Don't miss it: Chris Greer's "View Finders" airing now on PBS

College of Education: Thursday May 2, 2024

UPDATE: Chris Greer and co-host Paul Daniel are currently filming <u>Season 3 of View Finders</u>. The Athens Banner-Herald recently published a story about Greer and the show, which you can <u>read here</u>.



From May 2024:

We told you about it in February, but now the time is here.

Starting in mid-May on the <u>Public Broadcasting Service</u> channel, <u>View Finders</u>—a unique travel program about the beauty of Georgia created by Georgia College & State University Professor of Instructional Technology Chris Greer—will air to more than 55 million homes nationally.

American Public Television, the APT, picked up Greer's second season of View Finders for distribution to PBS markets throughout the United States. The show will also appear on the PBS Create TV channel. The show already had two popular seasons on Georgia Public Broadcasting.

The show was just nominated—for the second time—for a <u>Southeast</u> <u>Emmy Award</u>. It didn't win the first time, but fingers crossed for this next round.

View Finders is about two photographers who capture startlingly amazing photos and video at iconic locations in the state of Georgia. Greer has also published two books of his photography, "Georgia Discovered: Exploring the Best of the Peach State" and "Naturally Georgia: From the Mountains to the Coast."

"There has never been a show that combines photography, travel, adventure and music. I thought the combination would be really intriguing

to a wide range of audiences, and it has really been well-received," Greer said, "Plus, the educational component of every episode really aligns nicely with my role as a professor in Georgia College's College of Education."

GPB's season one with co-finder Jason Clemmons included five episodes: Cumberland Island, Blood Mountain, Northern & Southern Chattahoochee and Okefenokee Swamp.

Season two—with co-finder Paul Daniel—is filled with more of Georgia's natural magnificence and ecology. It highlights eight locations in 10 shows: Amicalola Falls and the Len Foote Hike Inn, Cloudland Canyon, Georgia's Hidden Coast: Part I & Part II, Savannah and Beyond, Blue Ridge Parkway Part I & Part II, Sapelo Island, Tallulah Gorge and Pisgah National Forest.

The second season features dramatic scenery, like a floating sand dollar against a fiery-orange sunset and a pathway strewn with trees draped in Spanish moss.

Both seasons feature music by Georgian musicians. Each episode also begin with appropriately outdoorsy, great quotes, like this one from episode 10, Season Two, for Pisgah National Forest, North Carolina: "And into the forest I go to lost my mind and find my soul," by John Muir.

This summer, Greer begins filming the third season of View Finders with Daniels. Its episodes will explore beyond the boundaries of Georgia—great scenic sites from across the U.S. like the Pacific Northwest and states throughout New England.

"We have really covered Georgia quite well," Greer said, "and the audience loves the combination of scenery, humor, education, and music. We look forward to using this same formula on a national scale and cannot wait for the entire United States to experience this show."

Flannery O'Connor Institute for the Humanities Announces winner of Jean M. and William C. Laidlaw Junior Scholar Fellowship

O'Connor Institute: Thursday May 2, 2024

Georgia College & State University's Flannery O'Connor Institute for the Humanities, which is dedicated to the study of Flannery O'Connor, proudly announces Alex Taylor as the inaugural recipient of the Jean M. and William C. Laidlaw Junior Scholar Fellowship. Taylor, a Ph.D. candidate in Literature and fellow for Criticism at the University of Dallas, brings a wealth of experience and expertise. He previously participated in the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) Summer Institute, "Reconsidering Flannery O'Connor," held at Georgia College in June 2023 and is working on a



dissertation titled "Unreal Cities: The Political Vision of Evelyn Waugh and Flannery O'Connor."

Mr. Taylor's research explores the political dimensions of authors Evelyn Waugh and Flannery O'Connor. According to Jordan Cofer, the institute's interim executive director, Taylor's dissertation and his research interests, "offer a promising interdisciplinary approach to the field, which was why his application was so compelling."

The Jean M. and William C. Laidlaw Junior Scholar Fellowship, founded by Mike and Wendy Laidlaw, represents a commitment to supporting emerging scholars dedicated to advancing the study of Flannery O'Connor's literary legacy. According to Mr. Laidlaw, "I am delighted to learn that Alex Taylor will be the inaugural recipient of the Jean M. And William C. Laidlaw Junior Scholar Fellowship. My mother and father, for whom this scholarship is named, and themselves avid readers, would warm quickly to this pairing of things literary and matters political. Mom taught American and British literature for many years; dad was a civil engineer/politician. My enthusiastic congratulations, Alex!" This fellowship

will allow Taylor to continue his research, working both in the Special Collections of the Ina Dillard Library as well as exploring the archives of Andalusia, the historic home of Flannery O'Connor and the new Interpretative Center as well.

Six Bobcats earn All-Peach Belt accolades

Athletics: Friday May 3, 2024

AUGUSTA, Ga. | Six Georgia College & State University baseball players were honored by the Peach Belt Conference on the eve of the 2024 PBC Baseball Tournament.



<u>Braeden Smith</u>, <u>Matthew Mebane</u>, <u>Gabriel Wuerth</u>, <u>Brandon Bellflower</u> and <u>John Luke Glanton</u> were named to the All-PBC first team, while <u>Lex Kenny</u> was a second team honoree. It was Bellflower's fourth All-PBC honor of his career, joining Columbus State University's Brad Bouras (1998-2001) as the league's only four-time, all-conference honoree for baseball. It is the first All-Peach Belt selection for the other Bobcats.

Smith was also named the league's Freshman of the Year presented by College Ave. Student Loans. Smith becomes the third Bobcat to earn the top freshman honor in the history of PBC baseball. He is also the fourth GCSU athlete to be named Freshman of the Year in their sport during the 2023-24 season, joining Daniel Laird (men's cross country), Ashley Bentz (women's tennis) and Karlie Gutierrez (softball).

Smith, a freshman first baseman from Statham, Georgia, started all 49 games for the Bobcats. He has batted .356 (64-of-180) with 17 doubles, three triples, four home runs and drove in 43 runs. Smith scored 45 runs, slugged .550 and had an .478 on-base percentage with three stolen bases. He is currently ranked 28th in NCAA Division II statistics in walks (28) and 46th in doubles. Smith is currently third in the league in doubles and triples, fourth in doubles per game (0.35), fifth in on-base percentage, sixth in walks and seventh in walks per game (0.82). Smith was selected the league's Freshman of the Week once on March 4.

Bellflower, a senior right fielder from Milledgeville, Georgia, started all 49 games. Bellflower has batted .362 (71-of-196) with 21 doubles, nine homers and drove in 41 runs, which scoring 50 runs. He slugged .607 and had a .469 on-base percentage with five stolen bases. Bellflower is sixth in

Division II in doubles, 20th in doubles per game (0.43), and 38th in hits. Bellflower leads the PBC in doubles and doubles per game, seventh in hits and total bases (119) and 10th in hits per game (1.45).

Wuerth, a sophomore from Woodstock, Georgia, split the 49 games he started between second base and shortstop this season. Wuerth currently leads the Bobcats in batting average (.398, 82-of-206). He also had 14 doubles, three home runs and drove in 35 runs. Wuerth slugged .510 and had a .454 on-base percentage to go along with his 10 stolen bases and 51 runs scored. Wuerth is ranked fourth in NCAA Division II statistics in hits and 12th in hits per game (1.67). He is listed as No. 1 in the Peach Belt in hits and hits per game, second in batting average, seventh in doubles, sacrifices (5) and toughest to strikeout (10.3) and ninth in runs scored.

Mebane, a junior from Dublin, Georgia, started all 49 games at third base for GCSU. He has batted .320 (66-of-206) and led the Bobcats with 15 home runs. Mebane also collected 14 doubles and drove in a team-leading 54 RBI, while slugging .607 and an on-base percentage of .397. Mebane also scored 49 runs and stole three bases. He ranked 28th in NCAA Division II in home runs, 38th in total bases (125) and 50th in home runs per game (0.31). Mebane is third in the PBC in total bases, fourth in home runs and home runs per game, fifth in RBI and RBI per game (1.12) and seventh in doubles. Mebane was honored as the league's Player of the Week on March 25.

Glanton, a sophomore right-handed pitcher from Metter, Georgia, started all 13 of his appearances on the mound. Glanton is currently 8-4 on the season with a 2.50 earned-run average with four complete games and two shared shutouts. In 90 innings pitched, Glanton has allowed 81 hits and 25 earned runs, while striking out 49 and walking just 15. Opponents are just hitting .239 against Glanton in 2024. He is eighth in NCAA Division II statistics in games started, 12th in complete games, 23rd in wins, 24th in ERA, 25th in walks allowed per nine innings (1.50) and 32nd in walks plus hits per inning (1.07). Glanton tops the league in complete games, ERA, and wins, second in games started, WHIP and walks allowed per nine innings, sixth in hits allowed per nine innings (8.10) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.27). Glanton was named the PBC Pitcher of the Week April 29.

Kenny, a sophomore right-handed pitcher from Canton, Georgia, started two of the 17 games he appeared in for GCSU. Kenny is currently 4-2 with a team-high four saves and a shared shutout. In 46.2 innings pitched, he has allowed 48 hits and 19 earned runs, while striking out 42 and walking just 18. Opponents are hitting just .264 against Kenny this season. Kenny is second in the Peach Belt in saves. Kenny was twice named the league's Pitcher of the Week (Feb. 5, March 18) this season.



AUGUSTA, Ga. | Georgia College & State University will host Flagler College later this week in the Peach Belt Conference Baseball Championship Series.



The second-seeded Bobcats (32-20) and the fifth-seeded Saints (29-22) each won their opening round bracket to advance to the best-of-three championship series at John Kurtz Field, on the GCSU campus. The winner of the PBC Championship Series will earn the league's automatic berth to the NCAA Division II Tournament.

First pitch for game one is set for 6 p.m. Thursday (May 9) with game two scheduled for 2 p.m. Friday (May 10). If a deciding third game is necessary it will be 45 minutes affter the completion of game two..

GCSU will be making its ninth appearance in a PBC Tournament baseball final. The Bobcats dropped PBC title games in 1994, 1995, 1997 and 2006 before claiming tournament titles in 2013 (University of Montevallo 3-2), 2015 (Armstrong State University 10-6), 2017 (University of North Carolina at Pembroke 6-5) and 2018 (University of South Carolina-Aiken 7-5). This will be the first appearance for Georgia College since the tournament title went to a best-of-three format.

The Bobcats swept the regular-season series with the Saints in 2024, winning the three games played in mid-March in Milledgeville. GCSU leads the all-time series with Flagler 26-21, with the Bobcats holding a 12-3 lead in games played at John Kurtz Field since 2013. GCSU has won the only

meeting between the two teams in the PBC Tournament with a 14-0 decision in seven innings at the 2017 tournament in Florence, South Carolina.

Tickets are \$10 per person and must be purchased online in advance at https://peachbeltconference.org/sports/2020/10/14/tickets.aspx. Children ages five and under, and students with a valid ID from a PBC school are admitted free.





Mebane walks it off as GCSU wins PBC Tournament 5-4 over Flagler

MILLEDGEVILLE, Ga. | Matthew Mebane sent a 3-2 pitch over the left field wall in the bottom of the ninth inning for a two-run homer and gave Georgia College & State University a 5-4 victory over Flagler College in game two



The Bobcats won their fifth PBC Tournament title and first since 2018 as they won the best-of-three series with the Saints 2-0. GCSU, which won sixth game in a row to improve to 34-20, earns the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Division II Tournament, which begins on campus sites Thursday (May 16). The Bobcats, who will be making their 15th appearance in the NCAA tournament, will find out their opponent and where they will play when the NCAA holds its selection show at 10 p.m. Sunday (May 12) on NCAA.com. The Saints ended their season at 29-24 and it was also the final game for Flagler head coach Dave Barnett, who is retiring after 37 years in the dugout.

Flagler jumped out to a 3-0 lead with three runs in the fourth inning as All-PBC tournament performer Matthew Burke singled to center before Bryce Fitzgerald drove in two more with a double to left-center field.

The Saints expanded their lead to 4-0 as All-PBC Tournament performer Jesse Sullivan added a solo home run - his fourth of the season - to left-center field.

The Bobcats cut the deficit in half as they scored twice in the bottom of the eighth inning off All-PBC Tournament performer Cooper Smith (8-5). Cam McNearney started the one-out rally with a double to center before scoring on Mason Poole's double to left-center field. Poole later scored on a Gabriel Wuerth's single to center. That extended Wuerth's hitting streak to 24 games.

After GCSU reliever Owen Thomas (2-2) worked a scoreless top of the ninth, the Bobcats rallied in their half of the inning. Braeden Smith singled to right and moved to third on All-PBC Tournament performer Brandon Bellflower's single to right field. Braeden Smith later scored on a Cooper Smith's throwing error trying to pick him off at third base. Mebane, who was named to the Most Vaulable Player of the PBC Tournament, connected on a two-run homer - his 17th of the season - to left field to secure the win for the Bobcats.

Braeden Smith and McNearney had two hits apiece as the Bobcats, who won their second game this season out of 18 after eight innings, collected 10 hits, including seven in the eighth and ninth innings.

John Luke Glanton and Mitch Cowan were also named to the All-Peach Belt Tournament team for the Bobcats.

GCSU earns No. 7 seed in Southeast Regional

Athletics: Monday May 13, 2024

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind. | Georgia College & State
University has earned an automatic berth to the
2024 NCAA Division II Baseball Championship by virtue
of winning the Peach Belt Conference Tournament.



It is the 15th time in program history that the Bobcats have qualified for the NCAA postseason. GCSU last qualified for the 2018 tournament.

Baseball is the first GCSU team to earn a berth in their respective NCAA tournament this season.

The Bobcats are one of 56 teams that have been selected to play in the championship. Eight regional sites hosting three teams and eight regional sites hosting four teams, for a total of 16 regional sites. All regionals are double-elimination tournaments and will be played Thursday through Sunday (May 16-19).

Georgia College, which won the PBC Tournament for the fifth time in program history, earned the No. 7 seed from the Southeast region. The Bobcats (34-20) will travel to Tigerville, South Carolina, for Southeast Regional No. 2. GCSU will join No. 2 seed North Greenville University (41-12), No. 3 seed University of Mount Olive (37-16) and No. 6 seed Wingate University (33-23).

GCSU will open the regional against North Greenville, which earned an atlarge berth out of Conference Carolinas, Thursday (May 16) at 6 p.m. at Ray & Bea Dilliard Field at Ashmore Park. Mount Olive, which earned an atlarge berth out of Conference Carolinas, will face off against Wingate, the automatic qualifier from the South Atlantic Conference, at 2 p.m. The regional continues with two games Friday (May 17) and Saturday (May 18). The championship game is set for 6 p.m. Saturday (May 18) with an if-necessary game Sunday (May 19).

All tickets to the public will be general admission and tickets are day passes. Tickets are \$10 for adults, \$5 for children ages 10 and under, and free for children under the age of three.

In the other half of the region bracket, No. 1 seed Catawba College (40-14) will host the Southeast Regional No.1 in Salisbury, North Carolina. No. 4 seed University of North Carolina at Pembroke (42-12) and No. 5 seed Young Harris College (39-13) are the other teams earning berths. UNC Pembroke won the Conference Carolinas tournament, while Catawba earned an at-large berth from the South Atlantic Conference. Young Harris earned an at-large berth from Conference Carolinas.

Winners from the two Southeast brackets will advance to the super regionals, slated for May 24-25. Super regional winners will advance to the double-elimination championship finals June 1-8 at the USA Baseball National Training Complex in Cary, North Carolina. The finals will be hosted by the University of Mount Olive and the town of Cary, North Carolina.

Gutierrez nabs yet another honor after stellar freshman campaign

GREENWOOD, S.C.- Georgia College & State University catcher Karlie Gutierrez has been named to the Division II Conference Commissioners Association All-Southeast Region second team. This is the second All-Southeast Region award for Gutierrez this season.



Gutierrez had a superb offensive freshman campaign, accumulating a .414 batting average and a .764 slugging percentage. With 65 hits and 15 walks, the Newnan, Georgia, native mustered a .469 on-base percentage. Gutierrez had the hot stick on the Bobcat offense leading the team in home runs and triples with 14 and four respectively. She also had eight doubles with 64 runs batted in and 42 runs scored.

In three categories, Gutierrez is ranked in the top 50 nationally. Notably, she is ranked eighth in NCAA Division II statistics in RBI per game (1.28) and 18th in RBI. She is 36th in slugging percentage. Gutierrez capped off her freshman campaign holding 10 top-five spots in Peach Belt Conference statistics, including the top batting average. She also holds the top spot in RBI per game.

Gutierrez, who was named the PBC Freshman of the Year, to the All-PBC second team, as well as the National Fastpitch Coaches Association All-Southeast Region second team, is the first player to be named to an all-region team since the 2019 season when Bobcat catcher Haley Howell was named to the second team.

Four Bobcats named to NCBWA Division II All-Region teams

Athletics: Thursday May 16, 2024

SALISBURY, N.C. | Four Georgia College & State University baseball players were honored by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association on the eve of the 2024 NCAA Division II Southeast Regional No. 2.



<u>Gabriel Wuerth</u> was named to the NCBWA Division II All-Southeast Region first team, while <u>John Luke Glanton</u>, <u>Brandon Bellflower</u> and <u>Matthew Mebane</u> were second team honorees. It was the first all-region nod for the quartet.

Wuerth, a sophomore from Woodstock, Georgia, split the 54 games he started between second base and shortstop this season. Wuerth, who was named to the All-Peach Belt Conference first team, currently is second for the Bobcats in batting average (.377, 87-of-231). He also had 14 doubles. three home runs and drove in 36 runs. Wuerth, who currently has a team-high 24-game hitting streak, has slugged .476 and has a .431 on-base percentage to go along with his 11 stolen bases and 54 runs scored. Wuerth is ranked eighth in NCAA Division II statistics in hits and 19th in hits per game (1.61). He is listed No. 1 in the Peach Belt in hits, second in hits per game, fifth in batting average, and eighth in sacrifices (5) and toughest to strikeout (10.0).

Bellflower, a senior right fielder from Milledgeville, Georgia, started all 54 games. Bellflower, who was named to the All-PBC first team and only the second baseball player in the league to be named to the all-league team for the fourth time, leads GCSU with a .380 batting average (81-of-213) with 22 doubles,10 homers and drove in 43 runs, while scoring 60 runs. He has slugged .624 and has a .489 on-base percentage with five stolen bases. Bellflower is 11th in Division II in doubles, 23rd in hits, and 28th in doubles per game (0.41). Bellflower, who was named to the All-PBC Tournament team, leads the PBC in doubles and doubles per game, third

in total bases (133), fourth in hits and fifth in hits per game (1.50).

Mebane, a junior from Dublin, Georgia, stared all 54 games at third base for GCSU. He has batted .321 (72-of-224) and led the Bobcats with 17 home runs. Mebane, who was named to the All-PBC first team and was named the MVP of the PBC Tournament, also collected 15 doubles and drove in a team-leading 61 RBI, while slugging .616 and an on-base percentage of .400. Mebane also scored 55 runs and stole four bases. He is ranked 25th in NCAA Division II in home runs, 34th in total bases (138), and 43rd in home runs per game (0.31). Mebane is second in the PBC in total bases, third in RBI, fourth in home runs and home runs per game, fifth in RBI per game (1.15), and seventh in doubles. Mebane was honored as the league's Player of the Week on March 25.

Glanton, a sophomore right-handed pitcher from Metter, Georgia, started all 15 of his appearances on the mound. Glanton, who was a first-team All-PBC selection and named to the All-PBC Tournament team, is currently 10-4 on the season with a 2.44 earned-run average with five complete games and two shared shutouts. In 107 innings pitched, Glanton has allowed 96 hits and 29 earned runs, while striking out 55 and walking just 20. Opponents are just hitting .238 against Glanton in 2024. He is fourth in NCAA Division II statistics in games started, fifth in complete games, eighth in wins, 12th in ERA, 33rd in walks plus hits per inning (1.08), and 38th in walks allowed per nine innings (1.68). Glanton tops the league in complete games, games started and wins, second in ERA and WHIP, third in walks allowed per nine innings, and fifth in hits allowed per nine innings (8.07). Glanton was named the PBC Pitcher of the Week April 29.

The Bobcats (34-20) captured their fifth PBC Tournament title last weekend as they defeated Flagler College in the PBC Championship Series. The Bobcats, who are making their 15th trip to the NCAA Division II Tournament and first since 2018, are seeded No. 7 in the regional and will face No. 2 seed and regional host North Greenville University in the first round of the double-elimination tournament Thursday (May 16) at 6 p.m. at Ray & Bea Dillard Fleld at Ashmore Park in Tigerville, South Carolina. Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA) for Fiscal Year 2025

Human Resources, Office of: Friday May 17, 2024

With Governor Kemp signing the FY25 state budget, we are grateful to him and the General Assembly for including the University System of Georgia personnel as part of a 4% Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA), capped at \$3,000, for state employees.

For University System of Georgia (USG) Institutions, eligibility includes all full-time, regular, benefits-eligible USG employees working 30 standard hours per week or more who are actively employed on July 1, 2024 - when the COLA will go into effect. Part-time regular employees working less than 30 hours, as well as temporary employees are not eligible for the adjustment.

We appreciate the Governor and the legislative leadership for including us in the funding for this initiative.

The GCSU Human Resources, Payroll Services and Budget teams are working now to review and validate payroll data to process these salary adjustments. As with previous COLAs, these adjustments greatly contribute to our efforts to maintain competitive wages for our workforce, and we are thankful for all that you do on behalf of USG and GCSU.

Bobcats win Southeast Regional No. 2 with 4-3 win over No. 19 Mount Olive

Athletics: Monday May 20, 2024

TIGERVILLE, S.C. | Georgia College & State University got seven strong innings from starter <u>Jacob Ryan</u> and held on for a 4-3 baseball decision over No. 19 University of Mount Olive in the finals of the 2024 NCAA



Division II Southeast Regional No. 2 Saturday (May 18) afternoon at Ray and Bea Dillard Field at Ashmore Park on the University of North Greenville.

With the win, the seventh-seeded Bobcats, who are 8-0 so far this postseason, won their ninth consecutive game as they improved to 37-20, while the No. 3 seed Mount Olive ended its campaign at 39-18. GCSU, which won all three meetings with the Trojans in 2024 and are 7-2 all-time against UMO in the postseason, will advance to the Southeast Super Regionals for the first time in program history when they will travel to Salisbury, North Carolina, May 24-25 where they will face Catawba College in a best-of-3 series to determine who will represent the region at the NCAA Division II Baseball National Championship in Cary, North Carolina, June 1-8. First pitch at Newman Park for game one is slated for 6 p.m. Friday (May 24), with game two to start at 3:30 p.m. Saturday (May 25) with an if-necessary game to follow.

Mount Olive took a 1-0 lead in the first inning on an Aiden Cottle sacrifice fly, but the Bobcats tied the game at 1 in the second. Matthew Mebane led off with a walk and moved over to second base on a wild pitch. Mebane advanced to third on a Mitch Cowan ground out and scored on Cam McNearney's sacrifice fly to left-center field.

The Trojans reclaimed the lead at 2-1 in the third on a ground out from Dylan Jeffries, but GCSU tied it up at 2 on <u>Braeden Smith's</u> solo home run to right field in the fourth. It was Smith's sixth long ball of 2024. The Bobcats took the led for good in the fourth inning against UM) starter Brian Robertson (0-1). Mebane drew another walk and moved to second on an <u>Evan Cowan</u> ground out. Mebane advanced to third on a infield single by <u>Mitch Cowan</u> and scored on McNearney's RBi ground-rule double to right field. <u>Mitch Cowan</u> later scored on <u>Rand Bestermann's</u> sacrifice fly to right to give GCSU a 4-2 lead.

Ryan improved to 8-2 on the hill for the Bobcats as he scattered six hits - only two after the third inning - and struck out four over seven innings. Lex Kenny recorded his seventh save as he pitched the final two innings to preserve the win, allowing just a homer to right-center field by Case Kermode to start the ninth inning.

GCSU collected five hits against the Trojans with Mitch Cowan recording the only multi-hit game for the Bobcats with two.



Two Bobcats named to CSC Academic All-District® team

The Bobcats, who were ranked as high as No. 49 by the ITA, finished their 2023 season with a 4-15 ledger and advanced to the Peach Belt Tournament.

Three GCSU players earn CSC Academic All-District® accolades

AUSTIN, Texas | Georgia College & State University had three student-athletes -<u>Shradha Chhabra</u>, <u>Ashton</u>

<u>Morrison</u> and <u>Chiara Santoro</u> - named to the College Sports Communicators NCAA Division II Women's Tennis Academic All-District® Team.



To be nominated, a student-athlete must be at least a sophomore with a 3.50 cumulative grade point average and must have been in the lineup for 70 percent of the total matches played by the team that included a team score.

Chhabra, a junior from New Delhi, India, earned her named on the list with a 3.80 cumulative grade-point average as a psychology major with a minor in criminal justice. Chhabra posted a 13-8 ledger in singles and a 12-8 mark in doubles in 2023-24. Chhabra, who has tallied 42 wins in singles and 35 more in doubles, was named to the CSC Academic All-District® Team a year ago as well as being named as a Intercollegiate Tennis Association Scholar Athlete and to the Peach Belt Conference Presidential Honor Roll during her career. She also received the D2 ADA Academic Achievement Award and named to the PBC Women's Tennis Team of Academic Distinction last year.

Morrison, a senior from Cumming, Georgia, recorded a 3.97 cumulative GPA as a special education major. Morrison along with teammate <u>Jada Young</u> were named to the All-PBC doubles team for the second consecutive season after picking up nine wins in 2024. Morrison also tallied 10 wins in singles this season. She finished with 39 career wins in singles and another 39 in doubles. Morrison was named to the CSC Academic All-District® Team for a second consecutive season and was named to the PBC Women's Tennis of Academic Distinction. She has also been named an ITA Scholar Athlete and the PBD Presidential Honor Roll in her career and received the D2 ADA Academic Achievement Award in

Santoro, a junior from Santa Ursula, Spain, has compiled a 3.88 cumulative GPA as an exercise science major. Santoro posted a 15-6 record in singles and an 11-10 tally in doubles in 2024 as she has been named to the All-Peach Belt team for the third time. She was a first-team selection in singles in 2024 and was named to the second team in singles and doubles in 2023. Santoro, who has 44 career wins in singles and another 32 in doubles, was named to PBC Women's Tennis Team of Academic Distinction and received the D2 ADA Academic Achievement Award last season and has been named an ITA Scholar Athlete and to the PBC Presidential Honor Roll in her career.

The Bobcats, who were ranked as high as No. 16 by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association, finished their 2023-24 season with a 12-11 ledger and advanced to the semifinals of the Peach Belt Tournament.



GCSU has four players named to D2CCA All-Region teams

GREENWOOD, S.C. | Four Georgia College & State University baseball players were honored by the Division II Collegiate Commissioners Association on the eve of the 2024 NCAA Division II Southeast Super Regional.



Matthew Mebane, Brandon Bellflower and Gabriel Wuerth were named to the D2CCA All-Southeast Region first team, while John Luke Glanton was named to the second team. The quartet each earned all-region honors last week by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association.

Mebane, a junior from Dublin, Georgia, stared all 57 games at third base for GCSU. He has batted .322 (75-of-233) and leads the Bobcats with 20 home runs. Mebane, who was named to the All-Peach Belt Conference first team and was named the MVP of the PBC Tournament, also collected 15 doubles and drove in a team-leading 70 RBI, while slugging .644 and an on-base percentage of .409. Mebane also scored 61 runs and stole four bases. He is ranked 12th in NCAA Division II in home runs, 22nd in total bases (150), 25th in home runs per game (0.35) and 43rd in RBI per game (1.25). Mebane leads the PBC in total bases, home runs, and RBI, second in home runs per game and RBI per game (1.15), and seventh in doubles. Mebane was honored as the league's Player of the Week on March 25.

Bellflower, a senior right fielder from Milledgeville, Georgia, started all 54 games. Bellflower, who was named to the All-PBC first team and only the second baseball player in the league to be named to the all-conference team for the fourth time, leads GCSU with a .374 batting average (83-of-222) with 22 doubles, 10 homers and drove in 43 runs, while scoring 65 runs. He has slugged .608 and has a .489 on-base percentage with six stolen bases. Bellflower is 14th in Division II in doubles, 30th in hits, and 38th in doubles per game (0.39). Bellflower, who was named to the All-

PBC Tournament team, leads the PBC in doubles and doubles per game, third in total bases (135), fourth in hits and batting average, and eighth in hits per game (1.48).

Wuerth, a sophomore from Woodstock, Georgia, split the 57 games he started between second base and shortstop this season. Wuerth, who was named to the All-PBC first team, currently is second for the Bobcats in batting average (.362, 88-of-243). He also had 14 doubles. three home runs and drove in 37 runs. Wuerth has slugged .457 and has a .416 on-base percentage to go along with his 11 stolen bases and 54 runs scored. Wuerth is ranked 16th in NCAA Division II statistics in hits and 41st in hits per game (1.54). He is listed No. 1 in the Peach Belt in hits, third in hits per game, and eighth toughest to strikeout (10.1).

Glanton, a sophomore right-handed pitcher from Metter, Georgia, started all 16 of his appearances on the mound. Glanton, who was a first-team All-PBC selection and named to the All-PBC Tournament team, is currently 11-4 on the season with a 2.45 earned-run average with five complete games and two shared shutouts. In 114 innings pitched, Glanton has allowed 102 hits and 31 earned runs, while striking out 63 and walking just 22. Opponents are just hitting .237 against Glanton in 2024. He is fourth in NCAA Division II statistics in games started and wins, fifth in complete games, 14th in ERA, 32nd in walks plus hits per inning (1.09), and 39th in walks allowed per nine innings (1.74). Glanton tops the league in complete games, games started and wins, second in ERA and WHIP, fourth in walks allowed per nine innings and fifth in hits allowed per nine innings (8.05). Glanton was named the PBC Pitcher of the Week April 29.

MyPassword Going Away May 31, 2024 - Use Microsoft SSPR

The new password reset system, Microsoft Self-Service Password Reset, or SSPR for short, allows you to change, reset and unlock your password.

Self-Service Password Reset (SSPR) is a feature of Microsoft 365 that ensures that you will never lose access to your account. It allows you to set up alternative verification methods so that if you lose your password, you can verify your identity and reset your password—without needing to contact the IT Help Desk.

- Easy enrollment anytime, anywhere
- Password recovery through email or mobile phone
- Enroll on a mobile phone for easy password recovery
- Offers more protection against cybersecurity threats


