




Esteban Patino Artist Talk

"Aesthetically, each iteration of my language study is distinct: my sculptures are sinuous sentinels, seeking symbolic approximation to atemporality and the possibility of universal shapes; my collages are humanoid bricolages, amorphous inquisitive monsters that portray the complexities of time and human existence; my paintings are deeply intuitive forms that awaken on the canvas, often drawing on the colors and landscapes of my native Colombia. However distinct, these styles are deeply in concert with one another—forming my praxis and pushing to me (re)consider the multifarious nature of words as symbols with infinite idiosyncratic interpretations."





Sallstrom Honors College & MURACE and which will be held on Tuesday, March 28 at 6:00 p.m. in Magnolia Ballroom. This is a signature event for us, and we would love for you to be a part of it! The keynote speaker is Dr. Destenie Nock, Assistant Professor of Engineering and Public Policy and Civil and Environmental Engineering at Carnegie Mellon University. Her address is titled "Stepping Stones for a Meaningful Career."

Abstract: Landing a meaningful career is a worthy goal, but how do you know which stepping stones will get you to your dream job? Dr. Nock will share her experiences navigating through academia, studying abroad in Ireland and Malawi, and how all of that ultimately led to a career working in solving energy poverty. She will talk about her experience as a Mitchell Scholar, the graduate study that she facilitated at Queen's University in Belfast, her research on sustainable energy planning and how students can craft paths that positively benefit communities around the world.

Bio: Dr. Nock is a leader in energy justice, environmental justice, sustainable energy transitions, and the energy-poverty-climate change nexus. In her current work she is developing frameworks for understanding the sustainability and equity trade-offs for different power plant investments across the US. In addition, she has pioneered new measures of energy poverty to help utility companies identify vulnerable populations and energy deficits (i.e., energy limiting behavior and forgone thermal comfort). Dr. Nock is the Chief Executive Officer of Peoples Energy Analytics, a data driven company which uses energy analytics to identify energy poverty in vulnerable households. She is also the Chief Sustainability Officer of DevvStream a carbon streaming company. Dr. Nock received her PhD in Industrial Engineering and Operations Research from the University of Massachusetts Amherst, and two BS degrees in Electrical Engineering and Applied Mathematics from North Carolina A&T state University.





TODAY: The state's only K-5 Science & Engineering Fair will be largest ever at GCSU

Science Education Center: Wednesday March 8, 2023

Georgia College & State University (GCSU) will host its annual state science competition for kindergarten through fifth grade from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Thursday, March 9, at Centennial Center.

It'll be the largest group of elementary students since the fair started in 2018.



This year, 49 school districts across Georgia will send 439 K-5 students presenting 317 projects to compete in the state fair. All projects in Thursday's competition won first place in local school districts.

"This competition started 6 years ago as Georgia College was the only regional competition in the state still holding K-5 fairs. Other regions wanted to send their students to us," said Dr. Catrena Lisse, director of the university's Science Education Center.

"We expanded beyond our region and became the official K-5 state science and engineering fair," she said. "It's exciting to see so many young people engaging in the scientific process and solving the mysteries of their own curiosity."

Several new school systems from North and Southeastern Georgia will be at the fair this year. Counties participating from Central Georgia include Baldwin, Bibb, Jones, Monroe, Washington and Wilkinson.

The K-5 State Science Fair follows the 46th Annual Regional Science & Engineering Fair for 6-12th graders held at Georgia College in February. Several projects at that fair experimented with spiders, sugar and humidity.

Topics for the upcoming the K-5 level include:

- studying the aerodynamics of paper airplanes
- investigating the strength of triangle trusses to build stronger bridges
- exploring the chemistry of making big bubbles
- using electric motors to improve transportation in metro areas
- considering the optimum angle for kicking a football.

About 180 Georgia College students will volunteer at the science fair, along with more than 120 professional judges who specialize in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics). Activities for participants include a STEM marketplace and movie, engineering design challenges, science games and tours of the university's Natural History Museum and new Integrated Science Complex.

Students will be at their project exhibits starting at 8 a.m. with judging from 10 a.m. to noon. The fair is open to the public from 1:30 to 4 p.m., and the awards ceremony is at 5 p.m. at Centennial Center.

"As a scientist, I have an obligation to share my love of science with our youth, especially our smallest ones, in order to keep their interest alive as they grow," Lisse said. "By the time they reach middle and high school, either the seed of love for science has been planted and nurtured or it hasn't."

Poverty simulation gives glimpse of frustration and anxiety experienced by the poor

College of Health Sciences: Tuesday March 21, 2023

A unique poverty simulation Friday, March 24, will replicate the conditions of the poor, giving participants a hint of what it's like to face everyday hardships, scarceness of food and insufficient shelter.

The Community Action Poverty Simulation will be 2 to 4:30 p.m. in Georgia College & State University's Health Sciences building on N. Wilkinson Street, room 314. About 80 participants—from students, faculty and staff to local civic leaders—will experience this virtual reality of deprivation, designed by the Community Action Poverty Simulation (CAPS) in Missouri.



Millions live at or below the federal poverty level. Nearly 40% of Milledgeville's residents live in poverty. That's 26% higher than the state average and nearly 30% higher than the national average, according to the U.S. Census Bureau.

The simulation is designed to sensitize people who frequently deal with low-income families, creating a broader awareness of poverty among policymakers and community leaders. The ultimate goal is to inspire change and improve lives.

"This program helps people understand the complexities and frustrations of living in poverty daily," said Toyia Barnes, diversity officer in the College of Health Sciences (CoHS). "With a greater awareness of its impact, CoHS is meeting its goal of developing equity-minded, healthcare practitioners."

Participants will role-play the lives of low-income families using simulation kits. Some will be single mothers with children receiving Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF). Others will play the disabled, senior citizens on Social Security or people with chronic illnesses.

All will have the stressful task of meeting basic needs and finding shelter on limited budgets during the course of four, 15-minute 'weeks.'

The room is the community; a participant's chair is their home; and those sitting nearby, their neighbors. Participants will move around the room perimeter to get resources they need. They'll interact with human service agencies, schools, banks, grocers, pawnbrokers, bill collectors, job interviewers and police officers, among others.

Volunteers from local community service agencies will act as resource agents.

"Understanding the reality of poverty," Barnes said, "will help our future healthcare practitioners as they enter their chosen fields of study."

Bringing science to the elementary level: GCSU holds 5th Renewable Energy Day

About 65 first and second graders will attend Georgia College & State University's 5th Renewable Energy Day from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. today—Tuesday, March 21 at Centennial Center—as physics students demonstrate the power of sun, wind, water, biofuel and other sustainable sources

It's the first Renewable Energy Day since the COVID-19 pandemic.

"Even if they cannot fully comprehend the ideas of climate change or global warming, it's important to expose children at very young ages to these topics," said Dr. Hasitha Mahabaduge, associate professor of physics.

"We've seen how they light up when watching demonstrations related to different renewable energy technologies," Mahabaduge said. "Georgia College students do a great job presenting these ideas at a level first and second graders can understand. It's a win-win situation for both parties and, most importantly, a win for our planet earth."

Students from Lakeview Primary and Midway Hills Primary Schools in Milledgeville will rotate between several instructional and engaging demonstrations lasting 15 minutes each. There will also be lunch, a video, craft and closing activity.

Experiments include:

- Making solar cells using raspberries and blackberries
- Using popsicle sticks and paper cups as spinning wind turbines
- Watching waves move plastic tubes coiled in a wire, bobbing magnets up-and-down to generate an electrical current
- Creating a microbial fuel cell, where naturally-occurring electrochemical processes of anaerobic bacteria break down food into energy
- Games that demonstrate the electric grid and how solar cell works

Georgia College students helped organize the event and will assist with activities. They are volunteers from Mahabaduge's renewable energy class, the GCSU Physics Club and Office of Sustainability.

The day closes with elementary students signing a banner, pledging their commitment to conserve energy.





Affecting the Conflict: Art, Film, and War in Colombia

Ruben Yepes Munoz--Affecting the Conflict: Art, Film, and War in Colombia

For nearly 60 years, Colombia was in the grip of a harrowing internal armed conflict. By the time the peace treaty between FARC—the largest of the country's guerrilla groups—and the government was signed in 2016, nearly 17% of the population had been a direct victim of the war (according to UNICEF). While the conflict ravaged the countryside, it was, for the most part, experienced as a distant event in the main cities, where citizens mostly new about it through the media.

Visual artists have referred to the conflict since its beginning in the late 1950s. However, how they approach it has changed throughout the years. While in the early stages of the conflict, the explicit representation and denunciation of violence and human suffering was the norm, later, artists resorted to less explicit aesthetic strategies. In this lecture, I will address this shift toward an implicit mediation of the conflict and what that means in the context of the main cities, where most of the art in question has been produced and exhibited. A key focus will be on its capacity to affect Colombian urbanites, thereby bridging the distance between them and the predominantly rural conflict.

Ruben Yepes Munoz is an Assistant Professor of Art History at Georgia College. He received his PhD from the University of Rochester in 2017. His dissertation, which addresses the mediation of the Colombian armed conflict in visual art and film, was published in 2018. Current research focuses on the art produced in Latin America in response to the Covid-19 crisis and the genealogy of Latin American Visual Studies.

Ruben is the author of three books: Afectando el conflicto: Mediaciones de la guerra colombiana en el arte y el cine contemporáneo (2018), María José Arjona: Lo que puede un cuerpo (2015) and La política del arte: Cuatro casos de arte contemporáneo en Colombia (2012). He is also the author of a number of peer-reviewed articles and book chapters published in Argentina, Canada, Colombia, Mexico, and the United States.

Ruben has received several important fellowships, grants and awards, including the National Prize for Scholarly Essay in Art History (2017, Colombia), a Mellon/ACLS Dissertation Completion Fellowship (2016), a Grant for Research on Colombian Art from the Colombian Ministry of Culture (2015) and a Fulbright Scholarship (2012).

The Rural Studies Institute (RSI) in partnership with the Sustainability Council is launching the inaugural Rural Changemakers Lecture Series on April 11, 2023 at 6:30 pm at Peabody Auditorium. We have a very exciting inaugural speaker, Catherine Coleman Flowers, a 2020 MacArthur genius fellow, who is internationally recognized for her work on environmental issues. Below you will find more discussion of her exciting work.

She is a 2020 MacArthur "genius" grant recipient, and an author. She has dedicated her life's work to advocating for environmental justice, primarily equal access to clean water and functional sanitation for communities across the United States.

She is the Founder of the <u>Center for Rural Enterprise and Environmental Justice</u> (CREEJ), and has spent her career promoting equal access to clean water, air, sanitation, and soil to reduce health and economic disparities in marginalized, rural communities.

Flowers is a Board Member for the Center for Earth Ethics at Union Theological Seminary, and sits on the Board of Directors for the Climate Reality Project and the Natural Resources Defense Council. Flowers is also Co-Chair of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences Commission on Accelerating Climate Action and Practitioner in Residence at Duke University.

She serves as the Vice Chair of the inaugural White House Environmental Justice Advisory Council. Flowers was also named Levenick Resident Scholar in Sustainable Leadership at the University of Illinois for the spring 2021 and was awarded an honorary PhD in science from Wesleyan University.

As the author of <u>Waste: One Woman's Fight Against America's Dirty Secret</u>, Flowers shares her inspiring story of advocacy, from childhood to environmental justice champion. She has been featured in The New York Times, The Washington Post, Bloomberg, The Guardian, and on PBS.







THE SACRIFICE ZONE

The Sacrifice Zone

Thursday, April 6, 5:30-7:00pm Museum Education Room (Library 211) Enter from Clarke Street entrance. Please invite students, staff, faculty, and friends.

If you travel down a one-mile stretch of Doremus Avenue in Newark, NJ, you pass a natural gas plant next to a sewage treatment facility next to an animal fat rendering plant next to a series of ominous looking chemical storage containers behind acres of fencing. Airplanes pass overhead every two minutes, their engines rattling windows, while a putrid smell wafts from the open pools at the sewage treatment plant.

This stretch is known as Chemical Corridor, and it's located just down the road from schools and apartment buildings. It borders the Ironbound neighborhood, where Portuguese, Brazilian, Central American and African American residents are separated from toxic substances by little more than a railroad track.

The Ironbound district of Newark, New Jersey, is one of the most toxic neighborhoods in the country. Maria Lopez-Nuñez, a Honduran-American resident there, is waging a war for environmental justice. She is part of the Ironbound Community Corporation, one of the most effective environmental justice organizations in the country. The Sacrifice Zone follows Maria as she leads a group of environmental justice fighters determined to break the cycle of poor communities of color serving as dumping grounds for our consumer society (52 min.).


