Aside from one-on-one meetings with teachers during office hours, the best way to improve your writing is to work with writing consultants at the Writing Center. Writing consultants—undergraduate and graduate students who are skilled at tutoring writing—will work with any student writer on any project in any discipline. - Encourage students to visit well in advance of assignment deadlines to ensure time for revision and to avoid long wait times for appointments
- Help students identify specific questions to address or feedback to solicit during their consultation
