GCSU Thirst for Knowledge: Georgia Adopt-a-Stream Chemical and Macroinvertebrate trainings

Academic Outreach : Wednesday October 11, 2023

Through the Georgia College & State University Thirst for Knowledge Program, you can become Georgia Adopt-a-Stream certified in these upcoming trainings. The Macroinvertebrate Training will be offered Friday, Oct. 13, from 1 p.m. until 5 p.m. at Lake Laurel Lodge (Register here: <https://givepul.se/qel9d6>). The Chemical training will be Saturday, Oct. 21, from 9 a.m. until 12 p.m. (Register here: <https://givepul.se/qel9d6>). Trainings certification is valid for one year.



Stream macroinvertebrates (insects, mollusks and crustaceans) are excellent indicators of the condition of both water quality and habitat. This workshop will focus on macroinvertebrate collection techniques and identification; in other words, catching cool animals. Volunteers who identify the macroinvertebrates with 90% accuracy and pass the written test with a score of 80% or better will be certified to conduct macroinvertebrate monitoring and can “adopt” a section of a local stream.

The Chemical Monitoring Workshop is designed to teach volunteers about basic stream water chemistry and how to conduct various chemical tests using hand-held field equipment. The basic set of tests include dissolved oxygen, conductivity, pH and temperature. Volunteers who collect data within 10% accuracy and pass the written test with a score of 80% or better will be certified to conduct chemical monitoring.

Students can satisfy CbEL requirements for GC Journeys through the GCSU Thirst for Knowledge Program, and the trainings are open to all.

The National Scholarships Office will host an information session on the Critical Language Scholarship Monday Oct. 16 at 5 p.m. in the Humber-White House.

The CLS Program is a funded program sponsored by the U.S. Department of State that provides overseas language and cultural immersion to U.S. students enrolled in all degree programs. The CLS Program offers two options for students to study critical languages either overseas (CLS Program) or at home, through CLS Spark, a virtual initiative for Russian, Arabic and Chinese.

Through the CLS Program, students spend eight to 10 weeks abroad studying one of [13 critical languages](https://clscholarship.org/languages) (<https://clscholarship.org/languages>) and earn academic credit for their work. The scholarship includes travel expenses, coursework, group excursions and even a small stipend to cover daily living expenses. Most languages offered by the CLS Program do not require applicants to have any prior experience studying critical languages.

CLS Spark, provides opportunities for American undergraduate students to study Arabic, Chinese and Russian at the beginning level through virtual language and cultural programming. CLS Spark provides the opportunity to study critical languages for students who may not have access to critical languages on their campus or the ability to study abroad.

The CLS Program seeks participants with diverse interests and from a wide range of fields of study and career paths. Students from all academic disciplines including business, engineering, law, medicine, science, social sciences, arts and humanities are encouraged to apply.

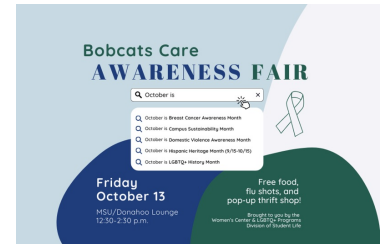

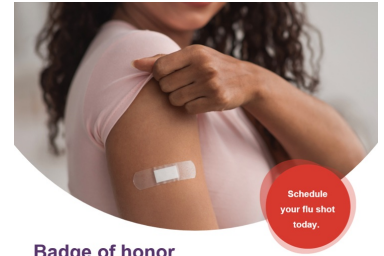

Georgia College & State University's Chemistry Department and Science Education Center will hold its biggest celebration of the year—a free Family Fun Night filled with hands-on science activities from 5 to 8 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 19, at Herty Hall.



Family Fun Night is part of National Chemistry Week (NCW), a community-based program of the American Chemical Society (ACS). Its goal is to promote the importance of chemistry for quality of life.

This year's theme, "The Healing Power of Chemistry," highlights how chemistry is used in our everyday lives—especially in the healthcare field. To show this, GCSU's Science Education Center is partnering with the School of Nursing. Five nursing students and nursing faculty Talecia Warren will demonstrate the significance of chemistry for nurses in a healthcare-themed lab in Herty Hall.

"Last year, we welcomed over 400 people to campus for Family Fun Night," said Dr. Catrena Lisse, professor of chemistry and director of the Science Education Center.

"This event gives us a chance to reach the community with positive messages about science and entice a new generation of learners," she said. "Participants of all ages will experience how chemistry is all around us and used every day."

More than 30 science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) majors have volunteered to assist the public at 10 activity stations in Herty Hall. Led by the GCSU Chemistry Club, activities include science magic shows at 6 and 7 p.m., a blacklight maze, a periodic table of cookies and the ever-popular outdoor pyro-chemistry show—with dancing Gummy Bears and carving pumpkins chemistry style.

Families can also make tie-dye shirts and watch the finale at 8 p.m. with exploding ping pong balls and gigantic eruptions of 'elephant toothpaste.'

"We love showing the community how fun science can be" Lisse said. "I believe this event is so popular each year because it is free, educational and fun for all ages."
