. We want to help build a workforce pipeline for local businesses so they can train and mold workers for jobs they need to fill."

The program runs June 3 to July 26 with the ultimate goal of students getting permanent jobs.

Participants are nominated for the program by their Baldwin County High School counselors.

At a career fair April 9, students will get an idea of the types of jobs available this summer. Local business owners will interview candidates at the fair and, soon after, a committee will determine best matches.

"Sometimes, young employees lack proper job etiquette," Criscoe said. "They don't always have good customer service skills yet or understand how to form relationships with clientele. That's why our program starts with a week of education at Georgia College."

Students will receive instruction from Georgia's Best Workforce curriculum. They'll do team-building activities, listen to guest speakers about leadership and meet local business owners. Then, students will have the opportunity to work four weeks for a local business, earning a minimum of \$8 an hour. They might work on an assembly line or in human resources. There could be jobs in healthcare, city government, retail, construction, transportation and media groups.

During that time, students will receive valuable coaching, training and job skills—making them stronger candidates for future, full-time employment.

Businesses benefit too with a pool of already-trained job applicants to choose from.

To participate, businesses must commit by March 15. There is a commitment fee of \$200 that pays for student instruction and an award ceremony at summer's end.

Students will receive a certificate of completion, showing they are workforce ready.

"This is a collaborative effort to connect people," Criscoe said. "This program will develop our youth to be better workers, better thinkers and better citizens. This will help our community grow."

"If we can fill jobs with quality talent, by growing and developing our own workforce," she added, "we're going to have a stronger, local workforce environment."



Open Call for GC 1010 Instructors for Bridge Scholars Program

Bridge Scholars Program: Tuesday February 6, 2024

This is an open call for applications to teach a one-credit student success course in the summer Bridge Scholars Program.

About the Bridge Scholars Program:

The Bridge Scholars Program (BSP) is a yearlong Residential Learning Community which gives first-year students a head start on college through a special program designed to help them successfully make the transition from high school to our campus. During the summer program, BSP students are placed into a cohort and take a one-credit hour success course and six hours of core courses. Students who pass all courses with a grade of C or better are eligible to return to Georgia College & State University in the fall. Returning students then continue to participate in special extracurricular activities and peer mentoring during their first year. Past BSP students have gone on to be academically successful campus leaders. This is due, in part, to the strong start they've had for their college experience. One of the highlights and benefits of the program is the close interaction that BSP students enjoy with their faculty and BSP staff. We hope that you will consider applying for this unique teaching opportunity. (For more information, please visit the Bridge Scholars Program webpage).

Summer Teaching Opportunity:

Each instructor will teach one section of GC 1010: Student Success Seminar. The course will meet from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on June 17 – June 20 (no classes on June 19). The course does not replace the fall FYAS; rather it is a "study skills boot camp" of sorts. Our goal is to front-load students with intensive academic skill-building before they proceed to take their summer core courses. GC 1010 is designed to help Bridge Scholars strengthen their academic success skills by covering topics such as test anxiety, time management, note-taking and reading comprehension. The course utilizes the open-source text, College Success.

Instructors should understand that due to the nature of this program, there is an expectation of involvement outside the classroom to support and facilitate student development via relationship building and mentoring during the transition to university life. In addition to instructional time, those hired to teach with the BSP during summer 2024 will be required to participate in the following events:

Outdoor Emergency Notification System Test Wednesday, Feb. 7

Public Safety: Wednesday February 7, 2024

Georgia College & State University will test the Outdoor Emergency Notification System (siren system) Wednesday, Feb. 7, 2024. This test is scheduled to occur the first Wednesday of every month between 10 a.m. and noon and will last approximately one minute. No action is required during the testing, and all campus operations should continue as normal. A message stating that this is a test will precede and follow the "alert" tone. In the case of an actual tornado warning, the message would advise of a tornado warning, and the tone would cycle through. This would be repeated every five minutes until the warning expires or is canceled, at which time an all clear message would sound. The audible system test will only be tested when clear sky conditions are present. Tests will not occur when skies are dark or severe weather is predicted for the area on the day the test is scheduled to occur. In this case, the test will be rescheduled for later in the month.

There are three sirens operated by GCSU in Baldwin County: one on West Campus and two on Main Campus.

This testing program is designed to maintain a reliable warning system and to meet recommended testing guidelines. Additionally, we want to maximize the effectiveness of the Outdoor Emergency Notification System. By performing these tests, we hope to enhance awareness and education regarding emergency preparedness at Georgia College and within the local community.


GCSU Leadership Programs to host best-selling author

The Transeuntis Mundi Project proposes to capture the sound and visual memory of peoples, cultural expressions and places to artistically tell the story of the millennial passersby that have been crossing the world. It currently portrays the diversity of four countries from four continents and generates a poetical/documental archive of human cultural heritage. The expression Transeuntis Mundi comes from Latin, the lingua franca of the expansion of Western Culture. It personifies the human being who has been taking the adventure to discover and explore the world. Its methodology employs Walkscapes recordings with immersive 360° technology. From this archive, it starts a process of transmedial composition: creation of virtual reality works, videos, photographs, sound art, musical compositions and performance, with the aim to immerse the observer/participant into an experience beyond their space and time. In short, it is a combination of knowledge, innovation and poetics, supported by the processes of artistic research and mediated by transmedial technology.

Open call for summer 2024 BSP faculty

Bridge Scholars Program: Wednesday February 14, 2024

This is an open call for applications to teach a three-credit summer course in the Georgia College & State University Bridge Scholars Program (BSP). Faculty members are needed to teach Area A-E core courses for the summer 2024 Bridge Scholars Program. Core courses meet in the morning (9 a.m.- 12 p.m.) or afternoon (1:30-4:30 p.m.) Monday-Friday between June 16 and July 28, 2024.

BSP is a year-long Residential Learning Community which gives approximately 125 freshmen a head start on college through a special program designed to help them make a successful transition from high school to campus. During the summer, BSP students take a one-credit hour success course and six hours of core courses for a total of seven hours. Students who pass all courses with a grade of C or better are eligible to return to Georgia College for their freshman year. These students then continue taking classes and participating in extracurricular programming together throughout their first year. One of the highlights and benefits of the program is the close interaction that BSP students enjoy with their faculty and BSP staff. Past BSP students have gone on to be academically successful campus leaders, and this is due in part to the strong start they have had for their college experience.

April 26, BSP faculty/staff orientation

June 15 – 9 a.m. – 11 a.m., BSP Orientation, Faculty and Academic Coach Meeting

June 17 – June 20 GCSU 1010 Student Success course (No classes June 19)

June 21 – July 16, Core courses (M-F, 9 a.m. – 12 p.m., 1:30 p.m. – 4:30 p.m.; no classes July 4 – 5)

July 17 – July 18, Final exams, grades posted, program closing banquet

July 19 - BSP Students check out of residence halls

Interested faculty should submit a paragraph identifying the core course they would like to teach, including brief description of the course and addressing (1) their interest in the BSP program, (2) how their teaching style would be a good fit for this specialized cohort of students, and (3) their thoughts on how faculty involvement outside of the classroom can support and enhance pedagogy.

Please submit this paragraph by Sunday, Feb. 24, 2024, to bridge.scholars@gcsu.edu. Hiring decisions will be made March.

Remuneration is a portion of your salary plus benefits. Pay will be split over pay dates on June 30 and July 31, 2023. Faculty should understand that due to the nature of this program, there is an expectation of involvement outside the classroom to support and facilitate student development via relationship building and mentoring during the transition to university life. Faculty must be approved by their department chair and the chair of the area they wish to instruct.

Faculty hired to teach with the BSP during summer 2024 will be required to hold at least one study session at West Campus during the summer program and participate in the following events:

- April 26: BSP faculty/staff orientation
- Saturday, June 15: BSP orientation
- Thursday, July 18: Closing Banquet

Tuesday, Feb. 20 Georgia College & State University's Music Department presents The Catacoustic Consort performing "Secret of the Muse" at 7:30 p.m. in Magnolia Ballroom. Guest artists and soprano Melissa Harvey with pardessus de viole Annalisa Pappano and Joanna Blendulf will entertain audiences with popular opera arias from 18th Century France. Prior to the performance at 7:30 pm, Dr. David de Posada from GCSU's Department of World Languages and Cultures will give a lecture about the concert. It was invented in France, so aristocratic women could play newly popular violin music from Italy on a socially accepted instrument. The violin had lower-class associations at the time. The pardessus became wildly popular with French women for about 60 years until the French Revolution made it dangerous to be associated with anything upper class. This



leaves a wealth of unknown and no longer played music to be explored. This concert will also be livestreamed at www.facebook.com/GCMusicDepartment. A \$5 donation is encouraged. 



It is once again time for departments to submit their Institution Online Resources (IOR) inventory. In keeping with University System of Georgia (USG) policy and guidance, the IOR submission and documentation process is an annual requirement for all departments/offices on campus. IORs include all websites, social media accounts, and mobile apps that are intended for broad public audiences and used for a department's business operations.

New for 2024

- 1. Web Communications has simplified the reporting process. Each office/department will only need to fill out the submission form one time for their area.
- 2. Any website containing a gcsu.edu address (examples include gcsu.edu/communications, training.gcsu.edu, admissions.gcsu.edu) should NOT be reported moving forward.
- 3. The submission form has been simplified to include more pre-filled in selections and choices that are easier to understand and to reduce the amount of write in answers.
- 4. Language and terms used in the form and on help webpages have been simplified to make them easier to understand.
- 5. The help website has also been reworked to walk users step-by-step through the submission process with screenshots explaining exactly what information is being requested. You can view the submission training webpage on My GCSU.



GCSU spring musical presents dystopian world devoid of music in "We Will Rock You"

Theatre & Dance, Department of : Wednesday February 21, 2024

Prepare to have your world shaken by Georgia College & State University's spring musical, "We Will Rock You." It follows a group of revolutionaries in a dystopian world devoid of music who seek to free their apocalyptic society with hits by the British rock band, Queen.

The production will be in Russell Auditorium Feb. 28 through March 3.

"This play takes place 300 years in the future," said director and associate professor of theatre, Amy Pinney. "So, humanity has changed. There is a dictatorship. There is a tyrant. Her name is Killer Queen. She started out on a video game, an adult video game, then downloads herself into her programmer, so she's half pixelated and half human—and evil."

"She banned live music, so the only music allowed is electronically and computergenerated," Pinney said. "There is power when people come together to create, so that has been banned."

In 2002, the first production of "We Will Rock You" opened in London's West End, becoming the longest-running musical at Dominion Theatre at that time. By December 2022, the play had been seen by 20 million people in 28 countries. It returned to the West End last August at the London Coliseum.

It's an adventure but also a love story, about misfits and heroes. And those who yearn to belong.

For all its dystopian aspects, Pinney said the play is also filled with warmth and optimism. It'll leave audiences hopeful for the future.

There's a hippie librarian, tough feminist, yuppies (the bad guys), robocops, "Ga Ga kids" who conform and the evil queen. Citizens in this future are punished inside (real) laser cages.

A group of Bohemians (the good guys) rebel against the evil empire where free thought and choice are not allowed. Their story is based on a book by Ben Elton, a comedian and playwright, and told through songs like "We are the Champions" by Queen.

Other great Queen hits include: "I Want to Break Free," "Somebody to Love," "Killer Queen,"

"Under Pressure," "It's a Kind of Magic," "Crazy Little Thing Called Love," "Another One Bites the Dust" and, of course, "We Will Rock You."

Everyone dresses the same, thinks the same, acts the same.

But some modern twists are added in. So, this future is also familiar. People are too busy online to interact, and some wear Virtual Reality (VR) goggles.

It's very much a 'resistance' story like Star Wars or the Hunger Games, Pinney said. The bohemians are in hiding, searching for 'the dreamer' who will restore rock music.

This turns out to be Galileo, the lead role played by senior theatre and philosophy major Bella Eclavea of Augusta, Georgia. A singer and songwriter who plays the guitar and ukulele, Eclavea grew up listening to songs of the 60s and 70s with her dad.

Even though the play takes place 300 years from now, Eclavea said it's a lot like today's world.

"We don't have a dictator," Eclavea said, "but I've already seen videos of people walking down the street wearing VR goggles."

"I've been looking at the history of rock-n-roll. It was a time on fire, and people were so connected," she said. "If there's anything I want people to walk away with, it's this: 'Think about where we're at and how much we value each other.'"

Students of all majors make up the 15-actor cast. About 50 students work behind the scenes in make-up, costume and set design. Two students did the choreography, and students are also in charge of lighting and sound.

The set is a massive mix of shipping containers and ladders, where future populations live and work. There'll be a motorcycle on stage and a five-member, live rock band playing 8 feet in the air—directed by Raymond Darius Jackson, minister of music at St. John's Missionary Baptist Church in Warner Robins.

Every musical at Georgia College takes about a year from conception to production. Crews started rehearsing in December, then three hours every night starting in early January. Each production crew becomes like family, Pinney said.

"The entire thing has been thrilling," she said. "People are going to be amazed at what these students can do. I'm incredibly proud of the community they've built, their ability to inhabit the world of the play and to exemplify what I think is most important: That when people come together to create, they're powerful."

The PG-13 production of "We Will Rock You" will be at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, Feb. 28, to Saturday, March 2, and 2 p.m. Sunday, March 3, in Russell Auditorium. Tickets are \$15 for

general admission, senior citizens and GCSU faculty and staff; \$10 for non-GCSU students; and \$5 for GCSU students.



The High Museum of Art's African art collection is disproportionately representative of peoples and cultures of the modern-day nation of Nigeria, presenting the opportunity to position the institution as specialists in Nigerian art. To enrich and further contextualize this area of distinction, the African art department recently launched an initiative focused on collecting and exhibiting 20th century and modernist Nigerian art. Across subfields, art history has historically privileged male artists, making it difficult for contemporary scholars to access artwork and information about many of the women of artistically and sociopolitically important periods. This talk will engage the ways in which this occurs within Nigerian art scholarship and will profile underacknowledged Nigerian women artists of the previous century.

Lauren Tate Baeza is the Fred and Rita Richman Curator of African Art at the High Museum of Art. She previously served as Director of Exhibitions at the National Center for Civil and Human Rights, where she curated the Morehouse College Martin Luther King Jr. Collection and organized numerous temporary exhibits engaging the visual arts to address social issues. Baeza speaks, lectures, and consults at nonprofit organizations, universities, and federal departments on a range of cultural and sociopolitical topics related to Africa and the African diaspora. She is also the founder of the Lagos Atlanta Artist Residency and a contributing editor at Art Papers.



Chemistry, Physics & Astronomy chair publishes article on epidemic and detection of microplastics

Chemistry, Physics, & Astronomy, Department of: Friday February 23, 2024

Dr. Sayo Fakayode, chair of Georgia College & State University's Department of <u>Chemistry, Physics and Astronomy</u>, has a new peer-reviewed publication with the U.S. Foods and Drug Administration.

Fakayode was one of 14 scholarly authors from several universities across the United States who collaborated on "Microplastics:

Challenges, toxicity, spectroscopic and real-time detection methods.

The paper discusses the "global microplastic (MP) pollution epidemic" caused by increasing amounts of single-use plastics and the ineffective ways we dispose of garbage and recycle solid waste.

Microplastics have negatively impacted the ecosystem and public health, the group determined. But plastics remain in high demand for a variety of uses worldwide due to "their low cost, versatility, lightweight, low density, flexibility, high strength, and durability."

The article provides an in-depth survey of current literature about the toxicity and challenges of microplastics and looks into methods for detecting them, such as spectroscopic and real-time satellite imagery, unmanned aerial vehicles and aquatic drone technology.

In recent years, molecular spectroscopy methods like Near Infrared (NIR), Fourier Transform Infrared (FTIR), Raman and fluorescence spectroscopy for analysis of microplastics gained interest because of their fast results, low cost, accuracy and portability.

The collaborative paper discusses all these approaches, along with machine learning, microhyperspectral imaging and chemometrics, as well as challenges and possible answers for dealing with microplastics in the future.

New PAWS version and Banner 9 self-service modules testing

Information Technology (IT) is working to roll out a new version of PAWS (Banner Self Service). The University System of Georgia Information Technology Services (USG ITS) has mandated that all existing Banner 8 (PAWS) modules be discontinued effective March 30, 2024.

One of the requirements stipulated by USG ITS is institutions must configure their Banner version 9 solutions to use single-sign-on (SSO) and multifactor authentication (MFA). IT has configured this new Banner 9 self-service (PAWS) to utilize your Georgia College & State University credentials and DUO MFA authentication.

Blue tiles are still being worked on and configured. The green tiles work but may need some more configuration from IT and the functional areas. This new version of PAWS will include comparable Banner 9 modules to replace the Banner 8 modules. IT is also working on converting many of the custom reports into the new environment.

WWI propaganda posters at GCSU show efforts to recruit African American soldiers

Sallie Ellis Davis House: Monday February 26, 2024

During the remainder of Black History Month, the public is invited to see two authentic propaganda posters at Georgia College & State University that give a glimpse of life during World War I and America's efforts to recruit African American soldiers.



The posters—called "True Blue" and "Colored man is no slacker"— hang on the wall of a replicated classroom at Georgia College's <u>Sallie Ellis Davis House</u>. They reveal a time when African American men enlisted, answering the call to defend their country, but were often met with discrimination and put in segregated units.

"They would have been among the first kind of propaganda pieces that targeted the African American community," said Matt Davis, director of Historic Museums.

"It made sense for them to be hung at a school that had kids who were of age to go into the military," he said. "Sallie Ellis Davis had students who went to war, but we don't know if these posters were in her school at the time. They certainly would've been around Milledgeville."

<u>Sallie Ellis Davis</u> was a prominent educator, pillar and inspiration in Baldwin County's African American community. She earned her Normal School degree in 1899 at Atlanta University, then opened Eddy High School. In 1910, she and the school moved to the house that bears her name at 301 S. Clarke St., Milledgeville. She remained there until her death in 1950.

"Colored man is no slacker" shows a man embracing his sweetheart and saying good-bye. In the background, troops are seen marching off to war. It's similar to another war poster of that period, "Duty calls," in which a new white recruit says good-bye to his wife or girlfriend.

In the 1919 poster "True Blue," a young African American wife and three small children look at a portrait over the fireplace. It portrays a husband and father dressed in military uniform. A little higher on the wall to the left is a portrait of Abraham Lincoln, who emancipated the enslaved and was endeared in the Black community.

A little lower on either side are smaller pictures of George Washington and Woodrow Wilson, the U.S. President during WWI. In the South, "True Blue" was controversial. Many were offended by a Black man's picture placed above two white men. This poster wasn't widely distributed in the South for this reason, Davis said.

Copies of both posters are still found throughout the U.S. today. <u>"True Blue"</u> can be found at the Henry Ford Museum in Dearborn, Michigan. A copy of "<u>Colored man is no slacker</u>" is in

the Library of Congress in Washington D.C.

Later this spring, the posters will act as an educational springboard for students to get involved. Chemistry students concentrating in forensics will use scanning technology—a digital colorimeter—to detect light properties and types of ink and pigment, most likely toxic, that were used to make the posters.

Originally, the posters were hand drawn and most likely copied one-by-one using a lithograph press, said Matt Forrest, interim chair of the Georgia College Art Department.

Using data from chemistry students, art majors will recreate exact colors from the past. Then a limited-edition series of replicated posters will be printed on aluminum plates with non-toxic materials.

"This is a great dovetailing of art, chemistry and history," Forrest said, "and how the liberal arts experience taps into all these things and creates engagement with the community and a sharing of knowledge."

Tours at the Sallie Ellis Davis House are 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Wednesdays and Fridays and every first and third weekends: Saturdays 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. and Sundays, 2 to 4 p.m.. Tours start at the top of each hour; the last beginning at 4 p.m. Admission is \$3 for adults; \$2 for seniors, pre-booked groups and students. Children under age 6 are free.

The cohort-based nursing scholarship provides four-year funding for the cost of tuition and fees, housing, meals, textbooks, nursing program fees and one funded, healthcare-related study abroad.



"The Lettie Pate Whitehead Scholarship is a beacon of opportunity, empowering women in Central Georgia to obtain a nursing education without financial constraints," said Dr. Josie Doss, director of the School of Nursing. "This scholarship embodies a commitment to addressing the nursing shortage in Georgia, fostering academic success and nurturing the next generation of compassionate and skilled nursing professionals."

<u>Applications can be made online</u>, and applicants must be a resident of Georgia, and specifically from one of these counties: Baldwin, Bibb, Hancock, Houston, Jasper, Jones, Monroe, Putnam, Twiggs, Washington and Wilkinson.

The program is funded by the Lettie Page Whitehead Foundation, a scholarship program which provides funding for "deserving female students with financial need."

As part of requirements established by the Lettie Pate Whitehead Foundation, students must self-identify as Christian, demonstrate financial need, be accepted and enrolled at Georgia College and complete the FAFSA.

If the FAFSA fails to take special circumstances into account, an applicant may submit an essay demonstrating their financial need.

Once a part of the cohort, students will take part in a "living-learning community" on West Campus. Students are paired with upperclassmen in the program for unique mentorship opportunities. In addition, they take part in leadership retreats each semester.

"If a foundation like Lettie Pate Whitehead is interested in growing nurses and helping them financially," said program coordinator and Georgia College Associate Professor of Nursing Dr. Jennifer Goldsberry, "I think it's our responsibility to make sure that students know it's about giving back and paying it forward."

"That's the goal—to make an excellent public liberal arts education accessible to talented students from a wide range of social and economic backgrounds," Goldsberry said.
