

Please join us Wednesday, Dec. 6 from 12-12:50 p.m. on the second floor of Russell Library, room 241 for an engaging conversation facilitated by Dr. Brian Newsome, dean of the John E. Sallstrom Honors College & professor of History, on "France on Fire: Summer of Protests." On June 27, 17-year-old Frenchman Nahel Merzouk was shot and killed by a police officer in Nanterre, a western suburb of Paris, during a traffic stop. His killing touched off weeks of widespread protests characterized by attacks on state/municipal buildings, the burning of



cars and police efforts to contain the protests. What are the roots of the protests? How are they linked to both domestic and international trends?



John Davis: John Davis Jr. is the author of The Places That Hold (Eastover Press, 2021), Middle Class American Proverb (Negative Capability Press, 2014), and three other poetry collections. His work has been published in Nashville Review, The Common, Salvation South and elsewhere, and he is the recipient of the Florida Book Awards bronze medal for poetry, the Sidney Lanier Poetry Prize and other literary laurels. He holds an MFA from University of Tampa, and he teaches English and Creative Writing for Jesuit High School, also in Tampa.

Ann Ritter: Ann Ritter has most recently published poems in Dos Gatos: Persona of the Southwest; ADANNA: Women and Spirituality; Earth First; The Southern Poetry Anthology (Georgia); Gathered: An anthology of Quaker poets; and Elements. Her review of Joseph Bathanti's The Thirteenth Sunday After Pentecost appeared in 2017's Presence: A Journal of Catholic Poetry, where she has also published poems. Her fiction, essays and poetry have appeared in Charleston Magazine; Confrontation; Earth's Daughters; THEMA; Georgia Journal and the anthology, Like a Summer Peach: Sunbright Poems and Old Southern Recipes. Ann has studied in the summer writing intensive at Bennington College, VT, received an artistinitiated grant from the Georgia Council for the Arts in fiction and poetry and has been a fellow in the Flannery O'Connor Summer Institute at Georgia College, sponsored by the National Endowment for the Humanities. A former business journalist and communications professional, she is currently a clinical instructor in strategic business communication planning at Georgia State University's Robinson College of Business, Atlanta.

Ashley Massey: Ashley Massey holds a MA in Literature and writes academically in the fields of Southern Gothic literature and Critical Prison Studies. She currently teaches writing and literature courses in jails and prisons, including through the University of North Alabama's Restorative Justice Lab. She resides on a farm in rural Middle Tennessee where she is a small business owner, cattle caretaker and community organizer. She was a participant in the NEH Summer Institute: Reconsidering Flannery O'Connor. Her poetry has appeared in The Red Branch Review, Lights and Shadows and Pink Apple Press, and she recently released a gothic farm-themed poetry book titled Keep the gate open.

Doni Wilson: Doni Wilson is Professor of English at Houston Christian University where she has taught for two decades. She received her doctorate from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and has taught at Elon University, the University of Houston, the University of Saint Thomas and writing organizations, such as Writespace. She has covered the arts in Houston for over a decade and has written for numerous publications including the Houston Chronicle, Houstonia, Houston Press, The Awl, The Federalist, The Pillars, Ten Spurs and The Pisgah Review.

Angela Alaimo O'Donnell: Angela Alaimo O'Donnell, PhD is a professor, poet, scholar and writer at Fordham

University in New York City and serves as Associate Director of Fordham's Curran Center for American Catholic Studies. Her publications include two chapbooks and eight full-length collections of poems. Her most recent book of poems Holy Land (2022) won the Paraclete Press Poetry Prize. In addition, O'Donnell has published a memoir about caring for her dying mother, Mortal Blessings: A Sacramental Farewell; a book of hours based on the practical theology of Flannery O'Connor, The Province of Joy; and a biography Flannery O'Connor: Fiction Fired by Faith . The latter won the Catholic Press Association Prize for best biography in 2015. Her ground-breaking critical book on Flannery O'Connor Radical Ambivalence: Race in Flannery O'Connor was published by Fordham University Press in 2020. O'Donnell's ninth book of poems, Dear Dante, will be released by Paraclete Press in Spring 2024.

And the host, Craig Martell: Craig Martell is a 74 year old retired business man from Milwaukee, WI. He has a Bachelor's in English from the University of Wisconsin and a Master's in Accounting from DePaul. Since Fall, 2019, he has "curated" a total of nine Osher Lifelong Learning five-part series Introducing Flannery O'Connor. This initiative was graciously supported by a host of well-recognized "O'Connor Guest Scholars" who shared their insights on O'Connor and her fiction over Zoom. This background supported Craig's attendance at the 2023 NEH Summer Institute, Reconsidering Flannery O'Connor. While there, he met and befriended the four poets with us this evening, hearing their poetry at the Institute's "Open Mic" nights at the Blackbird Café. While not a poet himself, he enjoys that of others and is intrigued with Flannery's understated appreciation for poetry and its mystical effect on her writing. He has an understanding, tolerant wife and two daughters—one in Milwaukee and one in Charlotte—three grandsons, and one granddaughter! He is a definitely promised community member of the Secular Discalced Carmelites.



ChatGPT in the Classroom: Practicalities & Pedagogies

This hands-on workshop will introduce educators to the practical use of ChatGPT for writing instruction. The workshop will have a particular focus on how ChatGPT and similar tools can support teaching (1) specific writing genres, (2) research literacy and (3) critical technology appraisal. Attendees who wish to participate in the hands-on portion of the workshop should create a free ChatGPT account and bring a laptop.

Biography: S. Scott Graham is an associate professor in the Department of Rhetoric & Writing and the associate director for Health, Humanities and Medicine at the Humanities Institute at The University of Texas at Austin. His research is devoted to exploring the ethical use of artificial intelligence in scientific and medical writing, and he teaches classes on AI, writing and persuasion in a variety of contexts. His latest book is The Doctor & The



Algorithm (Oxford University Press), and his recent essays on AI have appeared in Inside Higher Education, Stat News and Composition Studies.

Working under excessive pressure for a prolonged period of time can result in chronic stress which can have a significant adverse impact on our mental and physical health, in particular long-term cardiovascular problems due to the consistent and ongoing increase in heart rate and elevated levels of stress hormones and of blood pressure.

Without understanding the physical stress response, it can be difficult to develop healthy coping strategies to help us tackle stress in an effective way, causing a build-up of stress hormones in our minds and bodies which leads to more significant health issues such as burnout and/or depression.

- + Understand the science of the stress response.
- + Recognize your own stress triggers.
- + Learn how to respond rather than react.
- + Discover powerful stress busting strategies.

Mentors need for admitted students

Do you have one extra hour a month? That is all the time it takes to help the Office of Admissions with their Adopt an Admit Mentor Program.

The Office of Admissions is once again launching the Adopt an Admit Mentor Program designed to recruit first-generation college students to Georgia College & State University and assist them as they navigate the complexities of college enrollment. Admissions will identify admitted fall 2024 first-generation students and seek to assign each student with a faculty or staff mentor to build a relationship and guide them toward enrolling at GCSU.

The mentor will be asked to:

- Communicate with the student once or twice monthly from January through May-preferably a phone conversation.
- Connect the student to needed resources at GCSU-Financial Aid Office, Advising, etc.
- Encourage the student to deposit discuss why a GCSU education is unique/valuable and why the college or department would be a good fit for them.
- Encourage the student to complete POUNCE, complete Housing and attend Orientation.
- Provide a kind/listening ear and support the student as they transition from high school to college.

The Admissions team will train all mentor volunteers, and matches will be made based on interests. Admissions hopes these efforts will help GCSU build a strong first-year class.

Virtual training sessions will be held on Dec. 14, Jan. 10 and Jan. 12. Faculty and staff only need to attend one of these virtual trainings. In the event you cannot attend any of the sessions, a recording will be made available. Your assigned mentee(s) will be shared via email after you attend a training session.






