GCSU has 55 student-athletes earn D2 ADA Academic Achievement Award

WESTLAKE, Ohio | Fifty-five Georgia College & State University student-athletes have been recognized by the Division 2 Athletics Directors Association with their D2 ADA Academic Achievement Award.



GCSU had 23 repeat honorees, including [Anna Agi](#) (women's cross country) who received the award for the fourth consecutive year.

[AJ Mathis](#) (baseball), [Callie Miller](#) (women's volleyball), [Ashton Morrison](#) (women's tennis), [Enzo Sergi](#) (men's tennis) and [Max Sheppard](#) (men's golf) each received the award for the third year in a row, while [Kaitlyn Anders](#) (softball), [Tucker Balch](#) (men's cross country), [Sydney Charles](#) (women's soccer), [Divina Checo](#) (softball), [Shradha Chhabra](#) (women's tennis), [Gabe Cizek](#) (men's tennis), [Blane Davis](#) (men's golf), [Aralyn Everett](#) (women's soccer), [Alexa Geary](#) (women's basketball), [Rachel Machovec](#) (women's volleyball), [Brooke Mooney](#) (women's cross country), [Jillian Muncus](#) (women's cross country), [Brooke Roberts](#) (women's volleyball), [Chiara Santoro](#) (women's tennis), [Jana Shellhorse](#) (softball), [Myra Strickland](#) (women's basketball) and [Jada Warren](#) (women's basketball) each received the award for the second consecutive year.

Women's soccer led the way with 12 student-athletes, while baseball added eight and softball had seven more. Women's volleyball added six, while women's basketball had five. Women's cross country and women's tennis had four student-athletes each, while men's tennis had three. Men's golf, men's basketball and men's cross country had two each to earn the

award.

The Academic Achievement Awards, in its 17th year, is a program that recognizes the academic accomplishments of student-athletes at the Division II level. In total, 19,774 student-athletes from 192 institutions were recognized for the 2023-24 Academic Achievement Awards. It was the largest number of student-athletes being nominated since the award program's inception. The Peach Belt Conference had 565 student-athletes earn the Academic Achievement Award.

To receive the Academic Achievement Award, the student-athlete must have a cumulative grade-point average of 3.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale, have attended a minimum of two years (four semesters) of college level work and have been an active member of an intercollegiate team during his/her last academic year.

Outdoor Emergency Notification System Test

Wednesday, Aug. 7, 2024

Public Safety : Wednesday August 7, 2024

Georgia College & State University will test the Outdoor Emergency Notification System (siren system) Wednesday, Aug. 7, 2024. This test is scheduled to occur the first Wednesday of every month between 10 a.m. and noon and will last approximately one minute. No action is required during the testing, and all campus operations should continue as normal. A message stating that this is a test will precede and follow the "alert" tone. In the case of an actual tornado warning, the message would advise of a tornado warning, and the tone would cycle through. This would be repeated every five minutes until the warning expires or is canceled, at which time an all clear message would sound. The audible system test will only be tested when clear sky conditions are present. Tests will not occur when skies are dark or severe weather is predicted for the area on the day the test is scheduled to occur. In this case, the test will be rescheduled for later in the month.

There are three sirens operated by GCSU in Baldwin County: one on West Campus and two on Main Campus.

This testing program is designed to maintain a reliable warning system and to meet recommended testing guidelines. Additionally, we want to maximize the effectiveness of the Outdoor Emergency Notification System. By performing these tests, we hope to enhance awareness and education regarding emergency preparedness at Georgia College and within the local community.

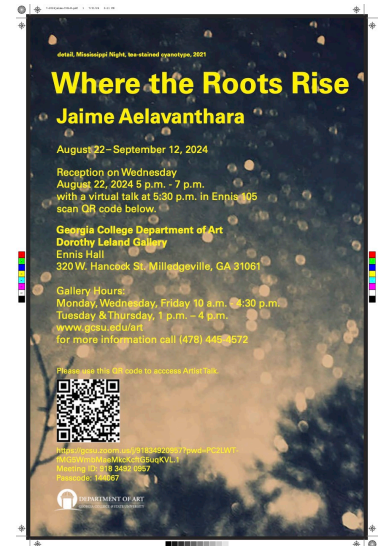

Prior to Georgia College, Stratton served as both faculty and department chair at the University of North Carolina at Asheville.

Since 2016, 40 BAPA participants have become provosts serving at AASCU member institutions, and 10 have gone on to become presidents or chancellors.

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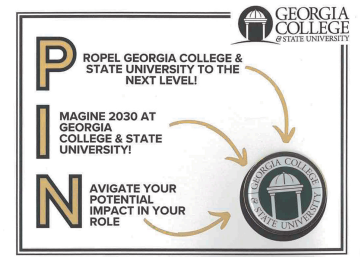

GCSU's Advancement marks record-breaking fundraising year

University Advancement : Wednesday August 14, 2024

[Georgia College & State University](#) achieved its largest fundraising year-to-date in Fiscal Year 2024, securing more than \$8.8 million in charitable donations. This remarkable accomplishment represents a 212% increase over the previous year.



"Every gift is important; every gift matters," said Seth Walker, vice president of [University Advancement](#).

"Engaging everyone in the giving process has been crucial," he said. "It benefits the institution and demonstrates a unified effort, with full support from our trustees. [President Cox](#) remains focused on fundraising, as we strive to provide more resources for our students, faculty and staff."

The surge in philanthropic support will significantly enhance funding for scholarships, general resources and university programs through the Foundations of Excellence Fund, Georgia College's primary [annual fund](#). The increased flexibility in funding will bolster key initiatives like [GC Journeys](#) and the [Office of Inclusion & Belonging](#), as well as other critical areas in academic and student affairs.

The fundraising success is attributed to contributions from several large donors with the majority of support coming from medium and small gifts. Notably, the institution saw a 10% rise in alumni giving and a 15% increase in contributions from faculty and staff. Student giving also grew substantially, along with support from GCSU friends in the Milledgeville and Baldwin County community, underscoring their commitment to the university.

University Advancement implemented several strategic changes, which included raising the minimum endowed amount for scholarships,

introducing performance metrics for directors of development and investing significantly in online giving platforms.

These initiatives have made it easier for alumni and friends to contribute.

“Fundraising is the only revenue source we have without a cap,” Walker said. “To continue delivering an excellent experience for our students, faculty and staff, we emphasize giving back as a core tenet of our mission. We are excited to partner with donors to create new philanthropic opportunities across campus.”

GCSU lecturer co-publishes new insight on physics phenomena

Dr. Kushan Wijewardena, lecturer of [physics and astronomy](#) at [Georgia College & State University](#), is part of a team of researchers who recently co-authored a paper on a popular phenomenon well-known in physics called the “fractional quantum Hall effect” or FQHE.

His research, done in collaboration with Professor Ramesh Mani at Georgia State University, was published in the journal [Communications Physics](#). It adds new insight into the behavior of electrons.

“The results were fascinating,” Wijewardena said. “It took several years for us to have a feasible explanation for the experimental observations that we made.”

“The study demonstrates the importance of the high-quality crystals developed at the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology Zurich by Professor Werner Wegscheider and Dr. Christian Reichl,” he added.

Wijewardena joined Georgia College faculty last year after completing his doctoral studies in Mani’s physics lab at [GSU](#). That’s where Wijewardena began working on measurements to explore “excited levels of fractional quantum Hall effect” by applying a direct current bias.

This is the first time these findings have been reported.

At [Science.org](#), FQHE is explained as “a fascinating quantum liquid made up solely of electrons confined to a plane surface. Found only at temperatures near absolute zero and in extremely strong magnetic fields, this liquid can flow without friction. The excited states of this liquid



consist of peculiar particle-like objects that carry an exact fraction of an electron charge. Called quasiparticles, these excitations can themselves condense into new liquid states.”

Wijewardena explained it this way: “We are exploring properties such as electrical resistance and conductance in a two-dimensional electron system, where the electrons can behave as gas or liquid, depending on their environment. Here, two-dimensionality for electrons is realized by trapping the electrons at the planar interface of two different materials. Our sample of electrons is similar in shape to a very small sheet of paper with no thickness (about 1 mm x 0.5 mm). When we place the sample in a perpendicular magnetic field and at an extremely low temperature close to absolute zero, the electrons exhibit quantized circular orbits, analogous to concentric circles drawn on the sheet of paper. The radius of these orbits depends on the energy of the electrons, which is influenced by the charge of the electron, and the magnetic field strength. The energies of these orbits are quantized into ‘Landau levels,’ meaning their energy changes in discrete steps rather than continuously. One might think of the lowest energy state corresponding to the smallest circle as the ground state, and the higher lying levels as excited states.”

Wijewardena continued: “Typically, in FQHE, researchers study the ground state, which is the lowest possible energy state. However, there could also be higher lying, or excited states, that the correlated electron system can occupy, which we have examined in the publication.”

GSU’s Mani said “fractional quantum Hall effects are thought to reflect the correlated ground states of electronic systems in a magnetic field. Loosely speaking, one might say it’s like investigating the ground floor of a building.”

He added, “Then, one might ask whether the building structure has floors at higher levels and whether they can be investigated and what these upper floors look like. Our study reports an investigation of these upper floors or excited states of fractional quantum Hall effect. Surprisingly, with a simple technique, we were able to access these upper floors, find complex signatures and, most importantly, find the excited states of fractional quantum Hall effects.”

In its announcement of Mani's and Wijewardena's research, Georgia State University noted everyday modern conveniences "like cellphones, computers, GPS, LED lighting, solar cells and even self-driving cars" were made possible by advances in past research in "condensed matter physics," a subfield of physics.

This research led to "flatland science and flatland materials (that) are now being studied in condensed matter physics with the aim to realize more energy-efficient, flexible, faster and lighter-weight future electronics, including novel sensors, higher efficiency solar cells, quantum computers and topological quantum computers."

According to GSU's statement, the team "observed all the FQHE states splitting unexpectedly, followed by crossings of split branches, which allowed them to explore the new non-equilibrium states of these quantum systems and reveal entirely new states of matter."

Several Nobel Prizes have been given for FQHE research over the years.

The original quantum Hall effect—which involved a complex physics formula with two-dimensional electron systems subjected to low temperatures and strong magnetic fields—was discovered by German scientist Klaus von Klitzing in 1980. He was awarded a Nobel Prize for his work in 1985. Mani worked with Klitzing in Stuttgart, Germany, for many years.

Shortly after quantum Hall effect was established, scientists at Bell Laboratories reported their discovery of FQHE. It provided evidence of fractional or one-third of an electron's charge, winning Robert Laughlin, Horst Störmer, and Daniel Tsui a Nobel Prize in 1998.

In 2010, another Nobel Prize was awarded for the discovery of graphene. This provided quantum Hall effect evidence for electrons without mass, which behaved differently from regular electrons. Then, theories for "topological phase transitions and topological matter" arising from QHE received the Nobel Prize in 2016.

“From this progression,” Wijewardena said, “one can see the quantum Hall effect related to science has been a very active field in condensed matter physics.”

“Since the discovery of the fractional quantum Hall effect, there has been quite a lot of research work on this exciting topic,” he said. “However, this is the first report of excited state fractionally quantized Hall effects induced by applying a direct current bias.”

GCSU's Jada Warren named PBC nominee for NCAA Woman of the Year Award

AUGUSTA, Ga. | Georgia College & State University women's basketball player [Jada Warren](#) is one of two Peach Belt Conference selections for the NCAA Woman of the Year.



In addition to Warren, Clayton State University track and field performer Ariyonna Jones was the other PBC selection for the award. The two will be among the 46 Division II student-athletes advancing in the selection process after being chosen from all PBC institution nominees for the award. The selections were made by the Peach Belt Senior Woman Administrator Committee.

"I am truly honored to be one of two nominees from the Peach Belt Conference for the NCAA Woman of the Year award," said Warren. "This recognition is a testament to the dedication and effort I've invested in my athletic and academic pursuits, as well as my commitment to actively contribute and engage with the community around me."

Warren graduated from Georgia College in May with a bachelor's degree in exercise science. The Norcross, Georgia, native graduated cum laude with a 3.64 cumulative grade-point average and received the GCSU Student Leader of the Year Bobcat Award. A member of the PBC Team of Academic Distinction and Presidential Honor Roll, she was a College Sports Communicators Academic All-District® selection, a member of the Georgia College Honors College and named to the Gamma Beta Phi Honors Society. She also served in the Student Government Association, the Black Student Alliance and in the LIFE Mentorship Program.

"Jada is a remarkable student-athlete and young woman," said GCSU Assistant Director of Athletics and Student-Athlete Success/Senior Woman Administrator Cathy Stevens. "She not only checks all the boxes,

but exceeds in all areas for this award. She is a person of integrity, has an engaging personality and is a servant leader both on campus and in the community."

On the court, Warren averaged 8.8 rebounds and 3.7 points during the 2023-24 season for the Bobcats. Warren, who pulled down a career-high 17 rebounds against Columbus State University, grabbed 256 rebounds and shot 44.0 percent (40-of-91) from the field. She also collected 22 blocked shots, 21 assists and 13 steals. Warren was 50th in NCAA Division II and led the PBC in rebounds. She was also first in the Peach Belt in rebounds per game (8.8). Warren finished seventh in the league in blocked shots.

Warren is the third Bobcat to be named a PBC selection for the NCAA Woman of the Year since 2017, joining Macy Polk (women's tennis) and Kate Richardson (women's soccer) last year.

The NCAA Woman of the Year Selection Committee will announce 30 finalists - 10 from each division - later this fall, then narrow that to the top three nominees in each division. The NCAA Woman of the Year award will be presented at the NCAA Convention in Nashville in January.

The Woman of the Year Selection Committee, made up of representatives from the NCAA membership, will choose 10 nominees from each division to make up the national top 30 honorees. The top 30 honorees will be announced later this fall. From there, the selection committee will narrow the pool to three finalists from each division. The NCAA Committee on Women's Athletics will select the 2024 Woman of the Year from the nine finalists.

At January's NCAA Convention in Nashville, the national top 30 honorees will be celebrated, and the NCAA Woman of the Year will be announced.



First-year students introduced to Milledgeville and service on GCSU Gives Day

Instead of sleeping in the weekend before classes start, all first-year students will get a lesson in volunteering at a university known for its community service.



[Georgia College & State University's](#) annual [GCSU Gives Day](#) is 8 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 17. It's a day when a flood of freshly moved-in freshmen disperse throughout their new community, Milledgeville, to learn the importance of giving back.

The expected economic impact of this year's donated labor is \$120,000.

"GCSU Gives Day is a fundamental piece of the liberal arts education we provide students at Georgia College," said Ashley Copeland, director of [Community Engagement & Service](#).

"We want to create informed citizens who care about people and the community they're moving into," Copeland said. "Right from the start, GCSU Gives Day shows our new students what it means to be a part of Georgia College. We give back."

GCSU Gives Day is a bit like a huge chessboard with a myriad of moving pieces.

Two shifts of students, clad in blue T-shirts, will be given instructions and a bagged breakfast. Then, they'll be bussed to more than 30 locations throughout the city. They'll dig, plant, clean, organize and interact with the public at various civic nonprofits, businesses, schools, churches and nursing homes.

The biggest volunteer site this year is the Life Enrichment Center's second annual back-to-school "Kids Block Party" in the Urban Arts Village at 224

E. Walton St., Milledgeville. Georgia College students will help set up booths and run games and learning activities for children. Between 10 and 11 a.m. the university's Bobcat mascot, Thunder, will greet the public, along with Spike the GMC bulldog, Chik-fil-A's cow and Milly the owl.

Other GCSU Gives Day sites include:

- Oconee River Greenway, 420 E. Greene St. Students will clean debris, remove trash and cut brush along trails.
- Bike Walk Baldwin, 59 GA-22. Students will clear and build new biking trails.
- Animal Rescue Foundation, 711 S. Wilkinson St. Students will do deep cleaning and bathe dogs.
- Comfort Farms, 347 Horace Veal Rd. Students will plant gardens, work with animals and set up animal pens.
- Lakeview Primary School, 273 Blandy Rd. Students will garden, plant and beautify the grounds.
- Central State Hospital, 252 Swint Ave SE. Students will paint and clean the Chapel of All Faiths.
- Linus Project, 220 S. Wayne St. Students will make 'no-sew' blankets to celebrate the project's Milledgeville chapter.
- Georgia War Veteran's Home, 2249 Vision HWY. Students will help with fall festival, run activity stations and assist with mealtime.

Open call for summer 2025 BSP faculty

Bridge Scholars Program : Monday August 19, 2024

This is an open call for applications to teach a three-credit summer course in the Georgia College & State University Bridge Scholars Program (BSP). Faculty members are needed to teach Area A-E core courses for the summer 2025 Bridge Scholars Program. Core courses meet in the morning (9 a.m. - 12 p.m.) or afternoon (1:30 - 4:30 p.m.) Monday-Friday between June 23 and July 25, 2025.

BSP is a year-long Residential Learning Community which gives approximately 125 freshmen a head start on college through a special program designed to help them make a successful transition from high school to campus. During the summer, BSP students take a one-credit hour success course and six hours of core courses for a total of seven hours. Students who pass all courses with a grade of C or better are eligible to return to Georgia College for their freshman year. These students continue to take classes and participate in extracurricular programming together throughout their first year. One of the highlights and benefits of the program is the close interaction that BSP students enjoy with their faculty and BSP staff. Past BSP students have gone on to be academically successful campus leaders. This is due, in part, to the strong start they have had for their college experience.

Summer 2025 dates (extracurricular programming TBA):

GC1010 and core courses: June 23 -July 22 (M-F, 9 a.m. – 12 p.m., 1:30 p.m. – 4:30 p.m.; no classes July 3-4)

July 23 – July 24, Final exams, grades posted, program closing event

July 25 – BSP Students check out of residence halls

Interested faculty should submit a paragraph identifying the core course they would like to teach, including brief description of the course and addressing (1) their interest in the BSP program, (2) how their teaching

style would be a good fit for this specialized cohort of students and (3) their thoughts on how faculty involvement outside of the classroom can support and enhance pedagogy.

Please submit this paragraph by Monday, Sept. 30, 2025, to bridge.scholars@gcsu.edu. Hiring decisions will be made by the end of October.

Remuneration is a portion of your salary plus benefits. Pay will be split over pay dates on June 30 and July 31, 2025. Faculty should understand that due to the nature of this program, there is an expectation of involvement outside the classroom to support and facilitate student development via relationship building and mentoring during the transition to university life. Faculty must be approved by their department chair and the chair of the area they wish to instruct.

Faculty hired to teach with the BSP during summer 2025 will be required to hold at least one study session at West Campus during the summer program and participate in the following events:

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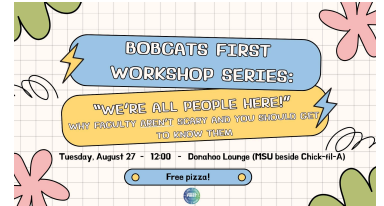

USG Board of Regents approves 2025 USG Healthcare Plan premiums

Human Resources, Office of : Tuesday August 20, 2024

The Office of Human Resources wanted to share that on Wed., Aug. 14, the Board of Regents approved the 2025 University System of Georgia (USG) healthcare plans and premiums for active employees and pre-65 retirees. The Board also approved funding for the Health Reimbursement Account (HRA) for retirees 65 and older.

The system continues to experience increasing costs within the healthcare market, including inflation and rising prescription drug costs. This unfortunately impacts the USG healthcare plan. There will be plan design changes and premium increases for all plans, while health promotion programs will continue to be available to support employees' health. As USG has done in the past, cost increases for 2025 will be shared between employees and employer.

The following was approved for 2025:

- Increases in deductibles, out-of-pocket maximums, co-insurance and/or co-pays across all USG healthcare plans.
- Increases in monthly employee premiums of between \$9 to \$65, depending on the plan and coverage tier.
- The well-being program will continue, and an incentive of up to \$100 for employees and covered spouses will be available for completing designated health promotion activities through the healthcare provider (Anthem or Kaiser).
- Weight loss support program will be available through Weight Watchers for employees and spouses enrolled in the USG healthcare plans.
- For employees enrolled in the Consumer Choice HSA plan, the contribution will continue at \$375 for employee only coverage and at \$750 for family coverage.

- Tobacco and working spouse surcharges will continue at \$150 per month. Certification of status is required each enrollment year, or the surcharge will apply. Certification must be done during Open Enrollment in OneUSG Connect – Benefits system. Information is available at: <https://benefits.usg.edu/health-and-well-being/surcharges>.

A summary of the approved healthcare plan design changes and premiums is available on the USG Benefits [website](#).

The 2025 Open Enrollment period will be Oct. 28 through Nov. 8. Please complete your 2025 enrollment elections and certifications through [OneUSG Connect – Benefits](#) no later than Nov. 8.

You are also invited to attend the Georgia College & State University Benefits Fair Oct. 17 from 10 a.m. until 1 p.m. for more information about the USG benefits programs. We encourage all employees to attend the fair to learn about the changes to the 2025 benefit plans and about all the benefits USG and GCSU have to offer. Information will also be mailed to your home just prior to the open enrollment period.

Retirees:

Pre-65 retirees and pre-65 dependents will remain on the same plans as active employees and 2025 design changes will apply as well. As in the past, there will be separate pre-65 retiree premium rate charts for the 2025 plan year which include the same increases shared in the summary above.

Medicare-eligible retirees 65 and over and Medicare-eligible dependents age 65 and older will continue to enroll in their supplemental healthcare coverage through Alight Retiree Health Solutions. Medicare Part A and B will provide primary coverage. USG will also continue to provide an annual contribution into a Health Reimbursement Account (HRA) for retirees and/or dependents to use towards premiums and other eligible out-of-pocket healthcare expenses.

This year, the Board of Regents approved the USG HRA annual contribution funding at \$2,640 per year per 65 and older Medicare-eligible retiree and 65 and older Medicare-eligible covered dependent(s). To receive the 2025 USG HRA funding, the retiree and/or dependent must enroll in coverage through Alight Retiree Health Solutions. The Medicare enrollment period is Oct. 15 through Dec. 7, with coverage beginning Jan. 1, 2025.

As always, we encourage retirees to review their plan enrollment each year and reach out to Alight Retiree Health Solutions to evaluate options for the coming year. Retirees will have an opportunity to review available options, including low-premium cost Medicare Advantage Plans (HMO and PPO) as well Medicare Supplement plans, during the Medicare Open Enrollment Period from Oct. 15 through Dec. 7.

GCSU will travel to Macon, Georgia, Sept. 21 to take part in the Julius Johnson Invitational hosted by Mercer University at the Georgia Premier Cross Country Course.

Sept. 28 marks the return of the GCSU Bobcat Invitational that will be competed at Council Farms Cross Country Course in Milledgeville. The women's 5K race will start at 9 a.m. followed by the men's 8K event at 10 a.m.

The final regular season meet for the Bobcats will be Oct. 11, as they travel to Charlotte, North Carolina, to take part in the Royals Cross Country Challenge hosted by Queens University of Charlotte at McAlpine Creek Park.

The Bobcats will compete in the Peach Belt Conference Championships Oct. 26 in Oakwood, Georgia, at the UNG Cross Country Course. It will be the second consecutive season that the conference meet will be hosted by the University of North Georgia. GCSU finished in fourth place in both races a year ago.

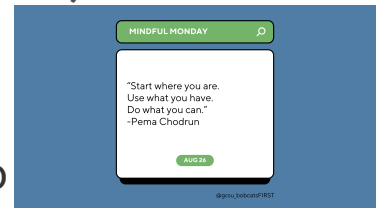

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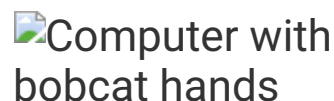

AUGUSTA, Ga. | The Peach Belt Conference preseason coaches poll for women's cross country has been released.



Georgia College & State University has been picked to finish fourth in the league.

These poems are haunted, full of grit and down-home. They have no quit in them. If the great Harry Crews had written poetry, he might have written something like Evans’s Nine Persimmons.”

Kerry James Evans is also the author of Bangalore (Copper Canyon).

“Having moved a great many times in my life, ‘place’ has a significant role in my life,” said Evans. “After I was born, my father joined the Air Force and his first assignment was at Offutt Air Force Base. So many of my first memories, including the birth of my brother, took place in Nebraska, so when I found out Nine Persimmons was named Honorable Mention of the Backwaters Poetry Prize, I couldn’t have been happier. I’m incredibly grateful to everyone at the Backwaters/UNL Press for giving this collection a home.”

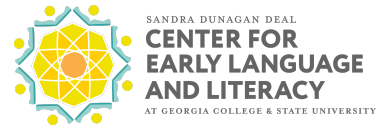

Georgia College & State University (GCSU) established the Women's Leadership Faculty Fellows Program in 2019 to provide a selected group of faculty and faculty in administrative positions with dedicated time to develop and hone leadership skills and gain a deeper understanding of the challenges and opportunities confronting higher education. The program will specifically focus on issues women face in academic administration.

This year's program begins November 2024 and runs through May 2025. Fellows will attend monthly meetings where they will learn from senior administrators on campus, as well as visiting speakers from academia, business and other fields. Participants will be GCSU faculty who hold the rank of assistant (with three years of experience at GCSU), associate or full professor who represent all colleges and the library and/or academic administrators with faculty status. A selection committee will review the submissions and make recommendations to the provost.

- A letter not to exceed two pages presenting evidence of interest in academic leadership, experience in academic governance or administration to date and what the nominee hopes to accomplish with the support of the program;

- Two letters of recommendation; one of which needs to be from an immediate supervisor. Each recommendation letter is limited to one page in length;
- A current C.V. or résumé.

Georgia College & State University has been picked to finish fifth in the league.

Augusta University, which won its second consecutive league regular-season title and the PBC Tournament for the fifth time in the last six years, collected three first-place votes and 15 points to edge Lander University, who picked up the other two first-place votes, by a point.

Soccer picked to finish sixth in Peach Belt Conference

AUGUSTA, Ga. | The Peach Belt Conference preseason coaches poll for women's soccer has been released.



Georgia College & State University has been picked to finish sixth in the league.

Columbus State University, which finished second in the PBC regular-season standings, but won the PBC Tournament, was the top pick in the poll as they collected five first-place votes and 77 points, while the University of North Georgia, which won the PBC regular-season title, collected three first-place votes and was second with 71 points.

Flagler College is in third place with 68 points and was followed by Lander University (60), Clayton State University (46), Georgia College (42), University of South Carolina-Beaufort (29), Georgia Southwestern State University (27), University of South Carolina-Aiken (21) and Albany State University (9). Flagler and Lander each received one first-place vote.

The Bobcats, who return a lot of experienced players (28) from last year's 8-8-2 squad that finished in sixth place in the Peach Belt Conference, open the 2024 campaign in Salisbury, North Carolina, for two matches. GCSU will face Chowan University at 5 p.m. Sept. 6, and they will round out the weekend Sept. 8 at 3 p.m. when they face No. 13 Catawba College. GCSU will open its home schedule at Bobcat Soccer Sept. 11 when they will entertain Middle Georgia State University in a 7 p.m. non-conference match.

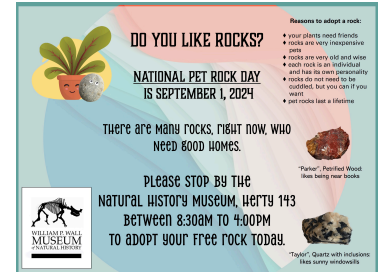
