#### COPLAC Peer Group Faculty Salary Comparison

According to the American Association of University Professors (AAUP), Georgia College Professors earn a salary higher than the average salary of their peers in the Council of Public Liberal Arts Colleges (COPLAC). The average salary of an Associate Professor at Georgia College varied 1.18% lower than an associate professors at COPLAC institutions. Georgia College Assistant Professors earn on average \$65,300, 2.27%, more than Assistant Professors in COPLAC overall. Lecturers at Georgia College earn \$55,000, 2.75%, less than the average of their COPLAC peers.

Note: Eastern Connecticut State University, Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts, Midwestern State University, Southern Oregon University and The Evergreen State College did not report to AAUP in 2019-20.

#### USG Identified Peer Group Faculty Salary Comparison

As published by AAUP, Georgia College Professors earn a salary 8.52% higher than the average of their peer group. The average salary of Associate Professors at Georgia College is \$71 higher than the average of its peers as identified by USG. Assistant Professors at Georgia College earn .17% more than the average salary of their peers listed below, and Georgia College Lecturers earn 8.55% more than their peers.

# Excel Tip of the Month

## Instantly resize columns and rows

There's nothing worse than having your text run outside of the width of the column. And needing to click and drag to resize the column to the perfect width over and over again can be a pain.

Fortunately, you can do this instantly. Place your mouse on the line between two column markers (C and D, for example) until you see a symbol that looks like two opposite-facing arrows.

With that symbol, double click on that line that separates the columns and the column will automatically be resized to fit the widest piece of text within that column.
