Biographies

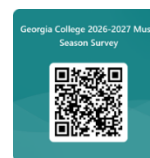
Dr. Youngmi Kim is an Associate Professor of Music and Voice Area Coordinator at Georgia College. She received her education at the College-Conservatory of Music (CCM) at the University of Cincinnati (DMA and MM) and Ewha Womans University (BM) in Korea.

Dr. Kim has received numerous accolades, including first prize at the William C. Byrd Young Artist Competition and third at the Louisville Bach Society Gerhard Herz Young Artist Competition. She reached the finals of The Lyndon Woodside Solo Competition, where she won the Richard Westenberg Award for 18th-Century Stylistic Interpretation. While at CCM, Dr. Kim was honored with the Emilie Dieterle Award and received several graduate scholarship awards.

Dr. Kim has appeared as a soloist with several orchestras, including the Richmond Symphony, Flint Symphony, Honolulu Symphony, Kentucky Symphony, Lebanon Symphony, and Louisville Bach Society. She has frequently performed with the Korean Broadcasting Symphony Orchestra, notably with the conductor, James Judd. Dr. Kim was featured as a soprano soloist in Brahms's German Requiem, performing with the Seoul Philharmonic under the direction of maestro Myung-Whun Chung.

Pianist **Yoojung Kim** is an Instructor of Collaborative Piano at the University of Mississippi. Prior to Ole Miss appointment, she held Collaborative Pianist positions at Truman State University, Crane School of Music at SUNY Potsdam, Schwob School of Music at Columbus State University. Dr. Kim was an Adjunct Music Faculty at Lansing Community College and the Principal Keyboardist at Lansing Symphony Orchestra. She also worked at Howell Public Schools as a Choir Pianist. During summers, she enjoyed teaching piano and accompanying choirs at Blue Lake Fine Arts Camp and toured Europe with Blue Lake Fine Arts Camp International Choirs and International Youth Orchestra as a pianist and a harpsichordist. Dr. Kim earned both DMA and MM in Piano Performance from Michigan State University where she studied with Yong Hi Moon. She received BM in Piano Performance from Kyung-Won University in Seoul Korea where she is originally from.
