#### **Biographies**

**Dr. Marcel Ramalho** is currently Director of Choral Activities and Professor of Voice in the Department of Music at Augusta University. A recipient of several academic awards, scholarships, and grants, Dr. Ramalho's research focus on the music of Brazilian composer José Siqueira (1907-1985). Dr. Ramalho has published articles in the *Journal of Singing, Per Musi* and *Revista da ABEM*, and has presented lecture recitals at the 31st National Conference of the Brazilian Association for Graduate Studies in Music and at the 2022 Southeastern Region NATS conference. As an opera singer, Dr. Ramalho has sung Thomas Putnam in *The Crucible* (Robert Ward), the titles roles in Mozart's *Don Giovanni, Le Nozze di Figaro*, and Puccini's *Gianni Schicchi*, Peter in *Hansel and Gretel* (Humperdinck), Captain Corcoran in *H.M.S. Pinafore* (Gilbert and Sullivan), and Don Pedro in *Béatrice et Bénédict* (Berlioz). Concert appearances include the bass solos in J. S. Bach's *cantatas Ich habe genug* (BWV 82), *Aus tiefer Not schrei ich zu dir* (BWV 38), *Christ lag in Todesbanden* (BWV 4), and *Weinen, klagen, sorgen, zagen* (BWV 12), W. A. Mozart's *Freimaurerkantante*, and G. Fauré's *Requiem*. Dr. Ramalho holds a Doctor of Arts degree from Ball State University with a primary emphasis in Vocal Performance and secondary emphasis in Choral Conducting, a Master of Music in Voice Performance from Indiana State University and a Bachelor of Music Education from Universidade Federal da Paraíba (Brazil).

**Dr. Martin David Jones** is Professor of Music at Augusta University where he teaches piano, composition, theory, and conducting. As a pianist, he has been a featured performer in recital and with orchestra throughout the United States. His appearances at major musical centers include Lincoln Center and Merkin Hall in New York, Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C., the Dame Myra Hess Recital Series in Chicago, Piccolo Spoleto in Charleston, South Carolina, Spivey Hall in Atlanta, and Gindi Auditorium in Los Angeles. As a composer, Dr. Jones has created music in a variety of genres including solo piano, chamber music, symphonic, and film music. His "Lady Meng Jiang Poem" (March 2019) for Dizi Flute, Guzheng and String Orchestra was premiered by Yang Liu, Li Can and the Corelli Camerata. His composition, "Blue Elegy" for Jazz Trombone and String Orchestra (December 2016), was premiered by the Augusta University Orchestra with Wycliffe Gordon as soloist. He is a recipient of a 2021-2022 composition grant from the American Harp Society. Dr. Jones was Music Director of the Augusta University Orchestra from 2005-2017. During his tenure as director, the orchestra became a visible statewide presence, appearing as a featured ensemble during the 2010 Georgia Music Teachers Association conference and performing concerts at the Westobou Festival in 2012 and 2014. Dr. Jones has been a frequent presenter at national conferences including Music Teachers National Association, the National Conference on Keyboard Pedagogy, the American Liszt Society, ANPPOM (Brazilian National Association of Graduate Programs in Music), Georgia Music Teachers Association, and the Georgia Music Educators Association. Dr. Jones has Master and Doctoral degrees in piano performance from the Peabody Conservatory of Music. graduated summa cum laude with a Bachelor of Music degree from California State University, Northridge.
