

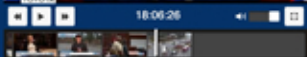

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judges to serve on the Georgia Court of Appeals, and in 1922, was elected Chief Justice of Georgia Supreme Court. Ina raised seven sons and six daughters, while managing the family farm near Winder. In 1912 alone, she sewed more than 200 garments for her children. Her eldest son, Richard Jr., became Georgia Governor in 1901 and served 16 years in the U.S. Senate. In 1932, the Georgia State College of Women, now Georgia College & State University, renamed its library in her honor, as the alma mater of five of her daughters. State flags were flown at half mast when she died in 1953.
