Writing Center consultants in 228 Library are MFA graduate students trained in teaching students writing strategies they can apply to all types of writing tasks. The purpose of the Writing Center is to help students learn how to create thesis statements, focus thesis statements, use evidence, organize their writing, find topics to write about, use correct research format and documentation - in short, to help students learn how to write effectively and successfully.

Writing Center consultants also help with resumes, application letters, application essays, appeals and other writing tasks.

Typically the Writing Center logs over a thousand visits each academic year, and fully one third of these visits concern writing not connected with freshman English.

The Writing Center is now located on the 2nd floor of the library in room 228, 445-3370 and operates on a first-come, first-serve basis.
