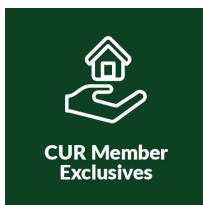
VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT

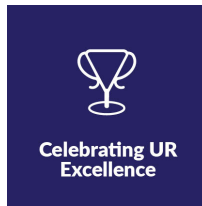

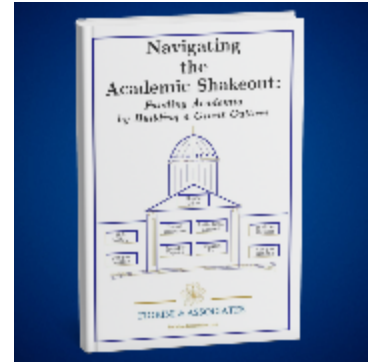
