The Office of Inclusion & Belonging will present "Establishing and Maintaining Mentally Healthy Workplace Environments" on Wednesday, Nov. 6, from 3:30 to 4:30 p.m. in Chappell Hall, Room 111. Dr. Steve Wilson, director of Georgia College & State University's Counselling Services, will facilitate.

It's been four years since the global pandemic. The workplace continues to adapt to the new normal of work; however, this new normal has seen an increase in stress and anxiety. Even before the pandemic, one in five adults struggled with mental health issues—and that number is only rising. When workers struggle with mental health conditions, the signs are not always apparent, and even when a condition is disclosed, there may be a stigma attached.

In this workshop, participants will learn:

- The signs and impact of mental health distress in the workplace.
- The benefits of talking about and improving mental health at work.
- How managers and supervisors can support employees' mental health.
- How to work with others to make your workplace more mentally healthy for everyone.
- Ways to reach out and support a colleague in distress.

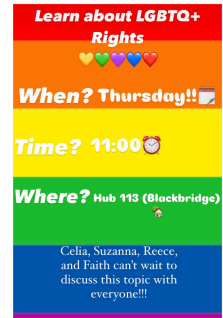

This semester, the Honors College is again pleased to host Zoom-based Legends of Honors sessions for alumni, friends and students of the Honors College. On Nov. 20 at 6 p.m., Honors alumnus Dr. David Snow will deliver a Legends of Honors Zoom presentation titled "A Long & Winding Road: Opportunity (and Adventure) in Public Service." [To register, please click on the embedded link](#), or the QR code in the flier, and the Honors staff will send you the Zoom information and a timely reminder. All are welcome to participate.

Dr. Snow describes the session as follows: "The world is your oyster working in government service (local, state or national), international affairs, non-governmental organizations or even education. However, while availability may be high, public awareness is often low! This presentation explores career options and opens the aperture on 'what is possible.' My journey included a career as a naval officer, federal service, state service and working for the U.S. Embassy in Kenya ... all while visiting over 50 countries!"

Dr. David Snow graduated in just over three years from Georgia College & State University and embarked on a successful career as a naval officer. During this time, he often taught at various universities and earned two master's degrees (MBA and MA in Military History). Upon leaving the service, he earned a doctorate (Ed.D.) and served as the director of Military Affairs for the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia (2012-2022). While at USG, he was often recognized nationally as a leader serving this segment of the student population. In 2022, he was recruited away to fill a Department of State contract in Africa to help launch the National Defence University-Kenya.



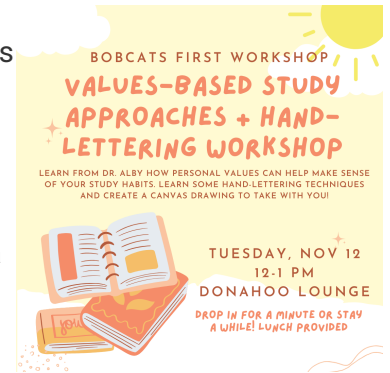
Bobcats FIRST Workshop: Values-based Study Approaches

So why are we not preventing it? Speak up! Speak up with us as we strive to create a safer learning environment and aim to prevent these horrific events from happening.

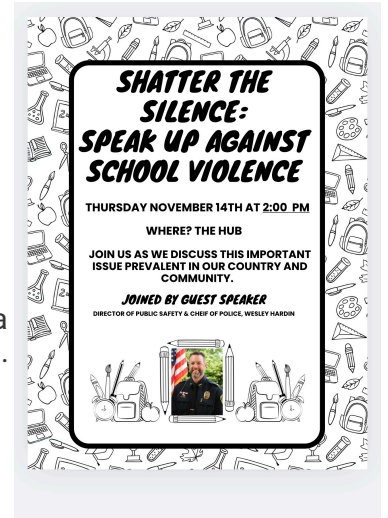

GCSU Thirst for Knowledge: Georgia Adopt-a-Stream Chemical and Macroinvertebrate Trainings

Academic Outreach : Tuesday November 19, 2024



Looking for something fun to do over the winter break that is outdoors and makes an impact? How about adopting a stream?

Through the Georgia College & State University Thirst for Knowledge Program, you can become Georgia Adopt-a-Stream certified this Friday (Nov. 22) at our beautiful East Campus (Lake Laurel). Chemical monitoring will be offered from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m., and macroinvertebrate training will be from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. Trainings certification is valid for one year.

The Chemical Monitoring Workshop is designed to teach volunteers about basic stream water chemistry and how to conduct various chemical tests using hand-held field equipment. The basic set of tests include dissolved oxygen, conductivity, pH and temperature. Volunteers who collect data within 10% accuracy and pass the written test with a score of 80% or better will be certified to conduct chemical monitoring.

Stream macroinvertebrates (insects, mollusks and crustaceans) are excellent indicators of the condition of both water quality and habitat. This workshop will focus on macroinvertebrate collection techniques and identification; in other words, catching cool animals. Volunteers who identify the macroinvertebrates with 90% accuracy and pass the written test with a score of 80% or better will be certified to conduct macroinvertebrate monitoring and can "adopt" a section of a local stream.

Students can satisfy CbEL requirements for GC Journeys through the GCSU Thirst for Knowledge Program.

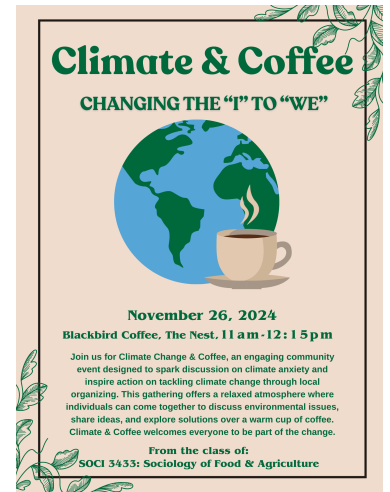
