Georgia Adopt-a-Stream Chemical training

Academic Outreach : Friday January 5, 2024

Happy New Year! Looking for a fun and rewarding way to give back to your community this year? Through the Georgia College & State University Thirst for Knowledge Program, you can become Georgia Adopt-a-Stream certified in Chemical Monitoring Wednesday, Jan. 10 from 9 a.m. until 12 p.m. (Register here: <https://givepul.se/m47b90>). Training certification is valid for one year.



The Chemical Monitoring Workshop is designed to teach volunteers about basic stream water chemistry and how to conduct various chemical tests using hand-held field equipment. The basic set of tests include dissolved oxygen, conductivity, pH and temperature. Volunteers who collect data within 10% accuracy and pass the written test with a score of 80% or better will be certified to conduct chemical monitoring.

Students can satisfy CbEL requirements for GC Journeys through the GCSU Thirst for Knowledge Program, and the trainings are open to all. Another Chemical Training will be offered March 15. Additional trainings available upon request.

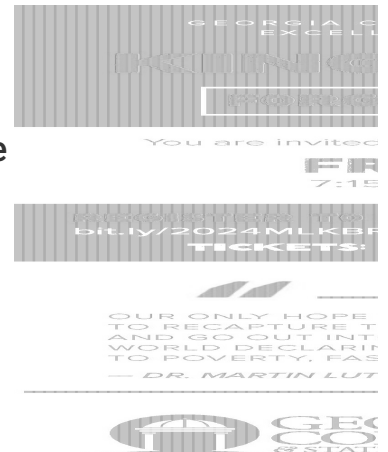

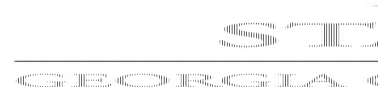

The Transeuntis Mundi Project proposes to capture the sound and visual memory of peoples, cultural expressions and places to artistically tell the story of the millennial passerbys that have been crossing the world. It currently portrays the diversity of four countries from four continents and generates a poetical/documental archive of human cultural heritage.

The expression Transeuntis Mundi comes from Latin, the lingua franca of the expansion of Western Culture. It personifies the human being who has been taking the adventure to discover and explore the world.

Its methodology employs Walkscapes recordings with immersive 360° technology. From this archive, it starts a process of transmedial composition: creation of virtual reality works, videos, photographs, sound art, musical compositions and performance, with the aim to immerse the observer/participant into an experience beyond their space and time. In short, it's a combination of knowledge, innovation and poetics supported by the processes of artistic research and mediated by transmedial technology.

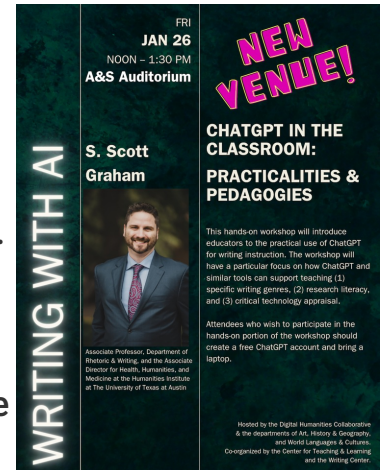

AI Lab at GCSU to educate students, faculty and Middle Georgia

Information Systems & Computer Science, Department of : Wednesday January 24, 2024

Georgia College & State University is introducing the AI Lab at the J. Whitney Bunting College of Business & Technology. It will prepare students and the public to use this developing technology.

The AI Lab will be a resource for the Central Georgia community with workshops on artificial intelligence, faculty-led research and projects for employers in the area. The lab is currently housed on the fourth floor of Atkinson Hall.

“The emerging technologies inherent to AI will have a fundamental impact on the workplace,” said Georgia College Provost and Vice President of Academic Affairs Dr. Costas Spirou.

“This new lab is an excellent example of the innovative and entrepreneurial spirit central to a public liberal arts education,” Spirou said, “as we adapt and seek out new ways to ensure our students are prepared for the opportunities, challenges and possibilities ahead.”

Led by Dr. Jeannie Pridmore, department chair of Information Systems and Computer Science, and directed by Dr. Ward Risvold, lecturer of business communications, the AI Lab will centralize Georgia College’s efforts to navigate changes brought by the technology.

In his 2018 Strategy on New Technologies report, Secretary-General of the United Nations António Guterres said technologies like automation, artificial intelligence and robotics “hold incredible promise for human welfare.”

Students will have access to workshops and guidance, allowing them to master the tools of artificial intelligence. It will be a place for faculty too, where they take part in interdisciplinary research and find ways to integrate AI into their teaching.

The School of Continuing and Professional Studies at Georgia College will also leverage its outreach to lead the charge in area schools, helping students understand AI tools. They’ll provide courses for students, community members and local businesses.

“We’re at a crossroads,” Risvold said. “Technologically speaking, this is an industrial revolution of a different kind. Our students, all of them, have to be prepared to be more effective and productive, being able to use AI.”

The AI Lab’s first event is 5:30 to 7 p.m. Wednesday, Feb. 7, in the Arts & Sciences Auditorium. The speaker will be Greg Lane, retired senior director for the CIA and one of the

Cândida Borges open lecture: DNArchive: The Millennial Journey of an Artist

The Department of Art's Visiting Artists and Scholars Program invites the Georgia College & State University community to a public lecture by the Brazilian musician, transmedia artist, scholar and educator Cândida Borges. Borges, who lives and works between New York City and Rio de Janeiro, holds a Ph.D. in arts from Plymouth University (UK, 2022), a master's in music/piano performance from the Federal University of Rio de Janeiro (Brazil, 2001), as well as a bachelor's in piano, singing and composition (SAE NYC/2013). As a classically trained pianist, singer-songwriter and composer, Borges has performed in many large theaters and festivals in Brazil and Latin America. As a transmedia artist, she is the co-creator of the Transeuntis Mundi project, which has been recognized by the journal Leonardo (MIT Press, 2022), as one of the top contemporary works of Art, Science and Technology in 2022 and has received other awards such as Best Sound of the Year Award (UK, 2023), the Lumen Prize (UK, 2022), the Innovation Award of the Los Angeles Tribune (US, 2021) and the Realmix Award (Colombia, 2021). Borges has received grants and commissions for large exhibitions in major art venues around the world, including recent exhibitions in the Contemporary Art Museum of Rio de Janeiro (2023) and the Museum of the Moving Image in New York (2020).



Borges will speak to the Georgia College community about her career as an artist and musician, focusing on her transmedia [Transeuntis Mundi](#) project. The talk will take place Feb. 19, from 5 until 6 p.m. in the College of Arts & Sciences building, room 272.
