



Rural Changemakers Lecture Series

Rural Studies Institute: Monday April 1, 2024

The Rural Studies Institute (RSI) is hosting our annual Rural Changemakers Lecture Series on April 16, 2024. We have two very exciting speakers, David R. Montgomery and Anne Biklé.

David R. Montgomery is a MacArthur Fellow and professor of geomorphology at the University of Washington. He is an internationally recognized geologist who studies the effects of geological processes on ecological systems and human societies. He is the author of several textbooks in his field and his work has been featured in documentary films, network and cable news, TV and radio including NOVA, PBS NewsHour, Fox and Friends and All Things Considered.

Anne Biklé is a science writer and public speaker drawing on her background in biology and environmental planning to explore humanity's tangled relationship with nature through the lens of agriculture, soil, and food. She is particularly enthralled with the botanical world and its influence on humanity throughout history. Her writing has appeared in digital and print magazines, newspapers and her work has been featured in radio and independent documentary films.

Anne and David are married and live in Seattle, Washington.

Reminder: Impact Your Teacher Effectiveness Ratings through the Objective Selection Form (OSF)

Center for Teaching & Learning: Tuesday April 2, 2024

The Objective Selection Form (OSF) opened March 14 for the spring 2024 semester through April 29. The OSF allows faculty to identify targeted learning objectives to measure teaching effectiveness and faculty response to the OSF drives summative results on the Student Rating of Instruction Survey (SRIS). The primary indicator of teaching effectiveness is how well students rate their progress on learning objectives that faculty mark as important or essential on the OSF. Since every course is different, this research-based instructor-driven model interprets teaching effectiveness based on indicators identified by the instructor. Most instructors, familiar with their course learning objectives, decide and mark the OSF in 10 minutes or less per course.

Theatre major earns prestigious national fellowship for work as a dramaturg

Theatre & Dance, Department of: Tuesday April 2, 2024

In February, senior theatre major Mary Morgan Collier of Athens, Georgia, competed and won the <u>Region IV Student Dramaturg Award</u> from Literary Managers and Dramaturgs of the Americas and the <u>Kennedy Center American College Theatre Festival</u>.

Region IV is one of eight regions for the competition, so eight winners are chosen annually.

From there, a panel of experts selected Collier as a national finalist for Region 4 and recipient of a LMDA/KCACTF Dramaturgy Fellowship for her dramaturgical work on last spring's Georgia College & State University musical production, "Head Over Heels."



One of only four students in the nation to receive this honor—Collier now heads to the Kennedy Center in Washington D.C. for the <u>LMDA/KCACTF National Festival</u> April 22-26. There, she'll network with professional dramaturgs and participate in workshops, master classes, presentations, discussions and staged readings.

As a national dramaturgy fellow, Collier will have additional opportunities to participate at the O'Neill Playwrights' Conference in September in Waterford, Connecticut; the New Harmony Project in Indianapolis, Indiana; and the Playwright's Center in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

This is the second year in a row, a <u>Georgia College & State University</u> student has won this esteemed fellowship.

"This shows the impressive level of student talent we have at Georgia College," said Dr. Amy Pinney, associate professor of <u>theatre</u>. "This is a big deal. This means Mary Morgan's work as a student dramaturg is one of the strongest and most promising in the entire country."

To participate in the LMDA/KCACTF regional and national theatre festivals, an undergraduate or graduate student must have worked as a dramaturg in a full theatre production, class assignment or new play workshop.

Dramaturgs do primary research as part of a theatre production team.

They work alongside actors and stage management developing new playscripts, giving support and offering advice. They help put plays into historical and culture context, while providing ideas for new approaches, audience engagement, data collection and

technological innovation.

About 18,000 dramaturgy students from colleges and universities across the U.S. compete at the <u>regional festival</u> each year. It gives them a chance to develop and improve theatre skills, experiment with new ideas and have their work professionally critiqued.

Collier presented her work at the LMDA/KCACTF regional competition in February, held at Albany State University. As dramaturg last spring for "Head Over Heels," a musical comedy about the Go-Go's, Collier read and researched the screenplay, styled on Greek drama. She collected facts about rock-n-roll and punk music. She also created separate information packets for characters the actors played.

Collier presented her research to the actors, stage managers and backstage crew, so everyone understood the play in historical and cultural context.

This semester, Collier is directing a drama production, called "The Feast," April 3-6, at the Campus Blackbox Theatre. After commencement in May, she plans to pursue a Master in Fine Arts degree for theatre.

"To be chosen for a national dramaturg fellow is just extraordinary," Pinney said. "I am consistently impressed with the work Mary Morgan has accomplished during her time here. I expect her career to be exceptional."



"Philosophy's Failure in the Face of Slavery." A special talk with Robert Bernasconi

The rejection of slavery by the major European powers early in the 19th century was the result of a moral invention of an unprecedented character and yet, until recently, there was almost no mention of any aspect of slavery in histories of ethics or of political philosophy. This was in spite of the fact that questions surrounding the legitimacy and practice of slavery were a regular part of moral philosophy courses at universities from the 16th century until its abolition. At a time when many institutions of higher learning are reflecting on their complicity with chattel slavery in terms of the sources of their funding and their use of slave labor, academic philosophy as an institution must come to terms with the fact that at various key historical moments it continued to justify slavery, even when slavery was under attack in society at large. This talk outlines what needs to be done to meet this challenge.

Robert L. Bernasconi is Edwin Erle Sparks' professor of <u>Philosophy</u> and African American Studies at <u>Pennsylvania State University</u>. He is founding co-editor of the Journal Critical Philosophy of Race and is the author of numerous articles in that area. He has also written two book on Heidegger and Satre.



Antoinette Reames Art. Love. Vibez

In this exhibit, viewers will see themes that can relate to any individual, not only those accustomed to professional art. Art. Love. Vibez. invites individuals from any background to experience these artworks, drawing together the diverse community that Antoinette Reames's heart is clearly tied to. Her presence within the Milledgeville community is noticeable through her work coaching youth basketball, being a member of the city council, and connecting to locals through her tattooing. Antoinette's heart for the community and art have collided in this show and created something that will have a lasting effect on the hearts of those who are lucky enough to witness it.



The exhibit takes place Thursday, April 11, from 5 until 6:30 p.m. in the Underwood House.

Reames began her artistic career at Georgia College & State University where she majored in studio art and played for the women's basketball team as a student-athlete. After graduating and continuing to pursue her art career, she gave her first tattoo while in Florida. After this experience, she was inspired to study the craft herself. Setting up an at-home studio in her kitchen, she began her practice and over time grew a base of loyal clients. This growth led to the creation of her studio, Black Barby Ink, which in turn, made her the first African American woman to open a private tattoo studio in Milledgeville. Having put together a team of artists that focus on creating individual and unique artworks, Reames has allowed herself to focus on creating art outside of tattooing. During open hours, she paints in her studio, allowing clients to sit and watch her work, talking and sharing her love of art as her paintings come to fruition.

Outdoor Emergency Notification System Test Wednesday, April 3

Public Safety: Wednesday April 3, 2024

Georgia College & State University will test the Outdoor Emergency Notification System (siren system) Wednesday, April 3, 2024. This test is scheduled to occur the first Wednesday of every month between 10 a.m. and noon and will last approximately one minute. No action is required during the testing, and all campus operations should continue as normal. A message stating that this is a test will precede and follow the "alert" tone. In the case of an actual tornado warning, the message would advise of a tornado warning, and the tone would cycle through. This would be repeated every five minutes until the warning expires or is canceled, at which time an all clear message would sound. The audible system test will only be tested when clear sky conditions are present. Tests will not occur when skies are dark or severe weather is predicted for the area on the day the test is scheduled to occur. In this case, the test will be rescheduled for later in the month.

There are three sirens operated by GCSU in Baldwin County: one on West Campus and two on Main Campus.

This testing program is designed to maintain a reliable warning system and to meet recommended testing guidelines. Additionally, we want to maximize the effectiveness of the Outdoor Emergency Notification System. By performing these tests, we hope to enhance awareness and education regarding emergency preparedness at Georgia College and within the local community.

Call for applications

The Digital Humanities Collaborative invites Georgia College & State University faculty to submit applications for a fellowship to be awarded for the 2024-25 academic year. The fellowship in the amount of \$1,000 will be dispersed as professional development funds.

The fellowship provides support for faculty to pursue research or creative work with a digital component. The goal of the fellowship is to increase productivity in innovative digital scholarship at Georgia College.

The deadline to apply is May 17, 2024.

Selection criteria:

The proposed project should exhibit the potential to yield original results. We encourage proposals that foster student engagement through undergraduate research or community-based engaged learning. Applicants may be new to digital humanities, but those with some technical proficiency in using desired tools for the proposed project will be given special consideration.

Outcomes:

The fellow will deliver a public presentation of the project before the end of the fellowship term.

Eligibility:

Faculty in the College of Arts & Sciences in permanent, full-time, ongoing positions and all faculty in the Ina Dillard Russell Library are eligible to apply.

A single award of \$1,000 will be given to one faculty member. The award may not be split among a group of faculty.

The fellowship period will begin July 1, 2024, and end June 30, 2025.

The fellowship award will be determined by recommendations from the Digital Humanities Collaborative to the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences. The award decision will be announced to faculty applicants no later than May 31, 2024.

Application instructions:

To apply, submit a short curriculum vitae, a brief description of the proposed digital humanities project (500 words maximum), and statements about how the fellowship will advance your research interests and how it will impact your teaching.

Second Chance Reentry Simulation

Government & Sociology, Department of: Wednesday April 10, 2024

The Criminal Justice Program is conducting a reentry simulation Friday, April 12, from 10 a.m. until 12 p.m. in the Pat Peterson Museum Education Room in the library. This simulation was developed by the Department of Justice to simulate the struggles and challenges faced by individuals who are transitioning from incarceration back into society. Each participant assumes the identity of an ex-offender and receives a packet of materials explaining the reentrant's criminal background, current living situation, current job situation and the specific weekly tasks that must be accomplished in order to avoid the risk of being sent back to prison. The goal of this simulation is for participants to gain an understanding of the significant obstacles faced by men and women attempting to navigate the system upon their release from incarceration and returning home to their communities. All faculty, staff, students and the community-at-large are invited to participate. After the simulation, there will be an opportunity to discuss the complexities of the process and the obstacles returning citizens face with a panel of guests from the Offender Alumni Association and the University of Alabama at Birmingham.

All attendees must register as a participant or volunteer. Participants will take part in the simulation and have the opportunity to stay for the open discussion. Members of the volunteer team will assist with the simulation. The volunteer team can leave immediately after the end of the simulation or stay for the open discussion.

Thank you for encouraging students to complete the Student Rating of Instruction Survey (SRIS). We want to provide you with a few suggestions to consider to increase response rates with your students:

- Research and best practice consistently show that the most significant factor in increasing participation in online student rating surveys is for faculty to express and demonstrate how the results are essential and used in making meaningful course change(s).
- The next most influential factor is to set aside time to complete the survey(s).
- Evidence-based practice consistently shows that incentivizing students to complete the survey can increase response rates.

As a reminder, a 75% response rate is desirable, but 65% is the minimum for dependable results to be considered statistically significant.

Poem by MFA graduate has its day on Poem-A-Day website

A poem by alumn Miller Oberman, '06, was featured this week on the Poem-A-Day website.

Oberman received his <u>Masters in Fine Arts</u> in Creative Writing at Georgia College & State University.

"<u>The Centaur</u>" explores themes of fatherhood, gender and loss. It was featured on the Academy of American Poet's website, <u>poets.org</u>, Tuesday, April 9.



His first collection of poetry, "<u>The Unstill Ones</u>" was published in 2017 by Princeton University Press. His second collection, "Impossible Things," will be published by Duke University Press in October.

<u>Oberman</u> lives in Queens, New York, and is program director of First-Year Writing at the New School at Eugene Lang College.

Dr. Kerry Neville, program coordinator for Georgia College's MFA and undergraduate Creative Writing Programs, and Laura Newbern, associate professor of English, congratulated Oberman on this accomplishment.

Here is Oberman's poem, "The Centaur:"

First they called me "it," and then, ignorant of how my people use this word, they mashed up the meager nouns they had for gender and called me "the goy," and said to not be one or the other was to be nothing. It ate the grass it was shoved in, knelt at salt licks. It took the barbs and kicks and crushed them into fur and leather. Oiled and burnished, it made those halves into one galloping body. Horse and rider. The centaur endured the school-day, cruel gray rag, filth-stiffened. The boys and girls who fit so easily in their costumes looked like stick figures, crude and two dimensional.

Dante already knew, it read later. In The Inferno, in the seventh circle of hell, centaurs guard the river Phlegethon, one of Hades' five rivers. Phlegethon: river of fire, river of boiling blood, which boils forever the souls of those who commit violence against their neighbors. Centaurs guard the edges, shooting arrows at any of these sinners who try to move to the shallows.

When sometimes I wish I'd had a boyhood, I remember those days instead, my four muscled legs. I was seven feet tall then, riding myself, carrying myself. A centaur is never lonely.

Summer hours of operation: 2024 guidance and clarification

Human Resources, Office of: Thursday April 11, 2024

In preparation for the start of the summer schedule, which is Monday-Thursday 8 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. and Friday 8 a.m. to 12 p.m., beginning on May 6 and continuing through August 9, 2024, the Office of Human Resources and Payroll Services has outlined important information for guidance and procedural awareness:

30-Minute Lunches

Supervisors have the flexibility to work with their staff to modify lunch breaks up to one hour, as needed. If an additional 30 minutes are approved for lunch:

- 1. The employee will be required to work an additional 30 minutes to ensure the required hours are worked for the day; the 30 minutes can be added to the beginning or the end of the scheduled workday.
- 2. The full one-hour lunch break must be taken around the middle of the workday (ideally between 11 a.m. and 2 p.m.); the additional 30 minutes for lunch may not be taken at the beginning or end of the workday to allow for a later arrival or earlier departure.

Working Beyond Summer Operational Hours (Noon on Fridays and Weekends)

Departmental authorities can modify employee schedules as deemed appropriate to ensure commitments are met. Every effort will be made to accommodate scheduling needs using flextime before using compensatory time or overtime when circumstances arise:

- 1. Flextime: Modifications to work schedules should be requested by the employee and will be subject to approval by the supervisor and the VP of their respective area. See the attached document, Flextime Agreement for Summer 2024; this form must be completed for any employee requesting a modification to the standard summer hours. Any modifications to the standard summer work schedule must be documented in accordance with the Flextime, Compensatory Time and Overtime Policy.
- Compensatory time (comp. time): Employees are prohibited from working any hours
 outside of the scheduled workday unless a supervisor has authorized the unscheduled
 work in advance in accordance with USG policy. Bi-weekly paid employees must
 maintain accurate time records in OneUSG and comply with the established policy
 above.
- 3. Overtime: Only certain departments have been pre-approved to work overtime should the need exist. All other departments should follow the guidelines outlined above related to flextime and compensatory time.

- 1. All employees have work schedules within OneUSG. All work schedules will be changed by Payroll Services no later than May 6, 2024, to reflect the new summer work schedule. Any exceptions require a fully executed Flextime Agreement for Summer 2024 form on file with the Office of Human Resources, copied to Payroll Services.
 - Action item: Flextime Agreement for Summer 2024 forms must be submitted by all deadlines listed in the table at the end of the Flextime Agreement for Summer 2024 form to avoid inaccurate pay or leave balances.
- 2. For vacation and sick leave that has already been requested and approved, do not modify. All previously requested and approved vacation and sick leave should automatically change in the system once the schedules have been updated.
 - Action item: Please review after the change is made on May 6, 2024 to make sure that all requested leave for the summer is correct on your timesheet and approved.
 - *Please note that anything submitted prior to Payroll making the change to work schedules may need to be re-calculated to take effect. Please contact payroll@gcsu.edu AFTER May 6, 2024 if you do not see the correct hour calculation.
- 3. For the weeks in which holidays occur (Memorial Day, Juneteenth and Independence Day), the work week will revert to the regular hours of operation, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Therefore, submit any leave requests during these weeks based on the regular hours of operation.



Voices of the Returned: Life After Incarceration, a Digital Humanities Presentation

Digital Humanities Collaborative: Friday April 12, 2024

Please join us for a presentation of new research from the Digital Humanities Collaborative faculty fellow, Dr. Alesa Liles, Associate Professor of Criminal Justice on April 19, 11 a.m. to noon, in the Pat Peterson Museum Education Room in Russell Library.

The act of storytelling provides an outlet to express experiences in a safe environment. The individual has autonomy over their personal narrative, which ultimately allows for understanding and healing. In creating a podcast, returning citizens can reclaim their fundamental rights to dignity and autonomy and continue the process of trauma recovery and healing. In addition, "Voices of the Returned: Life After Incarceration," not only features justice impacted individuals, Season 2 features the incredible individuals and organizations assisting in



reentry support, many of whom were once incarcerated themselves. Each episode explores the hard-fought journeys to reestablishing and reclaiming lives, the difficulties returning to society with little support, and the hope for a better future.

These lived experiences are the things data cannot tell us. For students, this is what brings the textbook material to life. Students, as co-hosts, producers, writers, and research assistants, see and sometimes meet the person who was personally impacted by incarceration. They are also able to network with people and organizations doing the work they see themselves doing after graduation. Culminating Season 2 with the 2nd Annual Justice Week Reentry Simulation, students, faculty, staff, and community members are invited to walk in the shoes of newly released individuals. Afterward they are asked to join an open dialogue with special guests from justice impacted organizations and people. Through this simulation and dialogue, not only has the textbook come to life, but now the "Voices of the Returned" have faces and identities and real stories.



University System of Georgia Extends Test Optional Waiver

University Communications: Wednesday April 17, 2024

Atlanta — **April** 15, 2024



The University System of Georgia (USG) will continue its temporary waiver of test score requirements. With state colleges already test optional, this means no test scores will be required for admission at 23 of USG's 26 public colleges and universities during the Academic Year 2025-2026 (Fall 2025, Spring 2026 and Summer 2026).

The temporary waiver does not apply to the Georgia Institute of Technology, the University of Georgia and Georgia College & State University.

For Academic Year 2025-2026, the 23 remaining institutions will have two options for making admissions decisions:

- 1. <u>Freshman index</u>: Schools can use a formula that includes the student's high school grade point average and test scores for either the SAT or ACT.
- 2. Test-optional: Schools can use the student's grade point average on the required high school curriculum without a standardized test score at the following minimum grade point averages (GPA):
 - 3.4 GPA for research universities: Augusta University and Georgia State University.
 - 3.2 GPA for comprehensive universities: Kennesaw State University, Georgia Southern University, University of West Georgia and Valdosta State University.
 - 3.0 GPA for state universities: Albany State University, Clayton State University, Columbus State University, Fort Valley State University, Georgia Southwestern State University, Middle Georgia State University, Savannah State University and the University of North Georgia.
 - State colleges: Abraham Baldwin Agricultural College, Atlanta Metropolitan State College, College of Coastal Georgia, Dalton State College, East Georgia State College, Georgia Gwinnett College, Georgia Highlands College, Gordon State College and South Georgia State College will continue to be test-optional in accordance with Board of Regents policy.

Test-optional admission was additionally extended to the Dual Enrollment Program through Academic Year 2025-2026. This program provides Georgia high school students the opportunity to earn college credit alongside their high school diploma.

Test scores will continue to be required to apply for Zell Miller scholarships in accordance with state of Georgia requirements.

Chair of Caine Prize Judging Panel

I am thrilled to announce that I am going to be<u>chair of judges</u> for the 2024 Caine Prize for African Writing:

"This year's Chair of Judges is award-winning Nigerian author Chika Unigwe. Unigwe serves as a creative writing professor at Georgia College & State University. She is a prolific writer of both fiction and nonfiction, whose works have been translated into several languages. Her notable works include the award-winning novel "On Black Sisters' Street" and the short-story collection "Better Never Than Late." Her latest novel, "The Middle Daughter," is published by Canongate Books. In 2023, Unigwe was knighted into the Order of the Crown by the Belgian government in recognition of her contributions to literature."

The Caine Prize for African Writing is an annual <u>literary award</u> for the best <u>short story</u> by an <u>African writer</u>, whether in <u>Africa</u> or elsewhere, published in the <u>English language</u>. Founded in the United Kingdom in 2000, the £10,000 prize was named in memory of businessman and philanthropist Sir <u>Michael Harris Caine</u>,[1] former chairman of <u>Booker Group</u> and of the <u>Booker Prize</u> management committee.[2] The Caine Prize is sometimes called the "African Booker".[3] The Chair of the Board is <u>Ellah Wakatama</u>, appointed in 2019.[4]

The prize was first awarded in <u>2000</u>, to the <u>Sudanese</u> writer <u>Leila Aboulela</u> for her short story "The Museum," at the <u>Zimbabwe International Book Fair</u> in <u>Harare</u>. In its first year the Caine Prize attracted entries from 20 African countries.

The winner is announced at a dinner in July, formerly held in <u>Oxford</u> but most recently at <u>SOAS</u>, <u>University of London</u>,[6] to which the shortlisted candidates are all invited.

University System of Georgia Approves Tuition for 2024-2025 Academic Year

The Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia (USG) voted today to approve tuition rates for the 2024-25 academic year at USG's 26 public colleges and universities. Systemwide, in-state undergraduate tuition will increase by 2.5%, and out-of-state tuition will increase by 5%. A new, third level of tuition for out-of-country students will also be established at 2% more than the rate for out-of-state students.

This comes as the Board kept tuition flat at all but one USG institution for six of the past eight years. Escalating costs for people, goods and services, increased competition from the private sector for talent and overall inflation have all contributed to growing pressure on institutional budgets, resulting in today's decision.

USG's strong commitment to keeping college affordable for students in Georgia has meant average tuition increases for an undergraduate, in-state Georgia student over the past eight years have been less than 1%, well below the rate of inflation.

Two years ago, thanks to the support of Governor Brian Kemp and the Georgia General Assembly, the board was able to eliminate a mandatory Special Institutional Fee that students had been charged systemwide since 2009. The fee had been established during the Great Recession to provide financial support to maintain high-quality academic programs and operations during the reductions in state funding.

Coming at the same time as tuition was held flat, the fee's elimination reduced college costs starting with the 2022-23 academic year and saved students anywhere between \$340 to \$1,088 for the year, depending on the institution they attended.

"Maintaining affordability is one of the highest priorities of the university system and the Board of Regents," USG Chancellor Sonny Perdue said. "We are a good deal for Georgians, and we have worked to protect that value particularly for our Georgia undergraduates as we balance affordability with institutional sustainability and academic quality. Our institutions face increasing costs to operate, and we must sustain their momentum as some of the best in the nation at helping students succeed on campus and in the workforce."

Among the 16 Southern Regional Education Board (SREB) states, Georgia is the third lowest in average undergraduate tuition and required fees compared to its public peers, according to national data from the College Board. College Board data also ranks USG as the sixth lowest in average tuition and fees compared to its peers across the nation, making USG institutions an excellent value for Georgia students and families.

Middle Georgia State University, the only institution to raise tuition during the last academic year, will also be finishing the last of a three-year plan to align its undergraduate tuition with other universities in the same academic sector.

The board today additionally approved changes to the mandatory fee structure at 20 of USG's 26 institutions to address the significant growth in the number of students taking classes via fully online course delivery.

The approved structure means fully online students will be charged an online learning fee equivalent to their institution's technology fee, as well as 50% of their institution's mandatory fees.

This change provides more consistency to the institutional fees for all students. Mandatory fees support and enhance campus programming and student-focused activities, technology and athletic programs – all critical components to the college experience.

Student affordability remains a priority of the Board and USG. Similar to many Georgia families, institutions are experiencing rising costs of goods and services to include escalating costs for technology, software, food, utilities and insurance. Labor costs are also escalating. Additionally, at the start of the COVID-19 pandemic in FY21, the university system sustained a budget reduction of \$230 million.





Mr. Thurmond is former member of the Georgia General Assembly and the first African American elected to a statewide office without prior appointment. He also served as superintendent of Schools for Dekalb County. Thurmond was raised as a sharecropper's son in Clarke County, Georgia. Tennis offers a holistic approach to physical and mental well-being, making it an excellent choice for athletes seeking comprehensive development and enjoyment in sports! Some of the physical and psychological reasons to play tennis include:

Physical Benefits:

- It improves aerobic fitness, burns fat, and enhances cardiovascular health.
- Develops anaerobic fitness through intense bursts of activity followed by rest.
- Enhances acceleration, speed, leg strength, body coordination, gross and fine motor control, agility, dynamic balance, and cross-training benefits.
- Strengthens bones, boosts the immune system, and promotes healthy nutritional habits, eye-hand coordination, and flexibility.

Psychological Benefits:

- Develops a strong work ethic and discipline.
- Encourages effective management of mistakes, competition, responsibility, adversity, stress, recovery, strategic planning, and problem-solving skills.

Tennis and other sports are proven stress-relievers for all ages, but college students should think about the benefits of exercise and play as final exams are only a week away! There is no doubt about the positive influence of sports on young people Many students and the parents of young children take to the fields or courts to exercise regularly, so why not start competing later? When you or your child is involved in any sport and competing regularly, things may go wrong sometimes, and one reason is setting the bar too high.

Unrealistically high goals and expectations can be stressful for you as a young person, and for younger children, leading to negative consequences. So, how do you know when you (or your child) are stressed out?

Stress is expressed with various symptoms in behavior and health.

Behavior symptoms include isolation, aggressiveness, not wanting to participate in activities, "phobias" and insomnia.

Health (physical) symptoms can include pain in the abdomen (stomach), chest pain, dyspnea and frequent vomiting.

It's essential to notice when the above changes appear so you can be honest with yourself, or have a friendly conversation with your child to let them know they have their full support and that they shouldn't feel guilty for "not meeting your expectations."

Here are some tips to help you, or your young athlete, feel stress-free:

- 1. Lower expectations.
- 2. Be supportive and understanding.
- 3. Show faith in your/their skills.
- 4. Let your child play!

Remember, your (or your child's) well-being is more important than their ranking or performance points. When searching for a sport to help support mental health, tennis is an excellent choice, as recognized by world-renowned scientists from various disciplines; there is no doubt that tennis is one of the best sports for you to play.

Bobcats earn No. 6 seed in Peach Belt Conference Softball Tournament

AUGUSTA, Ga. | Georgia College & State University has qualified for the 2024 Peach Belt Conference Softball Tournament that will begin play Friday (April 26).



The Bobcats (27-26 overall, 10-14 Peach Belt) will be the No. 6 seed and face No. 3 seed Lander University in their first game of the tournament Friday (April 26) at 5 p.m. at Cougar Field in Columbus, Georgia.

For the second consecutive season, the PBC Tournament will play over two weekends. The opening weekend of the event will be played at two sites and hosted by No. 1-seed University of North Georgia and No. 2 seed Columbus State University.

The No. 4 (Flagler College), No. 5 (University of South Carolina-Aiken) and No. 8 (Augusta University) seeds will play at UNG with the No. 3 (Lander), No. 6 (GCSU) and No. 7 (Georgia Southwestern State University) seeds at Columbus State. Each site will be a four-team double-elimination bracket with two games Friday (April 26), three Saturday (April 27) and one or two Sunday (April 28). The remaining teams from each site will then meet for a best-of-three championship series May 3-4 at the highest remaining seed. This format mirrors the NCAA regional format.

You can continue to use your card after the above date with the understanding that those charges will be posted against your FY2024 budget.

Bobcats bag four All-PBC honors

Athletics: Monday April 29, 2024

COLUMBUS, Ga. | Four Georgia College & State University softball players brought home All-Peach Belt Conference awards, including the program's first Freshman of the Year.



<u>Karlie Gutierrez</u> swiped two conference awards as she was named the PBC Freshman of the Year presented by College Ave. Student Loans and was named to the All-PBC second team.

In her freshman campaign, Gutierrez swung the hot stick with a .414 batting average with seven doubles, four triples and 12 home runs to bring around 57 RBI with a slugging percentage of .766. She ranks fourth in the conference and 49th nationally in batting average. Gutierrez sits atop the conference rankings in RBI and triples at the number two spot adding a 21st national ranking in RBI.

Gutierrez is the first Peach Belt Freshman of the Year in the GCSU softball program history.

Kam Caldwell was the lone Bobcat to nab a All-Peach Belt first team mention after a hot offensive season. The third baseman had 60 hits on the season to muster a .411 batting average which is third best in the conference. Good for fourth in the conference, she had 14 doubles while also adding a triple and two home runs to account for 17 multi-base hits. Caldwell also added 26 RBI and a slugging percentage of .562. With an on base percentage of .479, she was able to swipe 25 stolen bases on the year to lead the Peach Belt and rank 17th nationally. Caldwell marks the 13th All-PBC first-team selection in program history.

Emily Hobbs snagged an All-PBC second team bid after a stellar season. Hobbs had 68 knocks this season to account for a .370 batting average to score 54 runs and drive in 37 RBI in the leadoff spot. She has 13 doubles, a triple and 12 home runs to account for a .647 slugging percentage. Hobbs accumulated a .417 on base percentage leading to her going a perfect 20-for-20 on stolen bases. In the conference Hobbs ranks first in hits good for 30th nationally and fourth in stolen bases. She also ties Gutierrez as third in the PBC in home runs.

Mackenzie Martin rounds out the all-conference winners with a second-team bid. Martin has 50 hits on the season to bring her to a .327 batting average. She had six two base knocks and two triples to lead her to a .392 slugging percentage. Martin was able to find her way on base for the Bobcats giving her a .392 on-base percentage. She also one of two players in the Peach Belt with a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage along with Gutierrez.

With these four all-conference winners this brings the programs total to 62 and the first since the 2022 season. This is the first All-PBC honor for each recipient.



COLUMBUS, Ga. | Four Georgia College & State University women's tennis players were honored by the Peach Belt Conference Thursday (April 25) evening at its tournament banquet.



<u>Jada Young</u> and <u>Chiara Santoro</u> were named to All-PBC first team in singles, while Young teamed up with <u>Ashton Morrison</u> to be named to the All-PBC first team in doubles. <u>Ashley Bentz</u> was also honored by the league as its co-Freshman of the Year along with Flagler College's Toni Pfeiffer.

It is the second All-Peach Belt nod in singles for both Santoro and Young, who were both named to the second team in 2023. It is also the second All-PBC laurel for Young and Morrison in doubles as they were named to the second team a year ago. Bentz is just the third GCSU women's tennis player to be honored as Freshman of the Year in the history of the Peach Belt and the first since Mia Paavilainen earned the accolade in 2003.

GCSU earns No. 2 seed, will host PBC Baseball Tournament this weekend

Athletics: Tuesday April 30, 2024

AUGUSTA, Ga. | Georgia College & State University has qualified for the 2024 Peach Belt Conference Baseball Tournament that will begin play Friday (May 3).



The Bobcats (28-20 overall, 18-9 Peach Belt) will be the No. 2 seed and host part of the tournament at John Kurtz Field.

For the second consecutive season, the PBC Tournament will play over two weekends. The opening weekend of the event will be played at two sites and hosted by No. 1-seed Lander University and No. 2 seed GCSU.

The No. 4 (Georgia Southwestern State University), No. 5 (Flagler College) and No. 8 (University of South Carolina-Aiken) seeds will play at Lander with the No. 3 (Columbus State University), No. 6 (University of North Georgia) and No. 7 (Augusta University) seeds at GCSU. Each site will be a four-team, double-elimination bracket with two games Friday (May 3), three Saturday (May 4) and one or two Sunday (May 5). The remaining teams from each site will then meet for a best-of-three championship series May 9-10 at the highest remaining seed. This format mirrors the NCAA regional format.

The Bobcats will open the tournament against Augusta at 2 p.m. Friday (May 3), while Columbus State and North Georgia will close out the day at 6 p.m.

Tickets are \$10 per person and must be purchased online in advance at https://peachbeltconference.org/sports/2020/10/14/tickets.aspx. Children ages five and under, and students with a valid ID from a PBC school are admitted free.
