GCSU Sociology Professor named yearlong Governor's Teaching Fellow

Dr. Stephanie McClure, a professor of [sociology](#) at Georgia College & State University for 20 years, was recently named a Governor's Teaching Fellow in the state's Academic Year Symposium program.

This selective, yearlong programs consists of monthly sessions lasting two to three days in Athens, Georgia. Unlike the Governor's Teaching Fellows Summer Symposium, which has yearly themes, the academic year program primarily focuses on course design and redesign.

"I was excited to hear the news. It's an honor," McClure said. "Many excellent colleagues have participated in the past and have shared what a rewarding experience it is. I'm really looking forward to the chance to reflect on and improve my teaching practice in a community of similarly passionate and committed peers."

More than 600 faculty members at 45 public and private institutions have been named Governor Teaching Fellows since 1995, when the [Governor's Teaching Fellows Program](#) began under former Gov. Zell Miller.

The outreach program is part of the University of Georgia's Louise McBee Institute of Higher Education. It provides opportunities for faculty to develop important, innovative, up-to-date teaching skills. This often includes tech-savvy tools, so students are competitive in an ever changing global job market.

Five Georgia College faculty have been [academic-year fellows since 2021](#).

Last year, [two Georgia College faculty were named](#) Governor Teaching Fellows in the Summer Symposium: Dr. Suzanna Roman-Oliver, assistant professor of [Secondary Education](#), and Dr. Omolola Akinola Ologunorisa, lecturer in [Geography](#).

McClure teaches Introductory Sociology, Social Theory and research courses in Social Stratification, Racial Stratification and Sociology of Education.

In his letter supporting McClure's nomination, Dr. Costas Spirou, [provost](#) and vice president of [Academic Affairs](#), wrote: "It is my pleasure to write this letter on behalf of a truly outstanding educator, scholar and humanitarian." He noted McClure's "excellent track record of success in the classroom." Her innovations, research and community-based projects make her "a true leader on our campus."

"Dr. McClure does not teach her students about sociology," Spirou wrote, "but rather she designs projects and assignments that allow the students to become sociologists. Dr. McClure's classes are both immersive and engaging, as she emphasizes the importance of viewing the world, specifically the dimensions of class and racial inequities, through a sociological lens."

McClure has penned many publications on "complex, contentious societal issues," Spirou noted. These include classroom texts and essays that "encourage readers to think intersectionally about race" and offer a "springboard to teaching students accountability and sparking both curiosity and empathy."

McClure enjoys teaching sociology students in study abroad programs to Waterford, Ireland, and Montepulciano, Italy.



Her proudest moment at Georgia College was receiving the university's Teaching Award in 2020. She was also nominated by a former student to be the 2019 Southern Regional Education Board's Faculty Mentor of the Year.

McClure served on the university's Student Research Conference committee and mentors undergraduates to participate in that yearly campus event. Undergraduate research has been a "transformative experience" for all of McClure's students, Spirou wrote. Many go on to win prestigious fellowships and be accepted into highly competitive graduate and Ph.D. programs. McClure continues to mentor these students well beyond Georgia College.

"It is clear whatever a student's future path, Dr. McClure's classes have indeed taught them new ways of thinking and engaging with their communities," Spirou wrote.

For her yearlong project in the fellows program, McClure plans to do a major overhaul of her existing introductory course, which covers half of her teaching load at Georgia College. It is also the first introduction students usually have to sociology.

"I feel like I've always done it well and with good engagement and enthusiasm," McClure said. "But after 20 years, it feels like I've gotten a little stuck. I'm generally more innovative in my upper-level courses, but with my intro class I've long taken an 'If it ain't broke, don't fix it' approach."

"I've gotten great feedback from and made beautiful, genuine connections with so many former intro students, even those who've never take another class with me," she said. "So this is a genuine challenge—to take a new look at what is now a classic and try to envision something even better."

In addition to revising her introductory course, McClure is also finishing development on a new course for Spring 2025 called "Sociology of Hope." Both Spirou and McClure value the opportunity the fellows program provides, knowing it will help shape her teaching efforts into even greater potential.

"I believe the experience of participating in the Governor's Teaching Fellows program will uniquely position her to continue offering our students an education that promotes critical thinking and empathy," Spirou wrote.

Brittany Johnson named GCSU head softball coach

Athletics : Thursday July 11, 2024

MILLEDGEVILLE, Ga. | Georgia College & State University Director of Athletics Wendell Staton announced the hiring of Brittany Johnson as the Bobcats next head softball coach.



"We are absolutely thrilled that Brittany Johnson has agreed to become the head softball coach at Georgia College & State University," said Staton. "From the outset, it was clear that Brittany aligned perfectly with GCSU values, and her campus visit completely solidified this alignment."

"She is extremely positive, personable, authentic and has deep care for student-athletes and their experience," added Staton. "These traits will translate to outstanding recruiting and engagement with our campus and the Milledgeville community."

Johnson comes to Milledgeville after spending the past six seasons as a coach at Saint Leo University under hall of fame Coach Erin Kinberger. She spent four seasons in Saint Leo, Florida, as an assistant coach before being promoted to associate head coach in April 2022.

"I would like to first thank President (Cathy) Cox, Director of Athletics Wendell Staton and the entire search committee for this opportunity and for entrusting me to be the next head coach of GCSU softball," said Johnson. "Throughout the interview process, it was apparent that the GCSU athletics department, and the greater community, prioritize people and fostering a family-like atmosphere, which resonated with me, making GCSU a perfect fit."

"I also can't thank Erin Kinberger, the head coach at Saint Leo, enough for her mentorship and support that helped lead to this," added Johnson. Lastly, thank you to my family and friends for their constant love and support throughout my coaching career. Becoming the head coach at a school of GCSU's caliber is a dream come true. I can't wait to meet the team, and hit the ground running."

During her six seasons in the Lions dugout, she has been part of three postseason berths (2019, 2023, 2024) including hosting the South Region 2 Regional in 2023 as the second seed and a .723 winning percentage (81-31) over the past two seasons. The 2023 season saw the team set a program record with 43 wins while landing two National Fastpitch Coaches Association and D2CCA All-Americans. She has coached six NFCA All-South Region selections, three D2CCA All-South Region selections. Johnson has coached 25 All-Sunshine State Conference selections, including three yearly award winners in Briana Neal – 2023 SSC Freshman of the Year, Kayla Betts – 2023 SSC Pitcher of the Year, and Madyson Coe – 2024 SSC Player of the Year. Academic awards include 41 NFCA All-America Scholar Athlete selections, two College Sports Communicators Academic All-America Team selections, and two NFCA Academic Team honors (2019, 2021). The Lions saw 35 student-athletes named to the President's Club (top 15 percent GPA of all SLU student-athletes).

"She has known success as a player, as an assistant coach, as associate head coach, and she will find the same holistic success as the GCSU head coach," said Staton. "Brittany has been mentored by and worked side by side with one of the best coaches in the country in Erin Kinberger."

"I am so excited for our student-athletes and the future of GCSU softball," added Staton. "Brittany has a full tank of gas, and we are pleased that she has chosen GCSU as the road to travel on in becoming our new head softball coach."

Following a four-year career at Rollins College, Johnson served as an assistant coach for the Tars for two seasons. The Tars combined for a 56-48 overall record while earning five All-SSC selections and three player of

the week honors. The Tars earned three wins over ranked opponents with a win over No. 11 Lee University and a series victory over No. 23 Saint Leo. During her time in the Tars dugout, 52 student-athletes were named to the Rollins College Athletic Director's Honor Roll and the team earned NFCA Academic Team honors in 2017 and 2018).

Between her stops at Saint Leo and Rollins, she coached more than 60 student-athletes who were named to the SSC Commissioner's Honor Roll.

Johnson was a four-year starter at second base for the Tars where she earned her undergraduate degree in history in 2016. The three-year captain was a .330 career hitter and graduated in the top five in several categories including holding the program record with 41 career hit by pitches. Her .520 on-base percentage was second in the program record book. Johnson led her Tars teams to three-straight NCAA Division II South Regional tournaments (2014-16) and was the first and only team to advance to the South Super Regionals (2016).

Johnson's accomplishments on the field earned her a plethora of awards during her four-year career. She was named NFCA All-American (2015), NFCA All-Region second team (2015), Daktronics All-Region first team (2015) and CoSIDA Academic All-District (2016). She was twice named to the All-SSC team (first team – '15; second team – '14) and was named to the Athletic Director's Honor Roll (2014, 2015, 2016), and the SSC Spring Commissioner's Honor Roll (2014, 2015, 2016) three times apiece. Johnson was nominated for Rollins College Female Athlete of the Year in 2016.

Johnson officially begins at GCSU Aug. 1.

TAP Application deadline for fall 2024 is July 15

Human Resources, Office of : Thursday July 11, 2024

The University System of Georgia (USG) has established an educational assistance program, the Tuition Assistance Program (TAP). The purpose for TAP is to foster the professional growth and development of its eligible employees.

The Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) application deadline for fall 2024 is Monday, July 15, 2024. TAP will waive up to nine (9) credit hours for the semester. Please visit the USG's Tuition Assistance Program webpage at <https://benefits.usg.edu/work-life/tuition-assistance-program> to locate the systemwide TAP Application, Graduate Student Tax Waiver Form (for graduate students only) and to reference the TAP Policy and FAQ if needed.

Reminder: Graduate students may be required to submit a Graduate Student Tax Waiver form with their TAP Application each semester, meaning a total of two forms may be required for all graduate students. The USG has stated that it is a suggested best practice for all graduate students to submit the Graduate Tax Waiver Form each semester with their TAP Application.

Employee ID# vs. Student ID#

The USG has specifically requested that institutions remind all TAP applicants that there are two required IDs located at the top of the TAP application - an employee ID# and a student ID#. These fields cannot be left blank. If TAP Applications and/or Graduate Tax Waivers are submitted with missing or incorrect information, they will be returned to the applicant for correction.

- As an employee of GCSU, your employee ID# is your OneUSG Employee ID#. You can locate this number by logging into OneUSG and clicking on the "Personal Details" tile on the home page. After the personal details page opens, you will find your employee ID# in the top left corner of the screen under your name and job title.
- Your student ID# is assigned by your teaching institution (where you will be enrolled in classes). If you are taking classes at GCSU, this will be your 911#. Please contact your teaching institution if you need assistance identifying the appropriate student ID#.

Georgia College must ensure that all programs involving non-Georgia College student minors (ages 17 and under) follow the established policy and procedures concerning their protection.

When you choose to offer a program, course or event where Georgia College assumes custody of the children, you as the Program Administrator are responsible for the safety and protection of the children, staff and volunteers. [Non-University organizations](#) who operate programs or activities involving minors at Georgia College are also required to run consistent with our guidelines. All GCSU Programs Serving Minors must designate a Program Administrator, who must be a Georgia College employee and agree to comply with Georgia College's written policy and procedures.

Georgia College has a Protection of Minors "one-stop" website that provides step-by-step guidance to assist all Georgia College supervisors and program administrators who offer programs for minors. Anyone offering a program is required to thoroughly review and implement the information provided on this website.

Before offering a program, the Program Administrator must register the program and gain the necessary approval to proceed. Program Administrators are also required to complete and pass the annual Program Administrator Training provided through GeorgiaVIEW. Programs should gain approval through the registry prior to advertising or reserving space. All ongoing programs and new programs must register their program on an annual basis.

In advance of planning and registering a program, please visit the website to review all requirements and resources provided. All Program Administrators should allow sufficient time for proper program development, planning, hiring/background screening, and staff training.

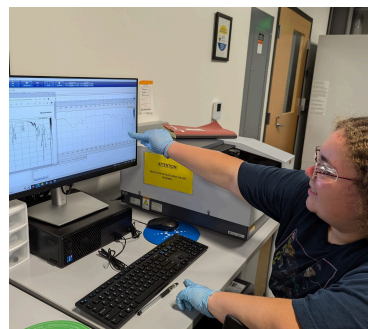

In this six-week YSA program, academically motivated rising seniors conduct research under the guidance of Dr. Catrena Lisse and undergraduate chemistry major mentors. The students tackle an individual research project and acquire valuable technical and analytical skills, culminating in data analysis and a YSA poster symposium. In some cases, YSA interns submit their work to national science conferences like the annual American Chemical Society's National Conference.



Throughout the six weeks of the program, students participate in weekly workshops with the YSA Director who provides insight into the scientific process, research ethics, how to read a research paper, how to make a poster, and how to network in the science and engineering fields. There are also sessions on college admission strategies and programs.

The Young Scientists Academy program Symposium is the presentations of the work learned, researched and done by the YSA student Interns on their individual research projects during the six week program during this summer.

GCSU Men's Golf Coach Jimmy Wilson announces retirement

Athletics : Monday July 22, 2024

MILLEDGEVILLE, Ga. | Georgia College & State University Director of Athletics Wendell Staton announced that GCSU's Associate Director of Athletics for External Relations and Head Golf Coach [Jimmy Wilson](#) has announced his retirement, effective July 31.



"Jimmy has been a vital and valuable part of GCSU Athletics from his time as a student-athlete, through today, and will be into tomorrow and beyond," said Staton. "I am grateful for his unwavering commitment to our student-athletes, to our staff and to the university. He took our golf program to unprecedented heights as he led us to national relevance for many years with sustained excellence. Our teams were always such positive representatives of our university on the course, in the classroom, and in the community, all thanks to his leadership. We had such a great run with so many good people.

"As an administrator, he stepped into any role needed," added Staton. "From compliance, to gameday, to sponsorships, to facilities, to business, to anything that was needed - Jimmy was there. As an administrator, coach and former student-athlete, he has served GCSU well. I want to thank Jimmy for his service and commitment to our student-athletes. He will be missed and we wish him an enjoyable retirement."

Wilson returned to coach Bobcat golf in the spring of 2020, the season was cut short for COVID-19. He spent 20 seasons at the helm of the GCSU golf program, stepping into full-time athletics administration in 2015.

"It's been an honor and a privilege to have served Georgia College & State University as its golf coach," said Wilson. "I want to thank Stan Aldridge for providing me the opportunity to coach this team. I want to thank Jud Damon and Wendell Staton for allowing me to continue my craft at GCSU. I would also like to thank President Cathy Cox for everything she has done and continues to do for GCSU Athletics since her arrival in Milledgeville. Certainly I would like to thank the players - past and present - for all the successes they have had on the golf course. I would be definitely remiss if I didn't thank my wife Colleen for allowing me to hang out with college kids for the past 30 years."

Wilson has served the NCAA Division II Men's Golf Committee as a rep for the South/Southeast region and was the Chairman of the NCAA Division II National Committee for men's golf for the 2015-16 season.

Wilson picked up his fourth Peach Belt Conference Coach of the Year honor, reaching as high as No. 12 in the national rankings and guided the Bobcats to their 20th appearance in the NCAA Division II South/Southeast Super Regionals in the 2020-21 season. The Bobcats won both the Bearcat Classic and Bobcat Invitational that season.

Wilson guided one of the best seasons in program history in 2008. The Bobcats won the NCAA Division II Southeast Regional Championship and took fourth at the NCAA Division II National Championship, the highest-ever national finish for a Georgia College golf squad. Wilson was honored with plenty of hardware for his work in 2008, nabbing both the Southeast Region and Peach Belt Coach of the Year honors.

The 2011-12 season was another great year for coach Wilson and the Bobcats. Being led by three All-Americans, they finished third in the PBC Championship, and followed that with a first-place regional finish before finishing fifth at the NCAA national tournament.

Wilson also garnered region coach of the year honors in 2010, a year where the Bobcats were the preseason national No. 1 and won a trio of tournaments, including the 2010 PBC Championship.

Wilson-led teams reached the national championship round of the NCAA Tournament in 1998, 2000, 2001, 2004, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, and 2012. Wilson guided the Bobcats to PBC Championships in 2010 and 2000 and was also named the league's Coach of the Year in 2000.

The Bobcats finished fifth at the NCAA National Tournament in 1998, 10th in 2000, tied for fifth in 2001, 10th in 2004, 15th in 2005, sixth in 2007, fourth in 2008 and fifth in 2009. Wilson has coached 24 All-Americans in his tenure with the Bobcats, including coaching a player to PBC Golfer of the Year honors five times.

Wilson has led Bobcat golfers to 24 All-America trophies all-time.

Wilson, who joined the athletics department full time in April 2007, graduated from Georgia College in 1986 and served as the Director of Golf at the Little Fishing Creek Golf Course in Milledgeville from 1988 to April 2007.

Information regarding the future leadership of GCSU golf will be announced at a later date.

GCSU, four players earn ITA academic awards

TEMPE, Ariz. | The Georgia College & State University men's tennis team has been recognized as an All-Academic Team by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association, while players [Reid Bissell](#), [Gabe Cizek](#), [Rodrigo Pérez Crespo](#) and [Braxton Wright](#) were named Scholar-Athletes by the organization.



The Bobcats, who were one of 78 NCAA Division II institutions recognized by the ITA, had a 3.33 cumulative grade-point average as a team this year. To be named an All-Academic team, a program had to have a 3.20 GPA. It was the fifth time in the past six years that GCSU has been named an All-Academic Team by the ITA.

Bissell, a freshman from Norcross, Georgia, has a 3.69 GPA as a finance major, while Cizek, a junior from Prague, Czech Republic, posted a 4.00 GPA as an exercise major. Perez Crespo, a sophomore from Ourense, Spain, tallied a 3.63 GPA as a marketing major, while Wright, a sophomore from Cumming, Georgia, collected a 3.63 GPA as a management major. It is the third ITA Scholar-Athlete honor for Cizek, while it is the second for Perez Crespo.

To be named an ITA Scholar-Athlete, the player must have a 3.50 GPA for the current academic year.

PIN participants install solar panels Saturday at Baldwin County Water Treatment Plant

College of Business & Technology : Thursday July 25, 2024

The final project for a free certificate course blending business and solar physics at [Georgia College & State University](#) will provide \$20,000 worth of solar panels to Baldwin County's Water Treatment Facility.

Ten residents who took classes last spring were selected to install 38 solar panels on an [EcoFoot2+](#) Saturday, July 27, beginning at 9 a.m. at the Lamar F. Hamm Water Treatment Plant at 510 East Montgomery Street in Milledgeville.



The project is the completion of a new grant program giving free instruction and training to residents in green technology, solar power and next-generation business tactics.

"These students are going to be able to get certified via the North American Board of Certified Energy Practitioners, [NABCEP](#), making them very competitive for any company looking for installers," said Dr. Nicholas Creel, a business and ethics law professor who taught the business side of the PIN course. Dr. Hasitha Mahabaduge, associate professor of physics taught the solar side.

Georgia College's 40-hour course, "[An Introduction to Solar Technology and Entrepreneurship](#)," launched in January through the university's [Department of Continuing and Professional Education](#). It was paid for by a \$100,000 grant from Partnership for Inclusive Innovation, [PIN](#), awarded to the university's [Center for Innovation and Entrepreneurship](#) last fall.

Special emphasis was placed on the design and installation of photovoltaic electrical systems for residential and commercial use. Participants were taught entrepreneurship and how to start their own businesses in the solar and green-energy market sector.

In total, about 40 residents took advantage of the program. Some were retired professors looking to adapt their homes to solar power. Others had high school degrees and wanted to get better jobs.

"Most were people looking for a better paying job," Creel said, "and this educational program offered them a clear path to do so."

Milledgeville City Manager Hank Griffeth chose the water district as the solar project site to make its operation more sustainable.

On Saturday, resident participants will bring solar panels to the roof of a water treatment plant building, positioning them in layered rows. They'll help connect and wire together panels, although final steps will be completed by a certified electrician.

They'll be aided by two Georgia College [alumni working in Atlanta's solar industry](#): Ryan Agnew founder of South East Solar, and Rylan Gordon, director of business development for East Coast at Sinovoltaics. Ryan contributed to the engineering design of this project, helped procure materials and will ensure safety codes are met.

Max Sheppard named Cobalt Golf All-America Scholar

Georgia College & State University's men's golfer [Max Sheppard](#) has been named a Cobalt Golf All-America Scholar.

To be eligible for Cobalt Golf All-America Scholar nomination, an individual must be a sophomore, junior or senior both academically and athletically in NCAA Division I, II, III, and NAIA, or receiving their associate's degree and in their last year of athletic eligibility in the NJCAA.

In addition, they must participate in 50% of their team's competitive rounds, have a stroke average under 76.0 in NCAA Division I, under 78.0 in NCAA Division II, under 79.0 in NCAA Division III, under 78.0 in NAIA, and under 77.0 in NJCAA, and maintain a minimum cumulative career grade-point average of 3.2. A recipient must also be of high moral character and be in good standing at their college or university.

Sheppard, who is a senior from Columbus, Georgia, played in five events during the 2023-24 season, averaging 76.33 over 15 rounds. Sheppard, who has been named an All-America Scholar twice in his career, has a 3.72 GPA as a management information system major with a minor in finance.

Sheppard was one of 227 NCAA Division II athletes from 77 institutions who earned All-America Scholar honors.

"As for the Peach Belt, I think this is going to be the toughest season yet," added Marchant. "We have some new coaches in the league which I'm looking forward to competing against, as well as the staples, who battle it out every year, and we are looking to work our way into that mix. It all makes for an exciting 2024."

The Bobcats, who return a lot of experienced players (28) from last year's 8-8-2 squad that finished in sixth place in the Peach Belt Conference, open the 2024 campaign in Salisbury, North Carolina, for two matches. GCSU will face Chowan University at 5 p.m., Sept. 6. The Hawks are one of two first-time opponents on the Bobcats ledger this season. They will round out the weekend Sept. 8 at 3 p.m. when they face Catawba College. GCSU is 2-2-0 all-time against the Catawba Indians, including a 2-1 decision against Catawba last year when they were ranked No. 1 in the nation.

GCSU returns to the Bobcat Soccer Field Sept. 11 at 7 p.m. when they host Middle Georgia State University in its home opener. The Knights are the other first-time opponent on the schedule this year. The Bobcats will travel to Valdosta State University for a match Sept. 14 before returning home to entertain Florida Southern College Sept. 18.

The Bobcats open the 2024 Peach Belt slate against Columbus State University in Columbus, Georgia, Sept. 21. The Cougars, who won the PBC Tournament title and are one of three opponents that made the 2023 NCAA Division II Tournament, is the longest-running opponent for Georgia College, as this will be the 29th meeting in the all-time series.

GCSU returns to Milledgeville for a two-match home swing against Auburn University at Montgomery (Sept. 23) and PBC-foe Flagler College (Sept. 28). The Bobcats have won all three meetings with the Warhawks and the matchup against the Saints, who made the national tournament last season, will serve as the Parents Day contest.

The Bobcats will be on the road for three of their next four matches. They will face Clayton State University (Oct. 2), Lincoln Memorial University (Oct. 9) and the University of South Carolina-Beaufort (Oct. 12) and will host Christian Brothers University Oct. 5. GCSU holds an 11-8-3 lead in the all-time series with the Lakers and the series against the Railsplitters is tied at 1-1-1. The LMU match will be a neutral-site contest in Greer, South Carolina. The Bobcats have won both meetings against the Sand Sharks and they will be looking for their first-ever win against the Buccaneers.

GCSU returns to the Bobcat Soccer Field for two league matches against the University of North Georgia (Oct. 16) and Lander University (Oct. 19) before hitting the road for its next three matches against Albany State University (Oct. 23), University of South Carolina-Aiken (Oct. 26) and Emmanuel (Ga.) University (Oct. 30). UNG are the defending PBC champions and NCAA tournament participant, while GCSU holds an 8-7-7 all-time lead against the Bearcats. The Lander contest will also be Alumni Day for the Bobcats. GCSU has never lost to the Golden Rams in six meetings and is 12-6-2 against the Pacers. The Bobcats are 1-0-0 all-time against the Lions, winning 3-1 a year ago.

The Bobcats wrap up their regular season at home No. 2 against Georgia Southwestern State University in a 1 p.m. contest. GCSU is 17-0-1 all-time against the Hurricanes.

The top eight teams will qualify for the Peach Belt Tournament in 2024. The quarterfinals will be played on campus sites Nov. 12 with the semifinals and finals to be held Nov. 15 and 17 at the highest-remaining seed. The

winner will earn the league's automatic berth to the NCAA tournament.

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
