MacLeod has been the Voice of the Colonials and Bobcats since he called his first Georgia College baseball game in 1978 and he added basketball in 1990.

Highlights of his nearly 50 years behind the GCSU microphone include trips to the NAIA baseball World Series in 1985. the NAIA basketball national championship tournament in 1990. the NCAA Division II Baseball Championship in 1995 and 2010, and to the NCAA Division II Basketball Tournament in 1996, 1997, 1999, 2000, 2002, 2004, 2006, 2009, 2010, 2011 and 2022.

MacLeod began his broadcasting career in 1973 on radio station WKMI in Kalamazoo, Michigan, as a sports reporter. He worked at

WKMI for four years until earning his degree from Western Michigan University. After graduation, MacLeod migrated south to Milledgeville in 1978 where he worked as the sports director for WXLX Radio.
