Sandra Godwin is a professor of sociology at Georgia College & State University in Milledgeville. She is the author, with Helen Matthews Lewis, of *A White Liberal College President in the Jim Crow South: Guy Herbert Wells and the YWCA at Georgia State College for Women, 1934-1953* (Mercer University Press, June 2021). She has also published in the area of community-based teaching and learning. In addition to her research, she teaches courses in social theory, gender, social psychology, and food and agriculture.

Sandra was born in southern Alabama, in Brewton, and grew up in Jay, a farming community in northwest Florida, where her great-grandparents settled to grow cotton and peanuts. After high school, one year of college, marriage, and divorce, she returned to university and graduated from the University of West Florida in Pensacola with degrees in sociology and English. After receiving her master's in sociology from Boston College, she received her Ph.D. in sociology in 2000, from North Carolina State University and has taught at Georgia College since 2002.
